Camogie - Under 16B's travel to Whitehall for Championship Round 2 encounter

For the second time in as many championship outings the 16B's let slip a decent halftime lead to come out on the wrong side of a narrow defeat. Whitehall Colmcille's had begun this championship campaign well two weeks ago with a good win over Erin go Bragh, and

following a strong league performance they would have been confident of a win over Boden. Having travelled the M50 to meet our northside opponents there was a strong air of 'let's do the business' about our girls. Pat Reynolds took the warm up and there was a clear spring in the step – who knew that man could cover the distance between the 21 and 45 quicker than Usain Bolt. Hannah Tevlin delivered the team talk and we took to what was a tighter than tight pitch – scarcely 25m from post to sideline. Add in a fair growth of grass, a strong drizzle, and all the ingredients of a physical encounter were present. And physical it was. There was a stats sheet with details of scorers and wides, frees and sidelines but as I write it is still a damp mess of illegible scribbles such was the soaking we got. If it dries up the details may become clear but for now the outline is simple – Boden played tough hard hurling, as did Whitehall. At halftime we had built a lead of 9 points -4 -2 to 1 - 2 up. Happy days. There had been some top class performances – Deirdre Murray rock solid at fullback, Cathy Flanagan equally strong at halfback until she was injured, Lucy O'Connor and Elaine Whelan busy and effective in the middle third. Perhaps man of the match was Chloe Murphy – every blade of grass covered. Ciara Doyle – a new wing back; and the two new converted forwards Caoimhe Lynn and Ciara Woodcock were moving well and growing into their new roles. Sarah Reynolds in goal worked her puck outs as well as always. Sarah White battled very well against one of Whitehall's strongest and secured good possession in her corner forward slot. Stephanie Hamm made a new friend from the Northside – at least it seemed that way as she didn't let her player alone for 30 seconds all game. Aoife Leavy – an early sub for Cathy - made a big impact when she came on, and her 'golf-swing' cleared effectively more than a few times. Kiara Cunningham was solid at halfback – although some of her best blocking and tackling was made much closer to goal than that.

The second half was a 'backs to the wall' effort as Whitehall attacked with increasing intensity. In fairness to Boden the girls held on firmly – with 5 to go we were still a point to the good. A close in free looked wide until suddenly it wasn't and unbelievably just as the clock ticked overtime we were a point down. Whistle blown and game over. Gutted. Laura Mullen had come off the bench early in second half and did a solid job at both ends – she was shifted about a bit to give fresh legs where needed. An injured Hannah Tevlin came back on to replace the injured Stephanie Hamm and was everything you'd expect of a Boden captain – tireless in chasing down every ball, and skillfull in her clearances. Lily Wende Doyle had a hard task as she covered a lively number 10 from Whitehall but held her really well throughout. Zara Beatty slotted into full forward and ran the small square well – the ball just never bounced the right way for her, the keeper making one outstanding save from close in. Thanks to Sinead Sweeney for making the trip – she was the unlucky one not to get a run due to the 5 subs only rule. We missed our injured crew – speedy recovery to them – some big tests ahead v Lucan and Erin go Bragh.

Stopped off for a cup of tea as usual on the way home. A nice café in Santry. The girls had hot chocolate. Notions!
