Senior football league v St Maurs, 12 July 2017 in Rush

Ballyboden St Endas 0 – 8; St Maurs 3 – 15

This time of year usually causes the Club difficulties in fielding strong teams as a lot of players go away for the summer, others have to work while some players will have injury problems. The seniors travelled to Rush with just 15 fit players and one injured player on standby as sub. The 15 included David O'Connor, yes, the senior hurler, who had not played football for 5 years and lined out at right half back, and Mark McNamee, the minor football goalie who usually is the sub goalie but here lined out at corner forward. Both acquitted themselves very well. For their warm-up, Maurs had 28 players.

So, expectations were not very high but we started very well with three points in the first five minutes from Sam Molony (2, one free) and Declan O'Mahony. Maurs got one back but Simon Lambert cancelled this out. By the 15th minute Maurs had scored two more points but Sam Molony cancelled one out to leave us still ahead by two points. The Maurs forwards were threatening the visitors goal and on 20 minutes Darragh Gogan in goal brought off a great save but conceded a 45. Maurs converted this to reduce the lead to one point with less than 10 minutes to go to half time. Maurs then took over and scored three goals and a point in less than 10 minutes. Sam Molony got one back from a free to leave the half time score at 0 – 6 to 3 – 5.

The second half was difficult to watch. The already injured Graham Heavey replaced the newly injured Bob Dwan in the first few minutes. We went for goals from early on and Sam Molony brought a great save from the Maurs goalie and also hit the side netting from close range. Declan O'Mahony also had a good goal chance later in the game but it went wide.

Maurs scored 10 points, 6 from frees and we got two back by Sam Molony (free) and Darren O'Reilly to leave the final at 0 – 8 to 3 - 15.

It was a pity that so many experienced players were absent but credit to David O'Connor for answering the call to help out when the team was in great need.

Hurling Minor A League – Le Fear Bog Reports

Ballyboden St Enda's 3 20 Lucan Sarsfields 2 21

In April Lucan minors travelled to Ballyboden and dished out a chastening hurling lesson to Boden. All that could be done then was to put that defeat in the tank and plot a course of redemption. Travelling to Lucan on Wednesday evening last, revenge was uppermost in the minds of the Ballyboden lads and at the final whistle this was satisfactorily achieved.

As the score line suggests this was a pulsating game played with tremendous energy, skill and athletic endeavour by both sides. Ballyboden had a dream start and had a goal by the 6th minute. A sublime line ball from Daniel O'Riordan was snatched from the air by Ciaran Cashman and his deft hand pass set up Luke MacDwyer. Cashman immediately followed this major up with a point. This had an unsettling effect on the Lucan lads and it took them some time to get into the game. They did not get their first score until the 10th minute but having settled they went about dismantling Ballyboden's lead in clinical fashion. Their running off the shoulder, spacial awareness and general movement around the pitch was causing Ballyboden all sorts of problems. However, Ballyboden manfully stuck to the task and a duo of points in the 22nd and 23rd minutes by Daniel O'Riordan and Luke Basquel kept it tight. On the stroke of half time goalkeeper Conor O'Donoghue pulled off a superb diving save. A goal at this stage would have been a big psychological blow. The half time score of 0-12 to 1-6 to Lucan was not insurmountable as Ballyboden were playing with the slight breeze in the second half.

On the resumption Lucan extended their lead to 4 points but this was as good as it got for them. From here to the final whistle Ballyboden took over and produced probably the best hurling seen from this side all season. A Shane Kennedy goal after 33 minutes, followed immediately by a Pearse Christie point reeled Lucan in. Ballyboden raced for the finish line and when Luke Basquel blasted to the net in the 47th minute a lead of 5 points was established. However, a succession of frees by Lucan's ace marksman, Ben Coffey, plus a goal from a free in the 43rd minute kept them in touch and entering the final quarter of the game it was all to play for. Ciaran Cashman was unwavering in this period with his frees and some thunderous scores from Basquel, Kevin Desmond and a heroic display from Luke MacDwyer at midfield kept Ballyboden's noses in front until the final whistle. In the 2nd minute of injury time Lucan scrambled a second goal but Ballyboden had worked mightily all night to take the 2 league points and they deservedly held out at the conclusion.
