As the result indicates, this was a very one sided match which does not say much about the current structure of the Dublin senior football championship. Playing against the wind in the first half it soon became apparent that this was not going to be a difficult assignment to ensure our survival in the senior championship for next year and make progress in this year's B championship. All the early action was in the Whitehall half and Cathal Flaherty, pressing forward from half back, popped over a point from distance after one minute. After 5 minutes Shane Durkin seemed to be harshly treated when sent off on a black card. He was replaced by Collie Dunne. Conal Keaney pointed a free and was followed by a point from play by Robbie McDaid. Emphatic win for Under 14 A hurlers vs Faughs



This was the game our U-14A hurlers had been looking forward to since their narrow defeat to Faughs in the Feile semi-final over the May weekend! In the immediate aftermath of that loss, the lads made a collective commitment to each other and their mentors that they would avenge that loss at the soonest opportunity and win the league this season. A tall order possibly...but why not ?

Well if the league is to be won, reigning champions Faughs would have to be vanquished along the way and the opportunity came around sooner than even hoped, to put the Feile disappointment behind them once and for all.

After a successful return to league action in midweek away to Naomh Baróg...the Boden lads were intent on extending their unbeaten run at home to our nearest neighbours and league champs in a tantalizing derby which promised to be another cracker of a game. Conditions were good but for an erratic stiff breeze which Boden would have at their backs in the opening half. With long range specialist Rhys McDonnell in fine form of late, it was hoped that full advantage would be taken to build a sustainable lead when facing into the wind in the second period. Boden started the better and quickly opened up a lead of four points from play with some text book hurlingincluding two trademark long range efforts form Rhys McDonnel added to by Conor Casey and Cian Durkin.

Faughs had registered their first by the time lone full forward Hugh O'Sullivan benefitted from the hard work and excellent service from outside by Connell McGlynn and Davy Keogh, who imposed himself on his opposite number from the get go...O'Sullivan latching onto a long pass from out the field and spinning to his left around his marker to slot over on the run to extend Boden's advantage.

Try as they might, Faughs were finding it difficult to find a rhythm as the stubborn Boden defence had settled into their task from early on. The ever reliable line of resistance of Josh Corcoran, David Keane and the imperious David Gannon were coping admirably with everything Faughs could muster against them and when long deliveries were put deep into their full forward line, they were repeatedly repelled by the force of nature that is Alex Gavin, ably assisted by the excellent Thomas Culleton and Mathew Ormsby who battled tigerishly for 'gach aon liathroid' that came their way, frustrating their opposite numbers and restricting their opportunities to a minimum.

However, shortly after Thomas Brosnan had slotted over Boden's sixth score of the half after running a clever support line and receiving a slick pass from O'Sullivan, Faughs managed to drag themselves back into it with a goal out of the blue and against the order of play up that point.

Boden didn't flinch however and Rhys McDonnell tagged on a couple of more scores from frees and normal service resumed as Boden began to build a lead again. Despite their dominance however, a few chances were missed with Hugh O'Sullivan uncharacteristically pushing a few scorable efforts wide of the posts and even the normally deadly accurate Rhys McDonnell appearing to be human after all, with a few strays also. The door remained just about open for Faughs and they duly burst through it before the break with another goal to reduce the deficit to just four points when it could so easily have been fourteen at the midway stage!

Having played into a stiff breeze and been dominated for large periods of the first half, Faughs would justifiably have been upbeat about their chances in the second half with the elements in their favour and it seemed Boden would have their work cut out if they were to prevail with such a slender lead to show for all their excellent hurling in the opening half.

The early exchanges after the restart were keenly contested as the intensity levels ratcheted up in the pursuit of dominance. Inevitably, Faughs started to chip away at the Boden lead and another gear would have to be found to stem the tide.

What for a while seemed like an onslaught, the Boden stand-in keeper, Michael McDonald (who was carrying an ankle injury) was under enormous pressure as Faughs began to test his resolve with long deliveries into the square and shots from all angles as they endeavoured to maximize the dominance they had started to exert over the home side. McDonald answered all questions with aplomb however, with some excellent fielding and swift and intelligent distribution to turn defence into counter attack and put the visitors on the back foot with every clearance.

Reid Barry, introduced into the full backline, made his significant presence felt with a determined rear guard display, not conceding ball or ground to his opposite number and Boden continued to stand firm.

Fortune would favour Faughs however, when awarded a dubious penalty and Rhys McDonnell, who is also blessed with a good goalkeeping pedigree, would stand between the sticks to face down his friend...and foe for the day, the excellent Faughs talisman James O'Brien...this would be a duel of wits as much as skill and bragging rights for months on end was the prize for either on a personal level...but of course it could prove a pivotal moment in determining the outcome of this enthralling clash. Rhys would prevail to stop a thunderous shot and clear the lines...it was as good as a goal to Boden and stirred the ranks again throughout the field.

The ever lively, all-action Cian Kelly came more into the game up front on receipt of more regular quality ball and this spelled trouble for Faughs as he and the robust Jason Dwyer,now operating at full-forward began to cause all sorts of bother for the Faughs reargaurd who had been enjoying a prolonged breather it seemed.

Between them and the advancing menace of Cian Durkin and Davy Keogh, a few more points were added to the Boden basket and goals from Rhys McDonnell and Jason Dwyer restored Bodens grip on the game.

However, when it appeared the spoils were all but secured another penalty came Faughs way to rock the Boden boat yet again...A repeat showdown between Rhys and James and a chance of redemption for the Faughs man...However, a 'Rhys of the Rovers' performance was capped by yet another fine save and this finally took the wind out of Faughs sails and further points from David Keogh, Jason Dwyer, Hugh O'Sullivan and Cian Kelly saw Boden run out victors by a margin of twelve points in the end.

Another stirring display from the Boden boys and they have built up a real head of steam in the league now and having proved their credentials this season must be considered the team to beat going forward.
