After a dominant first half, Boden led by 12 points at the interval, 2-12 to 0-6. An early goal from Cian Mellett and another from Conal Keaney coming up to the break left Whitehall with a mountain to climb on a perfect evening for hurling.

Whitehall certainly made a game of it in the second half. A Conor Sheedy goal six minutes into the second period gave them hope and they tagged on several points to bring the game to within three as we entered the final few minutes. A Paul Ryan free gave Boden some breathing space before Whitehall got another goal at the death when a 65s went all the way to the Boden net.

A second one point victory sees Boden qualify for the Quarters with a final group game against Setanta to come. Lucan and Whitehall will now play out for the second spot. Boden will top the group if they can get a point from their last game. These games will most likely take place in early September.

Adults can sample some delicious artisan food and beer while enjoying some incredible music!

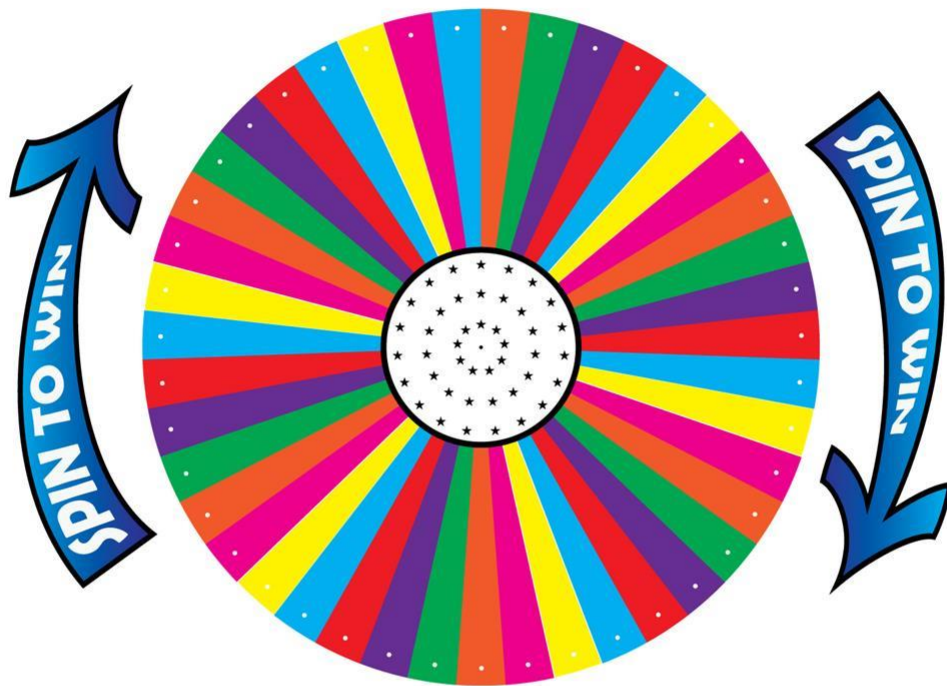

Please note that demolition works will commence shortly of old school buildings in the Sancta Maria school complex.
