A fine team performance from Ballyboden St. Endas Senior B hurlers yielded two valuable championship points (group stage) on Saturday evening last. The pitch at HQ was of such a high quality that a certain Irish writer might have said "it was like a deep carpet, Youghal to Youghal". This was just one of two Cork links to the evening, the other being the Boden inclusion of ex-Ballyhooley hurler Darragh O'Reilly, a recent and valuable sign-up to the club. The competing sides arrived at the Firhouse Road venue from contrasting positions, Crumlin having opened their championship campaign with a good win, while Boden's opener came up short, albeit after a satisfactory performance.

The winning of this contest centred around periods of domination, significantly at the end of each half. With Crumlin working hard to keep the home side within reach coming to the close of the first thirty, out of a longish ruck emerged O'Reilly with the sliotar. His conversion of the possession opened his side's lead to seven points. Star man from the first half Gavin Corrigan added a further Boden point and his fifth in total in the half. This handsome lead of eight points was ultimately the winning of the contest. Crumlin were well up for the challenge when they emerged for the second half, and two goals should have been the launchpad for a tense finale, but it was Boden who finished the game as a contest with five unanswered scores within the last ten minutes of play. The last quarter was dominated by the performance of Kevin Desmond who worked tirelessly to create opportunities as well as pointing three quality points of his own.

The Brendan Moran management team will have their concerns, particularly after the concession of the goals. The first of these came after a high ball from out in the middle landed at the feet of sturdy operator Adam Doyle(r). He managed to collect, turn and shovel the ball past Conor O'Donoghue in the Boden net. The second Crumlin goal came when Sam Caswell anticipated that a high incoming ball would break past the Boden defence. He had the easiest of tasks in firing past O'Donoghue. Putting this goal with a follow-up point from big centre-forward Shane Ryan brought the margin down to five points. That's where Boden's overall fitness and application came to the fore and led to the bagging of the championship points.

The style of play will particularly please the Boden mentors. The diagonal ball was well used by defenders, and forwards were on the move in anticipation of good possession opportunities. There were good moments like Ronan Dooley's interception of a looped Crumlin pass which opened up for Keith McCarron, and he landed one over from out on the whitewash. Others to shine were Cian Mellett, particularly when he saw daylight in front of the Crumlin defence. His breakaway score in the first half provided a huge lift for his side. O'Donoghue provided his own contribution from mid-field, a sixty-five that landed short, only to somehow scuttle its way to the Crumlin net. Mattie Weldon operated from the corner and got onto enough ball to create about five free-scoring chances for Mark Lambert and Corrigan. Others who did particularly well were Finnian McDonagh (3 pts.), Jamie Desmond, James Enright (3 pts.) and Fionn Maguire. Corrigan did enough to earn the MVP choice, but hot on his tail would be O'Reilly, Mellett and McDonagh.

Division One, Cherryfield

Saturday morning: The boys, decked out impeccably in their Féile gear, mingle on the main pitch and kick a few balls around. They've been through hurling Féile a few short weeks ago so they know what's coming. Everyone is calm and there is a real sense that this group of lads are ready for a big weekend. Kevin O'Brien, our piper and medic for the day got the show on the road by leading out the parade of the 4 teams and playing Amhrán na bhFiann. Our club chairman welcomed everyone to the club, gave them all a few final words of encouragement and it was time to let the games begin.

10:30am: Our first game was against our neighbours St. Judes and we were quickly off to a flier. Evan got our first score of Féile with a pointed free. We were solid at the back and we kept the scoreboard ticking over to get to the half with a healthy lead of 2-6 to 1-1. Judes battled hard but our defence stayed firm and Scott in goals pulled off a couple of point blank saves. We tagged on the scores in the 2nd half including goals from Mark and Dylan to run out victors on a score of 5-9 to 1-3. Tús maith, leath na hoibre. In the other game Lucan got the better of Templeogue Synge Street (TSS) on a score of 2-3 to 0-6.

11:45pm: Next up were TSS. A tight and nervous first half left us separated by the minimum with TSS leading by 0-2 to 0-1. TSS started the 2nd half better and grew in confidence as the half wore on getting 3 unanswered goals to put the game beyond doubt. Boden kept at it and got a few late scores to reduce the deficit. TSS ran out 7 point victors on a score of 3-4 to 1-3. In the other game Lucan defeated Judes 4-4 to 5-0.

This all meant that after 2 games each Lucan had 4 points, TSS and Boden had 2 points and Judes were scoreless. Just like the hurling Féile a few weeks ago there was now the possibility of a 3 way tie at the top of the table with only 2 teams qualifying. A quick consultation with our coordinators for the day (Dave Keily and Donal Woodcock) confirmed that Boden needed to beat Lucan by 6 points to be sure of qualifying for the semi-final. To top the group and stay in Cherryfield for the semi-final Boden would need to beat Lucan by 12 points. The coaches were told what was needed. They in turn told the boys and by God did they deliver !

1pm. This is Dublin Division 1 football. Every ball is contested. Nothing is easy. These 2 teams have had many close battles in league football but a Féile semi-final was on the line and the intensity level was palpable. Scott came up big for us again with another great save in the opening minutes and it was nip and tuck throughout the first half until John goaled to get us to half time ahead on a score of 1-5 to 0-5. News came through from the other pitch the TSS were winning so we knew that we couldn't rely on favours from elsewhere. We had to continue to do what we were doing and win this match by 6 points or more. In the first minute of the second half Evan broke through and got a goal. Further goals from Evan, Mark and Zach blew the scoreboard open and we ran out victors by a 14 point margin (5-8 to 0-9). It was a fantastic performance by all the squad. They were all exhausted but they would now have a break to recover before their next match at 4pm. Lucan were very unlucky to get knocked out despite winning 2 matches. News then came through from Stillorgan to tell us that Kilmacud Crokes had topped their group with St Patrick's Donabate coming 2nd. This meant that Boden would play St Patricks.

Everyone adjourned to the clubhouse for food and refreshments courtesy of the U13 parents. Yet again our club rose to the occasion and drew plaudits for the hospitality from all the

visiting teams. One of the referees even told me that he was delighted to be assigned to Ballyboden for the day as "They always put on a great spread". Feedback like that should make us all proud. Not so pleased was Head Coach Brendan when he intervened just in the nick of time to stop the boys getting stuck into a feast of crisps and biscuits. The boys sheepishly went back to their proper food while the rest of us devoured everything without fear or guilt !

The other teams had now started returning from their own Féile's and the players all mixed around the clubhouse sharing stories from their respective mornings. The fantastic squad spirit that we had seen at hurling Féile was evident again as the other squads got behind this group. St Patricks arrived, the boys were summoned to the dressing room and we all made our way back out to the pitch in nervous anticipation.

4pm. A huge crowd had now gathered. Boden started well but scores were hard to come by. We survived a huge early scare when St Patricks missed a gilt edged goal chance. On we went and we tagged on a few points before Leon goaled just before the break. This was crucial and thoroughly deserved and it translated into a 1-5 to 0-2 half time lead. 20 minutes now separated the boys from Monday's final but they still had work to do. The coaches gave them one last talking to before sending them out to finish the job. Goals from Mark and Evan put the game beyond doubt before Zach picked up a ball around the 40 and waltzed his way past everyone before crashing an unstoppable shot into the back of the net. All the boys gave it their best shot and they can all hold their heads up high. These 2 teams will have many battles in future. We came up short in this one but there'll be other days for these lads.

Boden began in control of the game despite an early point from Fingal. Sean was busy in the half forward line, and some nice interchange of play followed by a strong run and finish led to a goal by Matthew Callen, and it was game on. Fingal composed themselves and replied

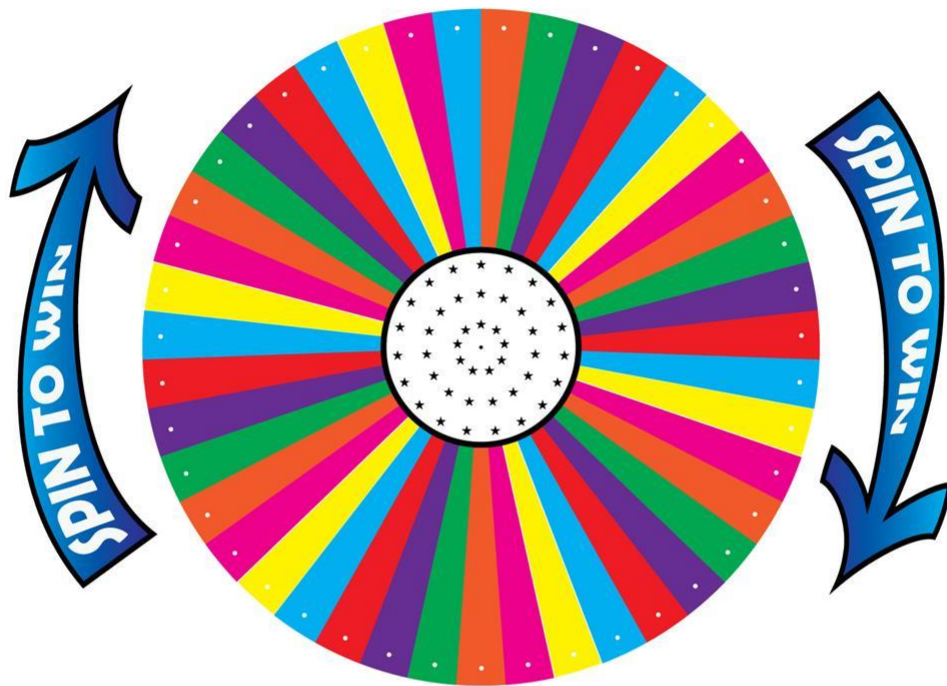

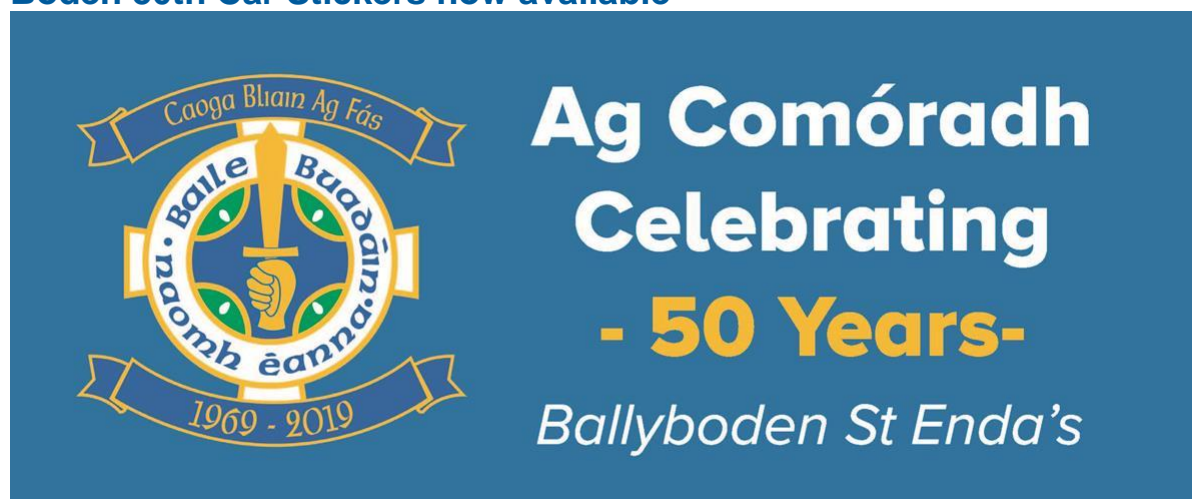
