Facile win for Boden in the Adult Hurling League 1

As can be seen from the line-out the Boden Management rested a number of first team regulars for the visit of a team who are sitting at the opposite end of the league table to themselves. Sancta Maria provided a good but firm surface for this Tuesday fixture and the weather was almost tropical with a slight wind favouring the visitors for the opening half. The opening exchanges were high quality with Faugh's Chris Bennett latching onto a good through ball, only to turn onto his left side and fire over a fine point. Boden replied through Finnian McDonagh after a good move through the lines. Eoghan O'Neill added to Boden's tally, only for Faughs to reply within a minute with a fine long range effort. The next five scores were Boden's, two goals from Paul Doherty and McDonagh mixed in with some points from Niall McMorrow and Doherty. It was clear even from this early stage that the contest would prove too much for the visitors. However the Faughs attack kept plugging away and were rewarded with a goal from Fergal Heavey and a few good points from Conor O'Shea. Meanwhile Boden were adding to their tally with more goals, McMorrow and O'Neill the finishers. In defence Luke Corcoran and Jamie Desmond looked well up for the contest, and with good close control, they set up some scores at the other end of the field.

Others to shine were David O'Connor and Aiden Mellett who seemed to find plenty of space along the fence. His late first half goal left little doubt as to where the points were going on this balmy evening. First half finished at 5.09 to 1.05.

Boden made some second-half changes in personnel introducing Weldon, Cleary, Kennedy, McDonnell and Byrne. The onslaught on the Faughs defence continued with Mattie Weldon and McDonagh adding more points. Conor McCormack relished the opportunity to be both creator and finisher, and netted as well as laying on an outrageous pass for McDonagh to finish past Faugh's hapless goalman, Bennett kept trying hard for the visitors and pointed as well as burying a fine shot past Conor O'Donoghue in the Boden goal. The next score fell to Declan Hannon after he intercepted a looped pass only to fire over from sixty metres. Ronan Cleary was another to add his name to the score-sheet with a rasper of a goal and a few quality points. McMorrow showed well mid-way through the half and provided more flags for the referee to record.

In total Boden had thirteen names on the score sheet which accounted for an enormous tally of goals and points. McDonagh was arguably the pick of the Boden forwards, with Corcoran an assured defender and distributor.

The win leaves Boden proudly at the top of the bill and awaiting an opponent for the honour of retaining the league title. Championship action against Cuala beckons first!


