Ballyboden St Enda's v Foxrock Cabinteely

Boden took to the field in Lawless Park, Swords on Sunday to take on reigning county and Leinster champions Foxrock Cabinteely in their first county final appearance since 2011. A very blustery day saw Boden begin the game with the wind at their backs. Foxrock got the scoring off to a start with a point from a free kick after just three minutes. Directly from the kickout Boden worked the ball up the pitch under huge pressure from Foxrock Cabinteely and into the large rectangle, there the referee awarded Ballyboden a penalty for a foul on Katie Murphy. Simmone Reilly stepped up to take the penalty which she narrowly missed, kicking the ball to the left of the post and wide. Foxrock Cabinteely had a dominant spell seeing them kick two more frees putting them three points ahead of Boden. Boden closed the gap with a free from Maria Mcgrath. With 20 minutes on the clock Foxrock's Amy Ring shot the ball passed Liz Cohalan to put them 6 points in the lead. Boden did not drop the heads and within 60 seconds Simmone Reilly sent the ball in on top of the Foxrock keeper which she dropped into the back of the net. With another point just before half time for Foxrock Cabinteely, Ballyboden went in at half time trailing 1-1 to 1-6.

Boden had a difficult task ahead of them in the second half, winning the throw in they worked the ball up the field to the clubhouse end to win a free in front of the post. Maria Mcgrath stepped up and slotted it over the bar. Great defending by the Boden full backline of Rachel Nugent, Rachel Ruddy and Doireann Mullany kept Ballyboden within touching distance of Foxrock Cabinteely for the entire game but Boden never managed to make it passed the 3 point barrier. Ballyboden worked extremely hard in the second half with points from Simmone Reilly and Claire Kirwan. On the final whistle Foxrock Cabiitely retained

their title winning 1-10 to Ballyboden's 1-5. Ballyboden's Rachel Ruddy was awarded player of the match for her performance at full back.

This "Tournament" is otherwise known as the Senior B championship. Judging by the intensity of the match, which turned nasty towards the end, it is a tournament that the players want to win.

The visitors arrived with their Dublin contingent, Niall Scully, Eoghan O'Gara and Denis Bastick. We had Collie Basquel and within two minutes he had the ball over the bar for a point. This was followed quickly by another point by Donagh McCabe. In the next five minutes Templeogue Synge Street (TSS) had four points without reply. Collie Basquel had

the next two points which were replied to in turn by TSS. TSS did not score again until the fifth minute of the second half. In the last 10 minutes of the first half Collie Dunne scored two points from frees, Ryan Basquel scored two points from play and, in added time, John Murphy brought the half time score to 0-9 to 0-6.

John Murphy opened the scoring within two minutes of the restart and Sam Molony and Collie Dunne added two more from play to extend the lead to six points after five minutes. The visitors got one back but two points by Ryan Basquel (1 free) and one by Robbie McDaid extended the lead to 8 points. Collie Basquel and TSS exchanged points and the match seemed to be moving to an inevitable easy home win. However, on 20 minutes TSS kept pressing and were duly rewarded with a well taken goal and then added a point four minutes later to leave the home lead at four points. The home side tried to slow down the match and run down the clock. Following a flare up, which led to a prolonged disruption, involving all 30 players at one stage, TSS continued to press and were kept out by a wonderful save by Darragh Gogan. On 65 minutes, TSS rewarded with a second goal to leave the lead at one point. There was relief for the home team and supporters when the final whistle sounded shortly thereafter.

Alex's adventure



Club member Tom Ball's cousin Alex, who is now a year old, had a very challenging start in life.

A day before she was due, Alex stopped moving and had to be delivered by an emergency C-section. She was immediately taken into intensive care and after eight days on a ventilator, the doctors carried out an MRI scan which showed extensive brain damage, leading Alex's doctors to make the decision to turn

off her ventilator, as there was not much more that could be done for her.

It was at this point Alex began fighting. She continued breathing on her own, and she has continued to fight every day since then.

The damage on Alex's brain has impacted her life in many ways. Alex is visually impaired, has epilepsy and cerebral palsy, and is medicated and fed through a feeding tube. For Alex to have a fighting chance for the future, she will need extensive rehabilitation, speech and language therapy, physiotherapy and occupational therapy to develop vital early cognitive and motor skills.

The first few years in any child's development are a vital time, and Alex needs all the help she can get in order to help her overcome the challenges she faces every day. Without intensive early intervention, Alex cannot progress.

Fortunately, Alex has been accepted by the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago to undergo a 3 month course of intensive rehabilitation therapy. By sending Alex to the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago, we hope that she would be able to improve the control and use of her core, head, hands and arms to

enhance her quality of life as she grows up, and to give her every chance we possibly can for her

future.

We have set a fundraising target of €50,000 to cover Alex's treatment for the coming year. However, we are trying to raise as much as possible to give Alex the help she deserves and hope to exceed this target in anticipation of further medical visits in the years to come.

On Friday the 27th of October 2017, we will be coming together to host an exciting event to raise funds for Alex's Adventure Fund in Ballyboden St. Enda's GAA Club, Dublin 16.

On the night, there will be spot prizes and entertainment from one of Dublin's best Johnny Cash tribute acts. We have 200 tickets available and are seeking sponsorship in order to cover the costs of the event. While any help would be greatly appreciated, we would also be thankful for the donation of

items, vouchers, experiences or anything that could be given as spot prizes on the night, or any other help that you may be in a position to offer.

All money raised will go directly into the Trust for Alex that is solely accessible for covering the cost of her treatments.
