## Minor A's Topple Cuala to take Shield

#### Le Fear Bog reports

Although major titles were being battled for elsewhere, Ballyboden Minor A's captured the shield title at PUM on Sunday last with a hard fought win over Cuala. A few weeks ago Cuala administered a painful 7 point defeat in the group stages of the championship which left Ballyboden's chances of progress behind the black ball. Thus, a measure of revenge was in mind as the teams took to the field on this cold, sunny November morning. The first half went swimmingly for Boden as they blitzed the Cuala defence. Right from the get go goals were on the minds of the inside full forward line. In the 2nd minute Sam Lally burst through the Cuala defence and laid off for Shane Kennedy to goal. In the 11th minute Kennedy repeated the dose after being put through by captain, Ben Kelly. Kevin Desmond added a third goal in the 19th minute. Assassin Kennedy scored his third major and completed his hat trick in the 28th minute. It wasn't just Kennedy's goals which stood out as he scored the point of the match from the dressing room sideline a couple of minutes before he rounded off his hat trick of goals. Other stand out moments in that half all came from Boden players and Conor Fallon's off the shoulder number after 12 minutes was most definitely a bocphointe. Added to that Conor O'Donoghue was faultless from 65's and long range frees and he would end the match with 5 points – all from huge distances. All this meant Ballyboden went in at the short break ahead on a scoreline of 4-10 to 0-10. Job completed it seemed but a combination of possible Ballyboden complacency and a determined fightback from Cuala made for a much more exciting second half. With 5 minutes left in the match this gritty Cuala side had the lead down to 5 points and backs were to the wall. However, the Kennedy/O'Donoghue axis closed out the match with a succession

of late 65's and frees to hand the title to Boden. Afterwards, Ben Kelly gleefully accepted the shield (cup actually) on behalf of his team mates.

There was never going to be more than a puck of a ball between these two teams. For the past many years the Y2K Boden and Crokes boys have gone toe to toe in Dublins premier hurling division.

In recent years it's fair to say that Boden had the edge in particular since their All Ireland Feile success in 2015, yet Crokes had run them close in all encounters since but failed to close the deal.

Logic says one day that would change and Crokes would get that much sought-after victory over their greatest and nearest rivals.

Both Crokes and Boden are once again this year the form teams in the division and are tied for top spot necessitating a play off on 25th November.

Crokes continued to exert their dominance on the early part of the game and after 20 minutes they had extended their lead to 1.3 to bodens 2 pts. They were up for it today- no mistake. The boden full back Conor Lowe made a thundering run deep into the Crokes half and the resultant pressure led to a goal courtesy of a Crokes mistake from a Dara Kenny shot.

At half time we were leading 1.8 to 1.4 and all were able to breathe a sigh of relief.

The 2nd half was a tight affair with a lot of activity in the middle third of the pitch and it was some time before the 1st score of the 2nd half was registered, by Crokes.

Kilmacud would go on the register a further 5 points with a couple coming from their u15 star Dara Purcell (MOTM) and despite Bodens best efforts most notably again from Lowe and Patrick Dunleavy, we were only able to move the scoreboard one more time again from Codd.

Kilmacud Crokes finally got their win over their great rivals and were worthy winners on a final scoreline of 1.11 to 1.9

A hard day at the office for our lads and mentors who have enjoyed unparalleled success for the past 3 years and it all bodes well for the future of Hurling in the club, and there is of course the League play off on the 25th November yet to some.



A couple of pointed frees from Emer, one from play by Aisling Byrne, and a sweetly-taken goal by Áine began to give us a little breathing space.




