17 February 2019: Senior football v Ballymun, league in Ballymun. Ballyboden St Endas $2-10\,$ Ballymun $0-11\,$

It's always nice to get off to a winning start in the league, especially against one of the top teams in the league, with most of their county players available. The first 3 scores were from frees, two for Ballymun split by a good free from Colm Basquel, in the first 7 minutes. The visitors then took over. Declan O'Mahony levelled matters from play and then, from an excellent pass across the goal mouth by Sean Gibbons, Warren Egan finished to the net. Ross McGarry, Michael Darragh MacAuley and Warren Egan (2) brought the score to 1-6 to 0-2. Ballymun finally woke up to score from play on 22 minutes but this was cancelled out by a free by Colm Basquel, with less than 5 minutes to go to half time. However, the bad news was that Michael Darragh was shown a red card about five minutes before half time. The half time score 1-7 to 0-3. The question was, would a 7-point lead be enough for our 14 players to withstand Ballymun pressure in the second half.

As expected Ballymun started with great intent and in the first 15 minutes scored four points (1 free) without reply from Ballyboden, to leave just a goal between the sides. Sean Gibbons settled all our nerves with a good point from play and this was followed five minutes later with a great team goal. Following clearance from the back, Barra McGarry fed Darren O'Reilly who, in turn, fed Colm Basquel. He was coolness personified as he faced down the

Ballymun goal keeper, picked his spot and finished to the corner of the net. This brought the lead to 7 points with 10 minutes remaining. As our backs fought for every ball, Ballymun got another point back from play. But as the clock counted down Ballymun managed just two more points from frees but these were in turn cancelled out by points from play by Colm Basquel and Warren Egan, who enjoyed one of his best days in a senior jersey. So, a well-deserved victory after a hard day in the office, especially with 14 players for all of the second half.

17 February 2019: Intermediate football v Ballymun, league in PUM. Ballyboden St Endas $1-11\,$ Ballymun 2-06

The first league match of the 2019 campaign could not come soon enough - the preparation had been completed at training and in the early season challenge games and the squad was ready to go.

On a fresh blustery morning the Boden squad assembled in the newly refurbished home dressing room. Some late changes in personnel were required due to injury and illness. The match started with Boden playing with the aid of a strong breeze into the Cremorne end and with that wind created a number of scoring chances which either fell short or into the keeper's hands. While the play was encouraging the opposition kept us on our toes when they moved the ball swiftly up the pitch. The first score came after six minutes in the form of a point off the boot of Mikey Dunne. Further chances were were wasted by both teams until Ballymun knocked over a point in the sixteenth minute. This was followed a minute later by a Ballymun goal following some loose defending. Unfortunately in the scramble for the goal our goalkeeper, Ste McGrath picked up an injury and was replaced between the sticks by the versatile Oisin Carolan. After the setback Boden responded positively and took a grip on the game. Hard work in the middle sector by Dave and Johnny was establishing a platform for our attacks. Eventually in the space of two minutes Mikey clipped over a brace. This was followed by a Boden goal in the 25th minute from the boot of Evan after some intricate interpassing down the middle. The half was finished off with a point for the visitors and a Boden point from Mono leaving the half-time score at 1-4 to 1-2 in favour of the home side.

After a number of substitutions the northsiders started the second half the more lively and quickly knocked over a point. Boden now playing into the breeze then responded with a period of sustained pressure which saw them notch over four points in quick succession - two from Oisin (who had been replaced in goal by Archie) and one each from Ev and Dylan. The point from Ev followed a slick quick series of interpassing that ended in Mikey's shot rebounding off the bar to Ev who fisted it over from a tight angle. At the other end Boden continued to smother Ballymun attacks with Fionn and Keith marking tightly and competing fiercely. Karl continued to mind the house. Cathal, Johnny and Scott marshalled the half-back line with relentless disciplined tackling. In the middle Neil and Oisin matched and largely subdued their opponents.

After the dynamic fleet-footed Ciaran clipped over a point the visitors responded with a point which was quickly followed by a goal in the 20th minute and another point a minute later. The margin was down to two points and the game was in the balance. Dylan was soon replaced by Tommy in the 23rd minute in an attempt to steady the ship. The margin was reduced to the

minimum in the 28th minute of the half but Johnny responded immediately with a delightful point.

After one minute of injury time the referee Tommy Clinton blew the whistle giving Boden a much prized home win.

The Ballyboden Senior ladies B team took part in the Comórtas for the first time and were delighted to win the Junior Ladies A competition and bring the cup back to Ballyboden.

Games were 20 minutes per half with teams of 13 aside. Our first game was against London club, Kingdom Gaels on Saturday morning in Pairc an Ashaigh in Dingle.

We started slowly and despite playing with the gale force wind we were still only level at half time, things were looking bad for us when we conceded an early 2nd half goal .

However, the girls showed real grit and determination and goals by Sarah Burns and Paula McGrath saw us winning by 2 05 to 2 03.

Kingdom Gaels were a very good team and they proved that when they went on to win the Junior B competition later in the day.

Next up was local team Dingle spearheaded by the 2 Geaney sisters, we played some brilliant passing football in this game combined with heroic defending. Our defenders broke up attack after attack and thendrove forward relentlessly setting up scores for our forwards and winning important frees.

We notched up 1 04 in the first half with scores coming from Paula 1 01, Shauna, Elizabeth and Aine a point each.

However we conceded 2 goals, the second was a little controversial as our excellent keeper Danielle was down injured following a challenge when the ball hit the net

A strong gale made conditions difficult for both teams. The first half was evenly contested but scores were hard to come by. At half time, two points separated the teams with the




