Gritty Cuala top Boden's Inters with injury-time winner – The Long Fella Reports

Ballyboden 2 08 Cuala 0 15

Single point losses are a painful experience, but for Ballyboden's Intermediate hurlers, the pain was particularly felt by the squad given their modest tally of 2.08 on an evening of near perfect summer conditions. Both sides needed the win in this Wednesday game at Ballycullen as part of the round-robin series of games for the championship.

Boden had the wind in the first half and used its strength to feed the point of the attack where Mossie Nagle was standing tall and holding his lengthy arm high enough to avoid the extreme humidity lower in the atmosphere. He not alone broke ball for his corner-men Emmett Carroll and Niall O'Neill, but also placed himself on the 'bill' as Boden's top scorer for the opening thirty. His goal came from a rasper of a shot from the twenty metre line, and his two points came from good deliveries by Carroll and Mattie O'Sullivan. Carroll also contributed with a trademark 'over the shoulder' point and a 65. The other first half scorers were O'Neill and Oisin Cannon after he broke a few hefty tackles and angled his shot over from thirty metres. Cuala found the going difficult and depended on a couple of frees and two important scores from a busy corner man. Much of the play centred around the mid-field area where Boden had possibly their best performer in Shane Kennedy. (he was replaced in the second half due to injury)

Half-time; Boden 1.06 to Cuala 0.04.

Within two minutes of the second half commencing Boden had scored their second goal. Hard graft and no shortage of skill from Kennedy forced the ball into the path of Carroll, only for the veteran to slip on the greasy surface. However Cuala were sloppy in the act of clearance and Carroll somehow got onto the ball along the white-wash, reached the corner flag and crossed the ball into the square where O'Neill was lurking with intent. Despite being outnumbered he managed to volley into the net.

Now it was Cuala's time to shine, and shine they did with a series of fine points from right across the mid and forward areas. Boden did interrupt their flow with two fine individual efforts from first Kennedy and five minutes later by Peter Buckeridge. By the hour mark the Cuala men were still a point down, but they righted that with a long range effort from out in the country. The real pain came for Boden when a harmless ball went across the face of their goal only for the concession of a 65. Cuala made no mistake with their shot and floated the sliotar over on the back of a strengthening wing. Try as they did, Boden could not muster a late attack and force the draw that they deserved.

David O'Connor, further back the field than usual, could not resist the shot nor could fellow win-back Conor Robinson. Up front Paul Doherty was working hard and sent over three fine points. Any threat from the visitors seemed to land short and was dealt with by Gary Maguire. A blot on the half from the home team's point of view was a fine run by Brigid's star, Paul Winters, who goaled in the last minute of the half. This left the scoreline Boden 3-12 to Brigid's 1-7.

A strong third quarter was demanded by management and while Brigid's used the elements and picked off some nice long range points, Boden replied through the Ryans and Simon Lambert. A strong Conal Keaney run resulted in a penalty, duly despatched by Paul Ryan. A scrappy goal was leaked by Boden following a sideline ball and suddenly the gap was beginning to shrink. The experience of Malachy Travers and workrate of fellow backs Rob Leddy and Stephen O'Connor put a stop to most of the visitors' attacks as they chased the match in the final quarter. Another goal for Brigids gave them some hope but points were exchanged and as Dave O'Donovan blew the final whistle, there was a sense of relief for the home team following a mighty tussle. AHL 1 – Boden too good for Crumlin in League! Worsdworth reports from Pearse Park

The recent clear skies were replaced by a more overcast background for this Division 1 League match in Pearse Park Crumlin on Saturday 24th June 2017 between the hosts and Ballyboden St Endas. "And the good south wind still blew behind" – the strong breeze was a talking point among fans and mentors as we waited for the match to throw-in. Playing against the wind, Boden rattled off the first four scores to lead by that margin after five minutes – Paul Ryan, Paul Doherty, Conal Keaney and Niall Ryan the marksmen. Crumlin tried to reach their nifty corner forwards but wing backs Rob Leddy and Eoin Small were in no mood, Small in particular led by example with excellent shadowing and blocking. Further points by Simon Lambert and James Roche gave the visitors a nice lead at the quarter hour. A feature of the first half was umpire Mick Fletcher's enactment of the Police standard "Don't Stand So Close To Me" when an unwelcome visitor encroached on his official duties. The visitor was dispatched. Crumlin, as expected, found their range in the second quarter and sent over six points. Boden kept daylight though, mainly through placed balls from Paul Ryan and an exceptional long-range shot from Stephen O'Connor. Half-time Boden 0-11 Crumlin 0-8. Two for Crumlin, two for Boden, two more for Crumlin was the pattern after the break until Boden knuckled down and hit five without reply. Finn McGarry, currently in great form, was rewarded for his hard work with two fine points in this spell. Into the final quarter and Boden pushed on to finish the contest. When a good ball in found substitute Colm Ó'Néill, his low shot beat the goalkeeper to the left and this gave the Firhouse Road men a clear advantage. Crumlin were now interested in three-pointers and tried to work the ball in. However, full-back Luke Corcoran repeatedly intervened and sent good clearances upfield. McGarry received one of these and sent a high ball in, aiming to add to his tally. Under pressure from the forwards, the keeper lost sight of the ball for a second and it nestled in the net. A final free from Roche finished the exchanges for the evening – final score Ballyboden 2-23 Crumlin 0-15.

As the half time whistle blew, Lucan had a 5 point lead 2-6 to 2-1.

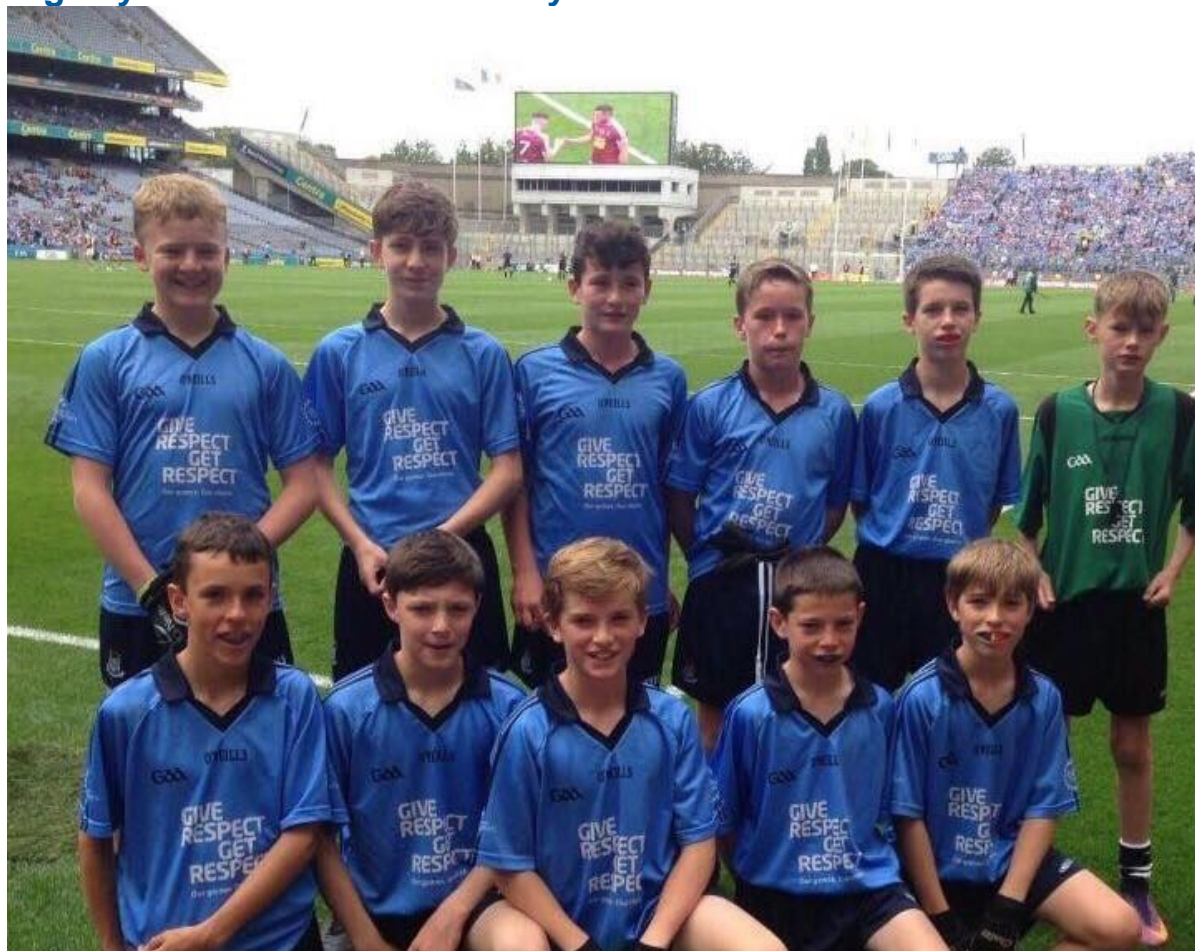

Camoige U12s trip to Kilkenny

Following the successful mini All Ireland on Friday night it was up bright and early on Saturday morning for the Ballyboden girls with an 8.30 start at the clubhouse. We set off at 08.45, the girls were in high spirits and eagerly anticipating the day ahead as we swiftly made our way down the motorway to Kilkenny's famous hurling nursery, St Kieran's college. We arrived to a sunny St Kieran's and were welcomed by the college president Rev Dr Dermot Ryan and his assistant Martina Lawlor who gave us full access to the impressive college grounds and facilities for the day. Our opponents, who also travelled from Dublin, were Naomh Olaf's and both clubs were fielding three teams to play three games each on the magnificent Croke Park size St Kieran's senior pitch which was in immaculate condition. These games proved to be a tough test indeed, brilliant performances were given by the Ballyboden girls throughout with some tough uncompromising exchanges, some of which required expert attention from Samantha Maguire our first aid on duty. She also shared her experiences growing up with her twin sister Angela who is also won the same amount as Anne and was a member of the camogie team of the century. Afterwards we took photos of the girls in front of the college with the trophies, the Kilkenny players and manager.

The girls then went "down the town" in Kilkenny language, not to do some shopping but to try their hand at another sport; Bowling.
