A Hurling Celebration on our 50th Anniversary

On Saturday last the 22nd June the Hurlers hosted the third adult Poc Fada, a Juvenile Poc Fada and for the very first time ever a Poc Fada Beag. This was followed by a very successful sevens competition, Barbeque, presentations and finished the evening with a few sociable drinks at the Clubhouse. Lady luck for sure was on our side with the Sun shining brightly on all proceedings throughout the day.

The day began with the Juvenile Poc Fada where over 50 players participated ranging from 13-15yrs and we also made history where the very first girl participated , Mallaidh Ni Fhaircheallaigh, well done Mallaidh. The winners were Sean Wall(second time) , Darragh Ormsby, Arron Campbell and Joe Rafter. Well done lads and to Emmet Pullen and all the mentors for running a very enjoyable event. Next up was the Adult poc fada and the excitement was building all week whether Matty O Sullivan could do the three-in-a row. The

jury is out on whether he pumped in enough hours on the training ground but this year he was well down the pecking order but he certainly over performed on the stage later-on!! The course was somewhat more challenging than last year and course designer, Joe Ryan, certainly challenged every player to be a bit more tactical. The winners this year by a short nose were: Dean Curran, Finian McDonagh and Aaron Coffey. It was Deano's second time to win matching Matty but not consecutively which was duly noted by the man himself

. Special mention to our Under 16 Hurlers who assisted us in finding a few wayward sliotars. Everyone took a well-earned break for an hour, had some refreshments and then re-grouped for the Sevens at 3.30pm on PUM and Cherryfield. It ran on a round robin basis with serious bragging rights up for grabs. Each team of 10 had four games, seven minutes a half, and all in splendid sunshine. Senior football league v Skerries Harps in Skerries on 19 June 2019

From the throw in the visitors showed their intention of maintaining their position at the top of the league and within 2 minutes Collie Basquel popped over a point from free. However, four minutes later he was on the side-line, having been sent off. This was going to test the

league leaders and the next score was also a free, this time by Ross McGarry, who took over the free taking duties in the absence of both Basquel brothers. Indeed, Ross scored six points from frees during the half and the only other scores were a point from Aran Waters after 18 minutes and the only score, a point, from Skerries on 23 minutes. Ross was also unlucky to see his penalty kick saved on 25 minutes when the home keeper guessed correctly and dived to his left. As half time approached Donagh McCabe and the referee crashed into each other with the referee ending up on the ground with a foot injury and actually blew the half time whistle while still sitting on the ground. He was attended to by the Skerries medical people during half time and, luckily, was able to resume for the second half.

Within five minutes of the restart, Skerries had scored three points from play to leave just three points between the sides. Alan Flood from play and Ross McGarry from a free had their scores cancelled out by further points by Skerries from play to maintain the three points difference with 17 minutes gone. Five minutes later Declan O'Mahony drifted in from the right wing and popped over a point from play. Despite their best efforts, Skerries were finding it difficult to break down the Boden defence. Then, on 25 minutes, one of these defenders, Bob Dwan, found himself bearing down on the Skerries goal and he finished the game as a contest when he drove the ball to the net to put 7 points between the sides. While Skerries got a point back with a pointed free, Ross McGarry pointed two further frees for Boden. Then, well into added time, Tom Hayes was rewarded for his hard work when he almost burst the net for his goal.

While Ross McGarry ended with 8 points, all from frees, a lot of the work leading to these frees was done by all of the forwards who continually ran at the Skerries defence and the home backs had no option but to foul the forward or concede a goal.

Dublin Pride Parade - 29 June 2019

You will be aware that an tUachtarán, John Horan, recently confirmed that for the first time the GAA will be officially represented at this year's Pride Parade on 29 June 2019 as part of the Dublin Pride Festival.

The occasion will enable us to join with others in showing respect and support for members of the LGBTQ+ community and follows on the supportive comments of an tUachtarán at last February's GAA Congress.

As stated at the announcement of our participation, the GAA has a huge presence in Irish life and we are committed to making a positive difference by ensuring that inclusion is prominent in how we operate. We are also in discussions on preparation of a Gender Diversity Policy document.

In the spirit of cooperation, we have invited the Camogie Association and the Ladies Gaelic Football Association to join us on the parade.

100 places have so far been allocated to us as part of the GAA section of the parade and we are anxious to get the message out to all that LGBTQ+ members of the Association are most welcome to join and participate under our banner on 29th June in Dublin.

All participants of the parade must wear the official Dublin Pride Festival wristband and the 100 participants drawn from the GAA. LGFA and Camogie must apply to us in advance so that we can issue them with the wristband and inform them as to our various arrangements on the day.

Flags, banners etc will be provided for participants who will also be expected to wear their Club or County jersey when walking in the parade.



In common with the approach adopted by similar projects elsewhere, arrangements have been made to facilitate this.


Patronage of the book involves a contribution of $\notin 200$ towards the costs of production.
