

U-16 A Championship Final – Abbotstown – 26th Oct. '17

The immaculate environs of Abbotstown were the setting for this year's u-16 championship final on Thursday evening. The match pitted the two heavyweights of the grade (Boden and Lucan) against each other. So far in their career, each had a championship in their back pocket (Lucan with the u-13 and Boden with the u-14), so this had all the trappings of a defining encounter for these two super panels of girls.

Familiarity breeds respect, and the mutual respect between these sides meant that this game was always a tight encounter, with both sides determined to ensure that the proven match winners in the opposition ranks would not be given the freedom to cause widespread damage. Boden began in the ascendancy but found scores hard to come by, although the Lucan goal had a narrow escape when Hollyn grabbed a dropping ball and put it just the wrong side of the post with the defence beaten all ends up. We opened the scoring when Katie slotted over a "45". She then repeated the job when putting a free between the posts, following a foul on Erica, before Aoife Mahon replied with a pointed Lucan free. This was turning into a shoot-out between the respective free-takers, as Aoife levelled up matters with another pointed free. Then a free from Katie deceived the Lucan defence in the floodlights, and ended up in the net, to put some daylight between the sides, but Aoife then pointed another free to bring the margin back to two.

Hollyn then got the first point from play, but Aoife again narrowed the gap with a pointed free to leave just two points between the sides at half-time.

Half Time 1-3 to 0-4

Declan's half-time team talk centred on getting a good start to the second half, and there certainly was a good start to the half – unfortunately it came to Lucan as they beat Ally in the first minute to take the lead by a point. However, our girls never panic and our leaders again steadied the ship.

Katie equalised with a point from a “45” and we then regained the lead when Katie converted a free following a foul on Lucy. Lucan then equalised before Sinéad, who had just come on as a sub and was making her presence felt on the edge of the Lucan square, restored the Boden lead with a smart point on the turn.

We then began to exert a bit more control. Hollyn ran at the Lucan defence before off-loading to Erica and the captain did the rest, burying the ball in the Lucan net. Our next attack again shook the Lucan net, but the celebrations of the huge Boden support on the near sideline was cut short when the referee disallowed the goal, possibly for an incorrect handpass. However, we were not to be denied for long. Erica was now taking the game by the scruff of the neck, and on her next possession again rattled the Lucan net.

Any thoughts we had of a comfortable last five minutes were quickly put to bed as Lucan swept up the field and found the Boden net to reduce the margin back to only four. Another attack and Hollyn got possession and wisely took her point to stretch our lead out to five. This proved to be the final score, and the long whistle a few minutes later was greeted by a Boden stampede, as players and supporters celebrated a hard-fought and well-deserved victory.

Final Score 3-7 to 2-5

This was a brilliant team performance by all 18 girls who took the field. Ally was steadiness personified in the goal. In front of her, Seoirse Fitzgerald, Robyn and Sadhbh repelled every Lucan attack and formed a formidable wall of steel. Hannah marshalled the defence as only Hannah can, risking life and limb for the cause. On the wings, Seoirse Hassett, Anna and later on Niamh all performed superbly, curbing a succession of dangerous Lucan attacks – so much so that even Laura Quinn from Lucan struggled to make any headway against them. In the middle of the field, Muireann and Olivia more than held their own against a very formidable Lucan partnership.

At centre forward, Hollyn was the launch pad of so many attacks, as well as tacking on some vital scores. On the right wing, Aisling was a continual thorn in the Lucan defence while on the other wing Katie's work rate would have left even the Duracell bunny gasping for air.

Rarely if ever has she played better in a Boden jersey. Sarah Ann worked tirelessly in front of the Lucan goal, as did Sinéad and Bláthnaid later in the game. Lucy never gave an inch and was a continual threat, while in the other corner Erica played a captain's part and earned the “player of the game” accolade for her outstanding display, topped off by the two vital goals. After the cup was presented to Erica and Robyn, Erica acknowledged the part played by the huge Boden support who had braved the M50 car park to be there to lend their support.

Definitely a massive boost that played no small part in pushing the girls over the line.

As the girls contemplated a nice break to enjoy their success Declan broke the news to them that the minor championship is starting next week.

It was the anticipated final some only dared to dream ofthe Ladies Gaelic Football battle of the C's. With many of the girls training together from Nursery and for some, their first final, it was set to be a classic.

The storm clouds abated last Sunday week in Cherryfield just as both teams took to the pitch. Some spectators commented on the fact that the occasion seemed to getting to the mentors, C1's Donagh and Brendan and C2's Pat and Mark, much more than the girls, who were taking the occasion in their stride. In fact the arrival of some of the club's Juvenile boys to watch Boden's El Clasico seemed to be of greater interest to many of the girls.

That said once the ball was thrown in both teams focused on the task at hand. The C1's settled quicker finding the net soon after throw in. The C2's managed to pick off some well taken

points to bring themselves back level in a fast paced first half. The wind troubled both teams particularly whipping around both goals throughout the half causing many shots to veer marginally wide.

The first half ended with the C2 girls ahead by 3 points but the game was very much in the balance.

The C2's started the second half with a brace of goals and looked to be putting the match out of reach. However the C1's fought back bravely and their determination was clearly evident.

Unfortunately the match took a more serious turn in the last quarter, as Eabha Kelly took an accidental ball to the head which resulted in her having to come off with suspected concussion. This was quickly followed with Cathy Flanagan also landing badly on her knee and also having to be taken off. The referee, with agreement of the mentors of both teams, felt it best to bring the game to an early end.

Both girls were whisked off to hospital by ambulance. Eabha was discharged later that evening after been give with the all clear while Cathy suffered a knee injury. We wish both girls a speedy recovery.

Although the result will show that the C2's were marginal winners on a scoreline of 4-8 to 4-7, this was a final where in truth both teams were winners. For these girls who have journeyed for many years in lower divisions with little glory and success, it was fantastic to see them all play to the best of their ability and once we were reassured that both injured girls would be ok, both teams can say that they were winners in the U16 Shield Championship, which with all things considered was probably the right result.

The Ballyboden team comprised of boys from the Div 7 and 9 leagues in Dublin. They defeated St Mary's but lost to St Anne's and Geraldine P Moran's which qualified them for a 3rd place final against Ballinteer St John's but unfortunately were defeated on a score line of 2-5 to 0-3.

How will an Injured player avail of the Preferred Pricing?

Once a player presents at one of the above named medical facilities, the player will be

requested to confirm their Club or County Panel together with their membership number which the hospital will record. Checks will be made with Croke Park to confirm that the Players' seeking to avail of the Preferred Pricing arrangements are registered members of the Association.

Do I have to attend a Preferred Medical Provider to avail of benefit under the GAA Injury Benefit Fund?

No, a player is not required to attend one of the Preferred Medical Providers listed to avail of benefit under the GAA Injury Benefit Fund. A player can continue to attend medical facilities not noted. However, as above preferred prices have been agreed with the listed Medical facilities only.

Will Croke Park be publishing the prices agreed with the Preferred Medical Providers?

No, due to privacy and commercial sensitivity, we are unable to publish the prices agreed with the Preferred Medical Providers. However, we can confirm that the agreed prices reflect a 5 - 10% saving against prices charged to players' prior to the introduction of this initiative. Players and club officers can contact the relevant medical providers as regards obtaining the agreed price for a surgery that a player may require.

Is the Medical Expenses benefit available under the GAA Injury Benefit Fund changing as a result of this initiative?

No, €4,500 is the maximum amount available for unrecoverable medical expenses as per the terms of the Fund.

Will details of the Preferred Medical Providers initiative be included with the GAA Injury Benefit Fund Summary Document?

Yes, the 2018 GAA Injury Benefit Fund Summary document will be issued later this year and details will be included within it of the Preferred Medical Providers Initiative.

Important Note

We would also remind all, that the playing of Gaelic Football, Hurling, Handball and Rounders' involves the risk of Injury and it is each individual registered player's responsibility to familiarise themselves with the terms and benefits of the GAA Injury Benefit Fund. Each player needs to ensure that they have adequate cover in place to meet their own individual needs and personal circumstances. The GAA Injury Benefit Fund is only in place to cover benefits which cannot be claimed elsewhere and is a benefit cover only. Members should not use the fund as their only recourse or be dependent on the fund to compensate them fully for any losses associated with the injury sustained.
