Ballyboden St Endas continued with their drive and ambition to obtain promotion by recording an excellent win over Kilmacud Crokes in the AHL Division 3 match on Thursday 8th August in Silverpark. The final score was Crokes 1-15 Ballyboden 0-20.

This game was always going to be a tough assignment and that is how it turned out to be. Our team made a slow start and after 10 minutes play, Crokes were leading by 1-1 to 0-2 despite Boden playing with the advantage of a strong wind. However thereafter, our team played really well and hurled with great intensity. At half time the score was Boden 0-12 Crokes 1-6.

After half time, despite Crokes getting a few scores to reduce the lead, they never overtook our team. Our defence were outstanding and not only cleared their lines on many occasions but also set up scores for our forwards. In defence everyone played well, especially Karl Reddy and Darragh O'Reilly. Our midfield of Conor McKeon and Fionn Maguire worked tirelessly throughout the game. Up front, every player worked hard and once again Mark Lambert had an epic game scoring 10 points, including 2 points from side line cuts. Mattie Weldon made a big contribution by scoring 4 points.

It was an excellent victory and our next big match is on Wednesday 14th August when we play St Maurs in Rush.

Berlin GAA Win Senior European Title To Advance To Leinster Junior Championship

This October, Berlin GAA will make history when they travel to Dublin to compete in the AIB Leinster Junior Club Football Championship. The club's men's senior football team have qualified as a result of their win in the European Senior Football Championship final against Belgium GAA on July 21.

Berlin GAA became the first team in European GAA history from outside the strong Benelux and Channel Islands regions to win what is the most prestigious competition on the circuit in continental Europe.

Having won the Central/East European league for the second time in a row on June 30, Berlin GAA qualified for a European semi-final against Luxembourg GAA on Saturday, July 20. The semi-finals took place in Maastricht, the Netherlands - the location of the only regulation size 15-aside pitch in continental Europe. Belgium GAA and Eindhoven GAA contested the other semi-final.

Last year's champions, Amsterdam GAC, were beaten by Luxembourg in the quarter-final on July 6. Amsterdam represented Europe in last year's Leinster Junior Club Championship, losing narrowly to Dublin junior champions St Finian's on a 0-8 to 0-6 scoreline in Round 1.

Former European champions Luxembourg were strongly fancied in the semi-final against Berlin, but the well-prepared German side had done their homework, and with the aid of an especially strong midfield and full-forward line, swept to a 2-15 to 2-10 victory to advance to Sunday's final against Belgium.

The final was a much closer game, with Belgium every bit as hungry as Berlin to claim what would have been their first ever European senior title as well. Berlin GAA took a seven-point lead midway through the first half, but Belgium fought back strongly and by the start of the final quarter, were briefly level. However, a superb final 15 minutes from the German side saw them take the crown with a 1-15 to 1-12 victory.

Berlin GAA will now face the Longford representatives in Round 1 of the Leinster Championship on Saturday, October 26 at the GAA facilities in Abbotstown, Dublin. The winners of that game will advance to face the Kildare junior champions in the quarter-final.

Berlin GAA has several strong connections to Ballyboden St Enda's. The primary connection remains Paudie O'Neill. The Tipperary native regularly visits the German capital, and through these visits, he established a strong relationship with the club. He regularly takes hurling and camogie sessions in Berlin and through him, Berlin GAA and Ballyboden are now twinned. The club is hugely grateful to Paudie for what he has done for us.

Another prominent member of Berlin GAA is Amy Ryan, the daughter of Ballyboden stalwarts John and Angela Ryan. Amy is a member of the Berlin Ladies football and camogie teams and is also on the club committee. Our current chairperson, Julie O'Connor, is a Tipperary native but she is a first cousin of Ballyboden St Enda's very own Vivian Ruddy from Co Mayo. Another Ballyboden-Berlin connection is Jack Mahon, who played with Berlin GAA during a period of study in the city in 2017.

Berlin GAA look forward to travelling to Ireland in October and hopefully beyond for the Leinster campaign and are excited and eager to meet as many Ballyboden St Enda's club people as possible, to strengthen the ties that already exist between the clubs.

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

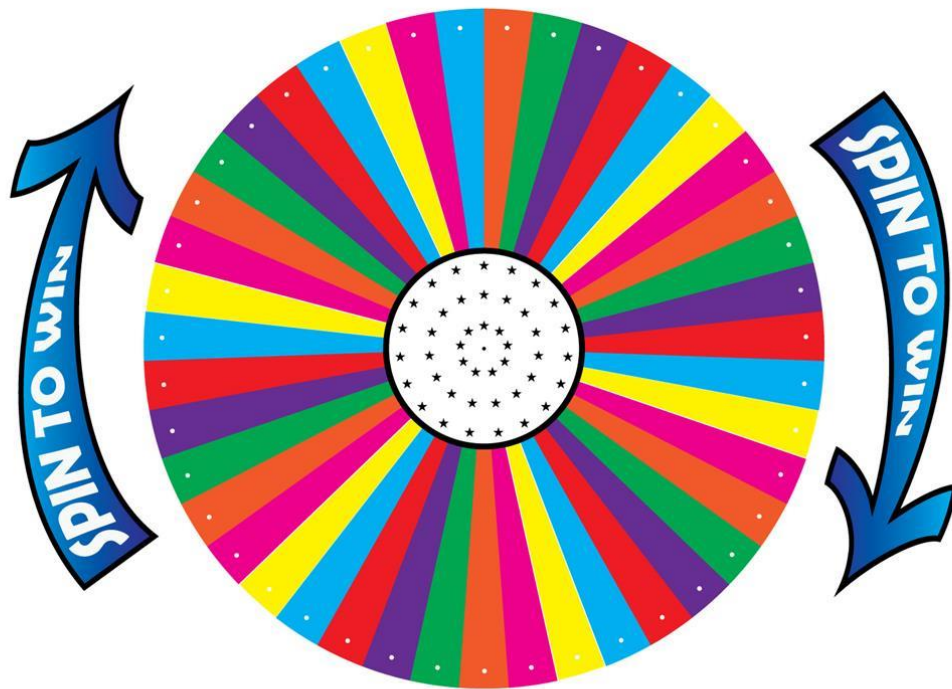
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.

The commemoration of Caoga Bliain Ag Fás will continue throughout the year with the following forthcoming events:

Ladies Football Committee: 24th August 2019. Adult players social evening.

Mass for Deceased Members: Saturday 31st August 2019.

A review of the list of Deceased Members with a view to ensuring that in time people will remember who these members were in the Club as opposed to being just names on a list is taking place. In this context a record of the deceased person's role in the Club e.g. mentor, player, administrator, spouse of member etc. and the date or year of death will be maintained. We also want to ensure that all deceased members, in so far as we can, are included on the list. An Open Air Mass/Ecumenical Service is planned for 31st August 2019 to remember all deceased members. There are currently 200 people on the list. We will be inviting relatives of our deceased members to the event and to refreshments afterwards in the Clubhouse.

Club History Book: Launch. Quarter 4 2019.

The club history will reflect on the lead into, and on the past 50 years from the club's foundation to becoming, as it is today, the largest GAA Club in the world. The history will document the threads and characteristics that created the merger of three clubs, Ballyboden Wanderers, Rathfarnham St. Endas and St. Josephs to become Ballyboden St. Endas GAA Club. It will also include the Bros. Pearce Club and details of camogie in the area. The strong tradition of expansion, our sense of good organisation and our very high standards, all of which are very well recognised throughout the wider GAA family will be highlighted. The Club's Roll of Honour including managers and mentors from 1969 to 2018 has been updated for inclusion and this is published on the Club's notice board with a view to avoiding errors or omissions.
