Senior football league v Lucan Sarsfields; 29 July 2017; Páirc Úí Murchú

Ballyboden St Endas 2 – 18; Lucan Sarsfields 0 – 21

What a game! 41 scores; a sending off of one of the Boden players; two goals by the home team making the difference in the end.

Lucan, who were also in the regulation zone, started with intent and had two points in the first minute. Then a great ball from Cathal Flaherty down the left wing was collected by Sam Molony. He got inside his marker but still had other defenders to beat and, doing so expertly, finished to the net to put us ahead. However, Lucan took control again and popped over the next four points in 7 minutes. Ryan Basquel from a free and Declan O'Mahony and Collie Dunne from play brought the sides level. Again, Lucan took over and scored three points; Declan O'Mahony and Simon Lambert responded but Lucan saw out the half with another two points to leave the half time score at 1-5 to 0-11. So, three points down at half time did not seem too bad in the circumstances as Lucan had 8 wides to our one.

The second half started with gusto and in two minutes the deficit was back to one point following points from Ryan Basquel (free) and Darren O'Reilly. Then disaster struck; Donagh McCabe got a straight red card after a bit of pushing and shoving between players from both sides. It would now be an uphill battle to gain the two league points we badly needed. Lucan piled on the pressure with two points to put them three points ahead again with just 8 minutes gone. Then, on 10 minutes, Simon Lambert made a great catch from the kick-out and fed it quickly to Ryan Basquel. He had a lot of work to do as he bore down on goal and finished clinically to the net. We were once more back in contention but Lucan again took control and scored the next three points. Ryan Basquel got one back but Lucan scored two more to put them four points up with 16 minutes gone. The next 10 minutes belonged to the home side. Sam Molony, Collie Dunne (free), Darren O'Reilly, Conal Keaney, Ryan Basquel, Sam Molony again and James Holland all knocked over points to put the home side three points ahead coming into the last 5 minutes of the game. In the time remaining, Lucan scored three points but each was cancelled out in turn by Darren O'Reilly, Sam Molony (free) and Conal Keaney to keep the three points gap to the end. So, a great result in the circumstances with the team playing most of the second half with 14 players.
