

Last Sunday morning offered our U15B footballers a chance to salvage something from what has been a very tough season of league football.

After two excellent wins against Vincents and Crokes in the previous two rounds of the C Shield competition, we had earned ourselves a final spot against Ballyfermot DLS who had had an excellent league campaign losing only 2 matches all year.

We woke up on Sunday to find that winter had arrived and we headed down to "The Gaels" on Gurteen Road in Ballyfermot– "Gaels" by name and "Gales" and nature as it turned out on Sunday morning.

We started into the wind hoping that we could build a lead and put some doubt in the Ballyfermot team – the strategy worked well. On a very tough day for shooting Eamon O'Brien finally got us up and running with a fine score after 5 mins. Charlie Brady scored a couple either side of a super Timmy Cleary effort to move us 4 points clear after 15 minutes. It wasn't all one way traffic though and Ballyfermot had a number of attacks but seemed to be obsessed with scoring goals and with Cian Tobin in goals in superb form for us there was no early breakthrough for Ballyfermot.

Lead by captain Oisin King we continued to drive at the Ballyfermot goal and we finally

found got the vital goal after 20 minutes when a Jack Coyle shot found the back of net – while the jury is out on whether he meant it or not (!) it was a huge moment in the game and put us firmly in charge. Another point from Charlie, and then Sean Murphy with the point of the day got us to half time 1-6 to 0-0 ahead.

Our defence had a super first half to shut Ballyfermot out but turning into the wind was going to be a different challenge in the second half. But we started the second half in determined mood and got the best possible start when a Kevin Hickey effort somehow found the back of the net on our first attack. But that only seemed to get Ballyfermot's back up and they came at us in waves for the next 20 mins.

The only word to describe the performance of our lads during this period was heroic – Cian Tobin in goals was calmness personified - safe hands & excellent distribution all day he gave the lads huge confidence.

The full back line of SenanDwyer, Dean Jackson & Donal Monahan were immense, across the half back line Micheal Manning, Seamus Boyle and Oisin King were similarly impressive – with Ballyfermotstruggling to get any shots away. After 20 mins of the 2nd half Ballyfermot had only 0-4 on the board, with only 1 from play.

We were playing well on the break with Matt Coughlan and Rian Power providing a really good outlet for the defence but the killer score wouldn't come for us so Ballyfermot keep coming. Finally after a strong Edward Cleary break from the back the ball found its way to Cian O'Byrne who somehow found Eoghan Duignan in the corner – there was disbelief all round when Eoghan somehow found the net with a superb effort from a seemingly impossible angle. The killer score had arrived and Ballyfermot heads dropped.

We dominated the last few minutes with Alex Whelan causing chaos in the Ballyfermot defence and we eased to the finish line on a score of 3-6 to 0-5.

The assembled media gave all of our lads 9/10 ratings on the day (management got a 6/10) but from the management teams point of view all 19 of the lads out on the day deserve a 10/10 for their effort and dedication throughout the year.
