U14A Camogie at Feile na nGael Finals in Cork







Having been decorated for victory in earlier battles, our Under 14 Camogie A team and reigning Division 1 Dublin Féile Champions, headed to the banks of the River Lee for a memorable campaign through wind, rain and blistering sunshine, to compete in the national Camogie Féile na nGael. Lead by Donagh McGrath, Cathal Fitzgerald, John Cadell, Sam Maguire and supported by Declan Roche, Miriam Doyle, Aibhin Dunne and Mick Kennedy our girls battled hard in 5 tough matches only to fall to the puck of a ball - in a sudden death shoot-out.

Our troops converged on Cork's outer limits, most onboard the Boden Bus from Dublin, while reinforcements from the West arrived at the rendez-vouz point near Fermoy. Our hosts Aghabullogue GAA greeted Ballyboden warmly as we rolled into the village of Coachford which was duly decked out in club colours and welcome posters.

Match 1

The 1st group match was against Éire Óg from nearby Ovens and rumour had it they were highly fancied this year to go all the way - they did! In any event, this river crossing was met by a spirited effort from our girls - strong running from Karrie Rudden, Amy Brennan and Abbie Fitzgerald in the opening minutes yielded a single point slotted over by Neasa Codd. 
