O'Toole Park provided a modicum of Christmas cheer on Sunday morning at the Senior Hurling League Final. The 'result' of a pre-match inspection by a few eagle eyed Boden supporters was the tone of the conversation from the sparsely populated concrete terrace. 'Jazzzz, that field is not great.....plenty of mud on show'.

'You're right.....were you ever at the Ploughing Championships?'

'I see they're keeping Paul (Ryan) in reserve....not starting....and David (Curtin) too'.

'I see.....Good squad out though..... any plans for the rest of the day?'

'We're goin to the Senior Citizens Party in the club'.

The early exchanges were all Bodens with Collie Basquel showing well for the ball. Aiden Mellett also looked the part....perhaps this was evidence of him having had an early Saturday night. The score sequence went...Paul Doherty from a free....Mellett to Basquel....point....Doc again on the double.....and captain Simon Lambert....5 to 0. Na Fianna responded well with Gavin King doing the business from the spot, line balls included. The next ball into the scoring goal was controlled by Mellett....lay-off to Basquel....GOAL! A quarter gone.
Next up was Shane Durkin with the first of his two customary long-range points. This sparked Na Fianna into action and with Shane Barrett leading the charge, they pointed three without reply. Half time had it at 1.06 to 5 points.

The second half was very stop-start, with the northsiders piling the pressure on. But it was Boden who were to point first through the stick of introduction Paul Ryan....a free out wide. After Durkin’s second point, Na Fianna corner back man Conor Kelly stepped up with the first of his two great points. The Boden response was immediate, with Paul from from two frees, followed by the impressive David O’Connor. James Roche completed this good Boden sequence with a neat strike. But the game was not far from done....Na Fianna got their chance and goalman Jonathan Treacy buried his free from 25 metres and set the joust up for a tight finish. But that was as good as it got for them, with Paul Ryan pointing neatly from close in in response to some very good free-taking from King.

Well done to the squad in doing the Championship and League double.

Minor championship is run off over a 6/8-week period at the end of the season and is a great competition to finish the season. This year 8 teams contested the Minor A championship, divided into 2 groups of four. Our first game was at home on PUM on 4 November against St Judes, this was a hotly contested physical battle that the girls controlled from start to finish with almost all of their scores coming from play, finishing with a 3-17 to 1-5. Next up was Na Fianna away on 11 November. This was a tougher ask as Na Fianna imposed their presence on our girls and went into the break ahead by 2 points. That being said the girls got the dream start to the second half with a goal from our captain this year, Aisling Gargan. There was no going back after that and while scores were exchanged between the sides, we managed to knock in a further two goals and came away with a victory, 3 -4 to 1-7. The final game in the group was away to Castleknock on 25 November. True to form the girls launched into the game early and took control right to the end. Again the exhibition of score taking from play is something the team can be very proud of but the ability to get the scores comes from the strong defence the girls have aspired to. We finished the game with a 3-13 to 0-9 score line and that set us up for a semi final place against our neighbours Ballinteer St Johns. We had home advantage on PUM and this was a heated battle in the first half, both sides swapping scores and each side getting a goal in the dying minutes of the first half, level at 2-4 apiece at half time. The second half briefly started in the same heat of battle and then the girls took control and again with some great scores from play finished out winners on a score line of 3-12 to 2-6.

Our final was set for Sunday 09 December against favourites Kilmacud Crokes who were dominant in all their games so far. That being said the Boden ladies were up for the task and the game began at a ferocious pace, both sides excelling in defence. It took all on 7 minutes before Aisling Byrne opened the scoring with a point from play, followed by another point from full forward Hollyn Kennedy. Kilmacud responded with a point of their own from play and everyone knew that this was going to be a heavily contested game. Hollyn Kennedy knocked over another point in the 11 minute and followed up with a quick reaction that netted the ball. Katie McDonald converted one of the few frees awarded to Boden in the 17th minute and extended the lead to 1-4 to 0-2. Chloe Murphy at corner forward was on the warpath and buried another sliotar to the back of the net. Katie McDonald converted a 45 in the 20th minute and after that we took the foot of the pedal and let Kilmacud back into the game where they knocked up 1-3 unanswered before the break. Half time score 2-5 to 1-5.

The girls talked amongst themselves at half time and when asked to up their game in the second half you knew what you were going to get, another high tempo physical battle. Aisling Byrne was first on the scoreboard again with a well-taken point, followed up with a point from centre forward and captain Aisling Gargan. Kilmacud knocked over a point from a free. Chloe Murphy used her speed and skill to catch a high ball, turn the defender and there was only going to be one outcome, bang, sliotar in the back of the net. Kilmacud then got a succession of frees and all were well executed by their talented free taker. The gap narrowed and the girls had to find that extra gear despite being out on their feet at this stage. A well worked ball from defence found its way to Aisling Byrne and with her sights on goal the shot was never in doubt, keeper could do little about it. To put the icing on the cake Katie McDonald who won and deserved woman of the match award, took the final 45 of the game and a high dropping ball ended up in the back of the net.

As usual Ally Ramsden was the last line of defence and she was dependable as ever, making a few very important saves to stem some serious attacks by Crokes. The strength and depth of the team was show by the stern defending of the six backs, Saoirse Fitzgerald, Robyn Flynn, Sadhbh Nic Mhathuna, Hanna Leddy, Aoife Durkin (the rock) at Centre back and Anna O'Shea who suffered hamstring throughout their game. The mid field pairing of Lucy O'Shea and Olivia Meagher worked tirelessly in defence and moving forward. The half forward line of Katie McDonald, Aisling Gargan and Aisling Byrne controlled the Kilmacud half back line and delivered quality ball to the inside forwards. The full forward line of Erica Tobin a, Hollyn Kennedy and Chloe Murphy were a nightmare for any full back line with their movement and skill. Blathnaid Slater and Stephanie Hamm were called up from the bench and made an immediate impact. It must be noted that Kilmacud were held scoreless from play in the second half and that was due to the excellent defending and hard work by the entire panel. It was a fantastic achievement for the girls, all of whom are Minor again next year with the exception of Aisling and Aoife. Thanks to Miriam Christie and Liam Cunningham for the fantastic action photographs.

Finally, we would like to thank the sponsors "WeAreDublin" and the County Board for arranging the championship and Finals Day in particular. The superb setting in Abbotstown did full justice to a championship that, as Fintan Quill mentioned in presenting the Orla Quill trophy to Aisling, is going from strength to strength year by year.

The match was the culmination of a three way play off to decide the runners up spot in the Division 1 league. With St. Vincents already beaten, Na Fianna had conceded home advantage and just as well, as the match would have proved to be otherwise unplayable other than on an all weather pitch. With some silverware in the bag following Boden's Shield victory more silverware was on offer and Boden were intent on getting some more.

Both team had almost their full complement of players and a tight match was expected. More so the fact that a number of the Boden lads had been on County duty earlier and there must have been some very tired legs out there. However that never proved to be the case. In the writer's 40 years of playing and watching hurling the writer could not have expected such an outcome.

Having lost the toss Na Fianna elected to not only take on Boden but to fight the elements as well as the wind and rain lashed down into Na Fianna's faces. If ever there ever was a "ten point" wind advantage this was it !. Boden started well and the ball seldom got past the Boden 65m line. Some sublime points were taken most notably from the fiery Conor Casey who ultimately tallied three beauties. Other scores of note came from the hurls of Josh Corcoran, Davey Keogh and the dynamo himself, Michael McDonald. Captain Rhys McDonnell was also unerring in his free taking duties and hit a couple of monsters to add to the Boden tally. Na Fianna desperately tried to get the ball up the field however a combination of the elements and a steely Boden back line repelled any attack.

At half time the score stood at 0-13 to 0-0 in Boden's favour.

Of note was that the rain desisted for a period but the wind never let up. Boden went out to now face the fire, fury and pride of Na Fianna spearheaded by their go to man and sharp shooter, Tom Brennan, who as it turned out, was never to get a shot off having been completely dominated by Boden's No 6, David Gannon and ably assisted by the combative Alex Gannon playing at full back. It was now the Boden's backs turn to shine as brightly as their illustrious forward line did in the first half and Matthew Ormsby and Connell McGlynn shone brightly indeed. Ball after ball was hailed down on the Boden defence however Na Fianna could simply not get a shot off without being swarmed by defenders. Na Fianna did get a chance on goal however the Boden's goalie, Conor "Barn Door" Barnes, had to pull off an excellent save to further sap Na Fianna's resolve. As it turned out the only score of the second half proved to be a Boden score when Evan Welch crashed a goal in at the other end

to completely break the resolve of Na Fianna and end the match as a contest culminating in Na Fianna never raising a green flag nor a white flag for that matter.

Of note, and throughout this long season, were very strong performances from the likes of Setanta Sudway, Reed Barry, David Keane, Tom Culleton, Hugh O'Sullivan, Cian Durkin, Sean Bury and Cian Kelly.

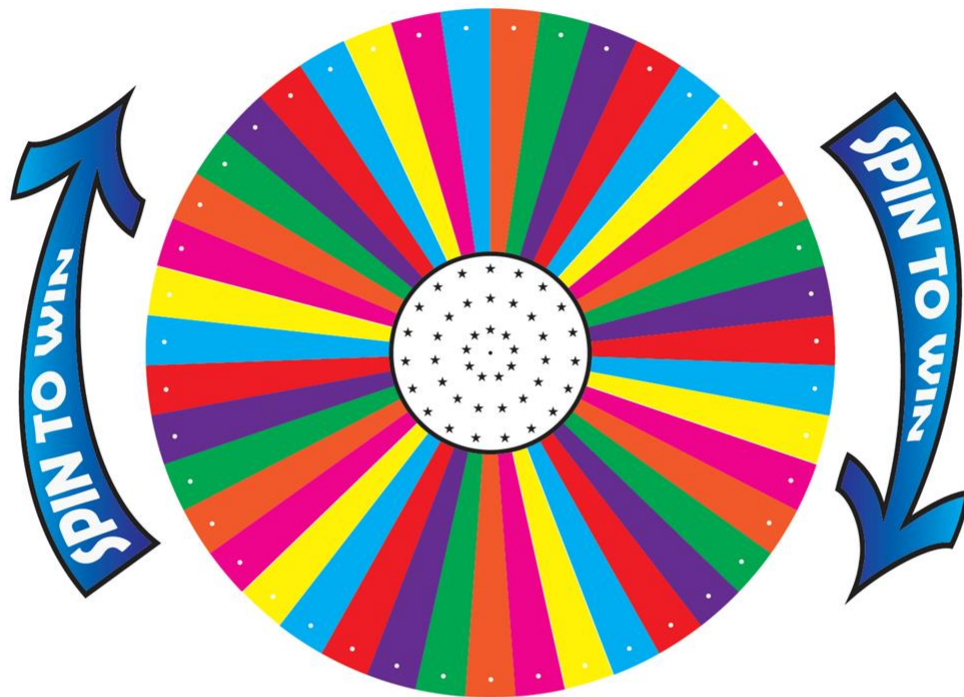
