## **Senior football league v St Oliver Plunketts, Martin Savage Park, Cabra, 6 July 2019**

**Ballyboden st Endas 2 – 12**

**St Oliver Plunketts 1 – 10**

A trip to Cabra is always a tricky assignment, but, when missing more than 10 players and facing a home team that is struggling for points to survive in Division 1, it is much more dangerous. And, so it proved. Boden were first off the mark with a point from Ciarán O'Reilly after a minute followed in the next five minutes by further points from Mikey Dunne (free) and two by Tom Hayes (1 free). During this period, Plunketts were pressing hard and were kept out by resolute defending by Bob Dwan, Cian Murray and Aran Waters in the full back line. The home team did get through for two points (1 free) but then, David Hayes, supporting the play from his half back position, found himself at the end of a good move and palmed the ball to the net to give the visitors a five point lead with 10 minutes to go to half time. Plunkett's response was quick and they popped over a point from a free before carrying the ball through the Boden defence and finishing to the net to leave the minimum between the sides. Mikey Dunne and Darren O'Reilly scored from play each side of a point from Plunkett's to leave the half time score at 1 – 6 to 1 – 4. Tensions had exploded five minutes before half time with a Plunkett's corner forward getting a straight red card.

The second half started positively for the visitors with Declan O'Mahony popping over a point (with his right foot). This was cancelled out by a Plunkett's pointed free. Tom Hayes then pointed a free for Boden which was cancelled out by a point from play by the home side. After 10 minutes, following a great move by Malachy Codd (he replaced Alan Flood on 35 minutes), he passed to Ciarán O'Reilly who, in turn found Darren O'Reilly and he duly rifled to the net. Ciarán O'Reilly popped over a point which was cancelled by Plunkett's. Tempers flared again mid-way through the second half and Darragh Nelson saw red. Mikey Dunne from play and Tom Hayes (2 frees) finished the scoring for Boden while Plunkett's finished with three in response (2 frees) and they also saw another player red carded after a second yellow with five minutes to go. So, another two points were well earned to maintain our five-point lead in the league table.

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.



applications for suitable applicants who live in South Dublin County Council Administrative area either online, via post, drop in to our offices or via email.

Applicants must be living in privately owned accommodation in South Dublin County Council Administrative area. This scheme is not open to people living in rented accommodation (private, social or voluntary). A list of successful applicants will be submitted to Crothers Security Ltd. Crothers Security Ltd have won the contract to supply and fit the locks on behalf of South Dublin County Council. They will contact you to make arrangements to install the lock if your application is deemed suitable. Not all doors are suitable to have their locks replaced.
