Dr. Paul Rouse Lecture



Léacht Caoga Bliain 2019 50th Anniversary Lecture - Dr. Paul Rouse

Jim Humphrys (Coiste Caoga Bliain) takes a look back at Paul Rouse's take on the "Future of the GAA in Dublin"

UCD sports historian, Dr. Paul Rouse was given a rapturous reception at the Léacht Caoga Bliain 2019 – 50th Anniversary Lecture on Wednesday 23 January 2019 in the clubhouse. Coming after the inaugural event – the participation in the handball tourament at St. Brigid's, the week gave a rousing start to the celebrations. He promised to be provocative and lively and he didn't disappoint.

A crowd in the region of 150 people attended included Philip Ryan, son of former GAA President, Séamus Ó Riain; Eamonn Rea, All-Ireland winner with Limerick in 1973; Tom Hayes, Chair of Upperchurch-Drombane and former Chair of Ballinteer St. Johns; Pat Smith formerly of South Dublin County Council, Gerry Hoey of Knocklyon History Society as well as scores of club members.

Following an opening welcome by Club Chair Ciarán Maguire, the author of the acclaimed "The Hurlers" reminded those in attendance that these are difficult times for historians with "facts and truth" being subjected to severe attack by leaders like Trump, Putin and Boris Johnson. "Propaganda is not new but the speed at which information can be spread around the world presents a major challenge for historians and others interested in the truth."

Paul emphasised the importance, in these times, of respecting the relationship between language and truth and of facilitating the open exchange of opinions and the respectful conduct of arguments based on facts.

The former Offaly football manager, said his talk would focus on six themes Games, Player, Pitch, County, Money and Meaning.

Addressing the first of these themes – Games - Paul noted that the games have never prospered as they do now and that one of the fundamental reasons, apart from the efforts of clubs and their members, for this success and the continuity of the games is the enduring human attraction to ball games and the physical activity of striking and kicking a ball. The love of play, inherent in people, and the capacity of games to make people dream will ensure that the games survive and thrive. This is not a "given" however and requires many challenges to be addressed including how to measure achievement and success in relation to the games.

Moving to the Player theme, he noted that up to the age of 12 years, players were well catered for, adequately so between 12-17 and very poorly as adults. He noted the extra-ordinary drop out rate between 12 and 21 - by age 20 only 66% of men and 34% of women who played at age 12 were still playing. The drop-out rate is even more pronounced in less well-off areas. There needs to be a greater focus on catering for adults. In this context, issues to be addressed include the balance between club and county, the lack of regular games at club level, the imbalance in the allocation of resources between club and county players and insufficient leadership by HQ and County Boards to plan for adult players. There is a stagnation at club level in many counties as evidenced by the reduction in adult teams in many areas with Dublin, for example, having 21 less adult teams than in 2010. On the Pitch theme, Paul highlighted the lack of pitches in inner-city Dublin and the critical need to support clubs such as Kevins in catering for the communities it serves. The availability of land for pitches will be a major factor in shaping the GAA in Dublin. In relation to the County theme Paul considered the well deserved success of a great Dublin football team to be due in no small way to the work of club volunteers. In relation to structures, he reviewed the arguments for and against the splitting of Dublin and concluded that the arguments against had been given more prominence and that there had been no fundamental analysis of the alternatives.

This analysis was necessary in view of the existing and growing population imbalance between the East region, particularly Dublin, and the rest of the country. Dublin has a population greater than the rest of Leinster and multiples of other provinces. It's population will also be younger on average. Paul considers that there is a failure to plan for this population imbalance and what it means for the GAA in 20 years time and how it will accommodate Dublin.

In relation to Money, Paul acknowledged the difficulty of securing finance but felt that the recently announced price increases were not justified given the GAA's commitment to Sport for All. He is concerned that the price increase reflects the "triumph of cash".

Finally, in relation to Meaning, Paul posed the questions "what is the meaning of what we try to do?" and "why do the games secure such unselfish support?". In his view the answer lies not so much in notions of nationhood and associated concepts but in the fundamental love of play as expressed in Heaney's lines –

"Youngsters shouting their heads off in a field As the light died and they kept on playing Because by then they were playing in their heads"

A wide ranging Q&A following Paul's address covered a large number of topics including: - need for meaningful games for adults

variable quality of leagues super-counties and super-clubs shorter inter county season and/or club and county seasons importance of volunteerism creeping professionalism including payment of players and managers catering for special needs children lack of playing space.

In the general Q&A discussion, Paul emphasised the critical importance of maintaining a focus on "Sport for All and facilitating maximum participation". He summarised his key point as a "plea for planning" at all levels in the GAA to address the challenges across the themes he spoke to.

Sancta Maria Construction Works IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTICE

Please note that demolition works will commence shortly of old school buildings in the Sancta Maria school complex. These works will affect our two-storey building on the left of the dressing room courtyard i.e., where Sparc Physiotherapy is located. Part of the two-storey building as far as the railing, on the pitch side of the building, will be demolished as well as the chimney at the back of the building (down to the eaves).

While appropriate safety barriers will be erected, members are advised to be extra careful when using this general area in the next few weeks.

Paul Rouse Lecture: Wednesday 23rd January 2019.

Following on the huge success of the Diarmuid Ferriter talk in 2016 we have secured the services of author and Associated Professor in UCD to give a lecture on various aspects of the GAA. This event is free to members.

Archiving Project and Exhibition of Club Memorabilia: Easter 2019 -


With regard to mandatory workshops (Foundation course & Child Protection Course) can you ensure that if they have not yet completed these courses, they do so with a matter of urgency.
