First Match:

Naomh Maur V Ballyboden St Endas (A)

After months of planning and preparation, Féile day had arrived and the team gathered at Naomh Maur in Rush. Lead by Donagh McGrath the mentors took the team away from the excitement and bustle around the clubhouse to the far side of the pitch, in order to keep things calm for the warm up and pre-match preparations.

First up was the game against the hosts Naomh Maur. From the start it looked like an evenly matched game as both teams battled to get the upper hand but an early free for Maurs resulting in a point gave them the opening score. Julie Brady responded shortly later with a beautifully struck free to even things up again. Maurs got another point but Ailbhe Christie, Nessa Codd, Isabelle Morris and Ellen Sweeney, continued to work hard pushing BBSE forward.

Up front Abbie Fitzgerald, Julie Brady and Aoibheann Roche were causing all kinds of problems for the Maurs defence. The breakthrough came when Heather McGrath delivered a 65m shot straight in to the Maurs' net giving BBSE a 2 point lead.

Minutes later Karrie Rudden nearly widened the lead with a tremendous shot that just slipped passed the post. The teams were evenly matched and Maurs closed the gap to 1 point just before half time.

The second half started with Maurs on the attack but great defensive play from Jennie Maguire, Ailbhe Dunne and full backs Aisling Quinn, Caoilin Dunne and Grace Cadell and Millie Larkin kept them at bay. Still under attack, the last line of defense was called into action and goalkeeper Enya Kennedy made a couple of fantastic saves. Nessa Codd got the first breakthrough early in the game with a wonderful point from play. Abbie Fitzgerald continued the attack with a great shot shortly afterwards hitting the post and keeping the pressure on.

Jennie Maguire, Ailbhe Christie, Isabelle Morris, Ellen Sweeney, Amy Brennan and Karrie Rudden put in a trojan effort in the mid-field areas to win the ball and drive it forward. Julie Brady got BBSE's second point from a perfectly taken free. Almost immediately Na Fianna responded with a point of their own. Na Fianna pushed forward again but the defensive line of Caoilin Dunne, Grace Cadell, Aisling Quinn held fast. The play swung from one end to the other and in the closing minutes of the first half Nessa Codd burst through the Na Fianna defense and after an initial great save by the Na Fianna goalkeeper Nessa picked up the rebound and made certain of the goal.

Six minutes in the second half Na Fianna got a point but this was cancelled out and the lead widened minutes later when Heather McGrath scored a goal from a free just outside the Na Fianna box.

Day 2 of Cumann Camógaíochta Ath Cliath - Féile na nGael 2019 - BBSE and Lucan Sarsfield met in the final at Lorcan O'Toole Park, Crumlin. As the players arrived, some 60 minutes before the start, there was a mix of excitement and nerves but the mentors were composed and calm - at least on the outside! They went about the business of warm up and settling nerves - reassuring the girls of their skills and abilities. Fantastic support from the club also as the mentors, players, and family members from other teams arrived to lend their support and encouragement.

This trip to Mobhi Road was never going to be easy in view of the aftermath of our championship match against the same opposition last year, and so it proved. Na Fianna scored first after two minutes but Ross McGarry quickly pointed to equalise. Both defences

were on top with scores hard to come by. Darragh Gogan made a great save to deny the home side and Ross McGarry had a good opportunity at the other end shortly thereafter but his shot was well saved. We had to wait until the 10th minutes for the next score which was a goal for the visitors. Collie Basquel carried the ball through the home defence, laid it off to Warren Egan who passed to Darren O'Reilly who palmed it into the net. The lead did not last long and Na Fianna scored a goal when the Boden defence failed to deal adequately with a high ball and, when it broke loose, a Na Fianna forward lashed it to the net. However, Darren O'Reilly repeated his earlier goal when Warren Egan again found him lurking near the goal and he again palmed the ball to the net. This was no more than was deserved as the ball should have been finished to the net twice in the short period before that. Ross McGarry with three points and Darren O'Reilly with one brought the visitor's score to 2-5 for the first half. The second of Ross's points was made by Darrgh Gogan who soloed, unchallenged, along the right-hand line into the Na Fianna half before finding Ross with a good pass and Ross did the rest. Na Fianna got a point back before the half time whistle to bring their score to 1-2.

Na Fianna scored first in the second half but Collie Basquel cancelled it our with a point from a free after Warren Egan was fouled, to restore the lead to six points. Intermediate footballers edge out Man O'War

The third match of the intermediate football team's league campaign was eagerly awaited after an extended break for the St. Patrick's weekend. The visitors on this occasion to Ballycullen were the intriguingly named Man O'War from the county's northern heartland. Apparently it's derived from Mean Bharr "or middle height" but we'll let the reader do some research.

It was a typical cool calm spring morning and the Ballycullen playing fields looked immaculate. Pockets of spectators assembled randomly around the pitch awaiting the imminent clash of the Boden and Man O'War warriors.

From the off Man O'War got into their stride and tapped over an early point. These lads meant business and were bringing a slick fast-paced game to challenge the home team. Dylan Walsh responded with a point in the fourth minute which was quickly followed by Boden attempts for a point and a goal, both of which were wide. The pace of the game was electric with both teams threatening to carve open the opposition with every attack. The visitors pointed a long range free from the 45m line in the 10th minute and following a wide popped over another point to go 2 points ahead. Boden were looking a little ragged in defence but Fionn, Karl and Fergal were just doing enough to maintain some order. In the 18th minute some skilful attacking interplay between Scott and David resulted in Dylan unleashing a shot that was saved by the keeper. The game was beginning to open up and following a wide Mikey Dunne took a pass from Lewis to pop over a point to reduce the deficit.

Moments later Johnny Murphy delivered a 30m pass down the left wing to Mikey who slipped around his marker and ran in on goal to place the ball calmly into the corner of the net. The score was now 1-2 to 0-3 to Boden.

There then followed a series of wides by both teams - testament to the pressure being applied by both defences.

The next score was a goal by Ev Flanagan now plying his trade at full forward. Seeing the difficulty the full back was having trying to pass to a teammate Ev block the attempted pass and stole in on goal with the ball and delivered it sweetly to the net. Almost from the kick-out David broke forward and passed to Ev who slotted over a point. It was half-time and Boden led 2-3 to 0-3.

The second half began with Man O'War adopting route one tactics and the first missile fell nicely into the grateful hands of Mark McNamee. The second half started with a more intense Man O'War approach and Boden were just about managing. Nonetheless after a Keith slip the visitors tapped over a point and quickly followed it with a point from a 30m free. After some good approach play by Dylan and Ev it was Lewis who steered the shot wide for Boden. Boden were still creating chances. Neil then replaced Dylan in the middle and his telepathic connection to our keeper saw him win a number of kickouts. Boden were still in the game but the intensity had certainly lifted. 
U12s Take on Clontarf in Ballycullen
