7 a-side Adult Football Tournament -Saturday 2nd February



The Football Section's Tournament to mark the Club's 50th Anniversary took place in brilliant sunshine on Saturday the 2nd of February last.

Sixty four players from the Senior, Intermediate, Junior and Minor ranks were merged into two Groups of four teams.

Group A contained Leitrim, Westmeath, London and Cavan.

With Group B comprising of New York, Tipperary, Sligo and Carlow.

Despite some unbecoming behaviour from certain Cavan men and in particular one unscrupulous Leitrim Man (you know who you are!), Brian O'Regan, Tony Duffy and Donal Griffin did a great job in ensuring that the teams were made up of equal talent and ability. What followed were eight well contested group games, which were held in Cherryfield Park and Pairc Uí Mhurchú. It was fantastic to see the players from the different club teams gelling and competing well together. It was also good to see our Senior Manager, Anthony Rainbow contributing his skills at one stage.

It was the essence of our club sprit and a large part of what the tournament was intended for,

to see Minor players who cheered on from the stands as 14 and 15 year olds on St. Patricks Day in 2016, playing alongside their heroes such as Darragh Nelson, Bob Dwan, Sean Gibbons, Aran Waters, Darren O'Reilly, Donogh Mc Cabe and Shane Clayton etc.. Although in the spirit of true competitiveness, one of the Minor players was heard mentioning: "that Ciaran Doyle fella is still a class footballer, but I wish that he would pass more"!!

The Westmeath team of Aran Waters, Tom Hannifin, Eoghan Monahan, Ruairi Kirwan, James Mc Teirnan, Mick Ryan, Patrick Dunleavy and Kevin Kirwan topped Group A. With the Carlow Rising team of Bob Dwan, Darragh Nelson, Mikey Ryan, Fionn Maguire, Ross Mc Cormack, Malachy Codd, Brendan Kavanagh and Conor Cullen topping Group B. The final was keenly contested in Pairc Uí Mhurchú at 3.20pm, with Carlow securing the Trophy with the narrowest of score lines of 0 - 9 to Westmeath's 1-5.

It was to the showers and into the hall then for Liam Deane's very own Lovely Leitrim Recipe of Beef (yes beef!) Curry, which was cooked to perfection by Paddy Brady. We would like to thank Karl Woods, Richie Connell, Des Donoghue and Liam Deane for sponsoring the food.

The Trophy, which was in memory of our former Football Secretary, Padraig Cullinane, was presented to Bob Dwan and the victorious Carlow Team by Padraig's wife Mary, who thanked the Football Committee and in particular the Players for making it such a special day.

The committee would like to reiterate our appreciation to all of the players, the mentors, volunteers and the catering and bar staff and in particular Tony Duffy, Liam Deane and Brian O'Regan for making the day such a great success.

From the great feedback that we have received, it is hoped that we can make this an annual event in the club calendar.

#### The Football Tournament - A players report



The 2nd of February 2019 marked a momentous day for Irish sport. The Leopardstown Dublin Festival kick-started preparations for Cheltenham, Ireland played England in the Aviva Stadium and GAA county teams across the country embarked on their second round games of the national league.

However, on Saturday last, all eyes were on HQ on Firhouse Road where Ballyboden football section held an all-inclusive adult football tournament to celebrate our 50th year (1969-2019) and also to remember the late Padraig Cullinane.

Padraig was a former football secretary and passed away on the 13th of February 2017. The tournament brought players from Minor to Seniors together to compete and was excellently organised, 8 teams of 8 players were split into two Groups of A and B . The winners of each group would eventually compete in the final at 3.30pm. Group A saw Leitrim, Westmeath, London, and Cavan match up against each other. Leitrim was led by senior player Alan flood

and were eagerly tipped as the dark horses of the tournament with some familiar faces back in Pairc Ui Murchu – such that of the Galway's new native Conor Deane and the powerful Shane Clayton at the back, however this did not seem to be the case as they were narrowly beaten by Westmeath in the first Game. The Westmeath team were excellently balanced; Aran Waters led from the middle and was joined by the young Eoghan Monahan. One could only have to question the team selections as Westmeath proved to be far superior for Group A. Meanwhile, London played against Cavan across the road on the Cherryfield pitch. London had the dynamic duo of Warren Egan and Colm Og Humphreys along with some top notch goalkeeping of Darren O'Reilly - amazingly nothing could get past the senior stalwart. Cavan got off to a tough start, and despite best efforts of young minors Luke Kelly and Sean Flaherty nothing seemed to get Cavan going. Group B kicked off with similar excitement, where New York, Tipperary, Carlow and Sligo battled to be crowned group champions. The opening game saw New York take on Tipperary in a feisty encounter. Tipperary had the safe Stephen McGrath and Junior defender Alex Murphy to mind the house while the powerhouse Jimmy Holland ran through the centre. The other game saw Sligo face Carlow on the Camogie pitch. This game brought the pure essence of the tournament to life seniors, minors and junior players played together in highly competitive and fun games. Carlow ran out winners and would eventually go on to top the group. Group A was topped by Westmeath which meant the eagerly anticipated final was set for 3.30 pm. Group A and B runners up London and New York were up against each other in the second final. New York came out superior in this one - scoring 11-3 with Bambi Bobbett and Cavan man Tom Hayes leading from the front. The third place playoff brought Leitrim to play Tipperary in an end to end battle. The sides were level with 2 minutes to go until James Hutchinson grabbed the winning point. Unfortunately Leitrim lived up to their poor record having lost all 3 games. Cavan beat Sligo to clench 4th place. The stage was then set for the final - Waters Westmeath took on Dwan and Nelsons Carlow. In a hugely exciting contest nothing could separate the two teams. Carlow were systematic in their play and looked as if they had trained for weeks. Rumour has it – Fionn Maguire held a team meeting up in Orlagh the night before the tournament to talk tactics. Whatever they did - it proved enough. Great performances from Malachy Codd and Phil McCormack throughout the tournament were pivotal to their success along with a steady defence of Bob Dwan and of course the ever reliable Fionn Maguire. Westmeath were good, very good in fact. The Finnish man Tom Hannifin was solid and with Bagsy Kirwan up front, they fancied there chances. This tense battle saw Carlow come out on top, thus crowned champions of the tournament. The trophy was presented to Carlow captain Bob Dwan in the club after the game by Mary Cullinane on behalf of the Cullinane family A huge thank you to all players, organisers and coaches who came on the day. As noted in the lead up the tournament, much of the GAA's resources go to our county players which represent less than 1% of players, this tournament catered for 100% of our club players. What a way to kick start 2019 football in the club.

### Sancta Maria Construction Works IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTICE

Please note that demolition works will commence shortly of old school buildings in the Sancta Maria school complex. These works will affect our two-storey building on the left of the dressing room courtyard i.e., where Sparc Physiotherapy is located. Part of the two-storey building as far as the railing, on the pitch side of the building, will be demolished as well as the chimney at the back of the building (down to the eaves).

While appropriate safety barriers will be erected, members are advised to be extra careful when using this general area in the next few weeks.

For your information, the final plan is to create a one-way traffic system, entering in front of Saplings school and exiting at the back of the two-storey building and the apple garden. The roadway will be upgraded and improved. Sancta Maria will be building a sports hall, basketball courts and car parks, to which the Club will have access.


With regard to mandatory workshops (Foundation course & Child Protection Course) can you ensure that if they have not yet completed these courses, they do so with a matter of urgency.
