## Senior football championship quarter final v Na Fianna in Parnell Park on 12 October 2019



#### Ballyboden St Endas 3 – 15 Na Fianna 1 – 15 What a gama What a finish

What a game. What a finish.

This was always going to the stiffest test the senior team had encountered for some time. And, so it proved. Na Fianna is a team of young players, most with inter-county experience. With just a minute gone, Na Fianna had a point on the board. Collie Basquel cancelled this out quickly. Na Fianna then added two more points (1 free) but Ryan Basquel and Ross McGarry replied for Boden. Ross, actually, went for a goal but has rasper of a shot cleared the cross bar. So, with less than 10 minutes gone it was three points each and all indications were that this was going to go down to the wire. Na Fianna restored their advantage again with two points in quick succession, but Boden stayed in touch when Ross McGarry pointed. Then, we all held our breath as Darren O'Reilly bore down on goal, but the Na Fianna defender made a great save. Two more points by Na Fianna were cancelled out by Ryan Basquel but Na Fianna finished the half with another point to leave them two points clear as the half time whistle sounded with the score 0 - 6 to 0 - 8.

Boden got out of the blocks quickly in the second and had three points scored within eight minutes from the boots of Collie Basquel (free), Declan O'Mahony and Ross McGarry. Na Fianna equalised with a pointed 45. Collie Basquel restored the one-point lead for Boden but Na Fianna equalised again and then went a point ahead. Conal Keaney equalised for Boden and, after pressure was applied to the Na Fianna goalie, a free was awarded to Boden which Ryan Basquel converted. One point up again, halfway through the second half. The next five minutes saw Na Fianna push for glory when they scored two points and then a cracker of a goal to put them four points up with 8 minutes left. This would test the character of our team and the players responded in admirable style. Ryan Basquel pointed from a free, but Na Fianna responded with a point – still four points between the sides. Still no panic!!! Then, when a high ball came into the Na Fianna area, Tom Hayes rose highest to palm the ball into the path of Collie Basquel who finished to the net. So, with just a point between the sides and normal time up, hearts were pounding as the players still showed great patience in their

attacks. With four minutes of added time played, a 45 was awarded to Boden. Up steps Darragh Gogan, and while most of the management and supporters held their breath, Darragh coolly popped over this pressure kick to leave the sides level and extra time needed to separate the sides.

Boden failed to score in the first period of extra time while Na Fianna scored one point. The game could have been put beyond Boden as half time approached when Na Fianna broke from defence and found two forwards against Boden's one defender. However, as the Na Fianna forward shot for goal, Robbie McDaid appeared from nowhere to execute an excellent block down and save a certain goal.

Na Fianna failed to score in the second period of extra time, but, crucially, Boden, or should I say, Collie Basquel, scored 2 goals and a point. The point came in the first minute. The goals came later. Firstly, with four minutes gone, a ball was delivered into Tom Hayes who was challenged by the Na Fianna goalie. The ball broke loose and Tom managed to poke it through to Collie Basquel who finished to the net. Then with time almost up, James Holland carried the ball out of defence and passed to Michael Darragh Macauley who passed to Collie Basquel and he made no mistake and blasted to the net. Game over.

After a weekend of spectacular thrilling Boden performances the intermediates can only claim that a polished workmanlike performance took the team over the line in Páirc Ciceam on Saturday afternoon. This was a squad that was re-visiting the scene of last year's championship exit at the the same stage against the same opponents. In contrast to last year Boden were coming off a credible league campaign whereas Kickhams were toiling in the lower reaches of Division 3. With such a backdrop the expectation was high but was tempered with a degree of caution as Kickhams have been a bogey team over the years.

With an almost complete panel to select from the omens were positive. The only real changes were the introduction of Naoise Maguire for his brother Fionn and the return of Mikey Dunne to a starting position in the place of John McGinn. Otherwise the team remained similar to that which played in the latter part of the season. The pitch was soft but in great condition after a night of heavy rain.

The home team opened the scoring in the second minute and it Boden a further 5 minutes to equalise from the boot of Ruairi Kirwan. In between Boden had a number of wides and had dropped the ball short also.

Davy Hayes tagged on a second point which was responded to by Kickhams in the 11th minute. Boden then reeled off three points in a row from Archie (2) and from Ciaran. Mun again responded with a point. A Mikey point pushed Boden further ahead but this was answered by 2 points for the home team. It was neck and neck with neither team managing to exert any dominance. Before the half ended Liamo and Archie secured another couple only for Mun to notch two of their own. At the break it was 8 - 7 to Boden. Memories of the first half include some excellent goalkeeping by Mark as well as pin-point accurate kick-outs to Archie.

The second half opened with both teams trading points before Mikey and Ruairi widened the margin to three points. Boden were now beginning to exert some dominance and were duly rewarded in the 13th minute with a goal from Cian Bates after a great pass from Liamo to Ciaran who rounded his defender to set-up Cian. Mun found themselves 6 points in arrears and committed themselves to all out attack. This left space for the Boden attack who seized the opportunity and converted goals from the boots of Davy and Luke as well as a couple of points from impressive Ronan and Ruairi. The home team had no answer other than a late free as Boden ran out comfortable winners.

Best wishes to Sam Lally who will be out of action for the next few weeks.



### Lazarus Lambert brings Boden back

Gizmo reports from Minor Hurling Championship semi-final

Goalkeeper Jack Lambert's stunning 21 yard "Green Flag raising" free was the catalyst that brought the Minor A hurlers back from the brink to seal a place in the 2019 County Championship Final. "We got out of jail there", remarked spectator Declan Maguire who has hurling running through his veins along with dangerously high levels of saturated fat. The favourites tag weighed heavily on this great group of young lads as they took on Castleknock, in the semi-final of the Minor A hurling championship. "We have high standards and expectations from this team and sometimes nerves can be a factor, but I have great admiration for the way they turned it around", reflected mentor Johnny Kenny after a roller coaster game in PUM on Sunday last.

Early points were traded between the teams and the stage was set for a cracking game of hurling. But the tide went out on Boden's challenge after marks-man Adam Kelleher had to leave the field through injury after just 10 minutes. While Boden re-organised, Castleknock pressed and a great piece of individual skill led to their opening goal of the game. Castleknock never looked back after that, they hunted in packs, were first to most 50 / 50 balls and won an inordinate amount of secondary possessions. Trailing 1-9 to 0-3 after 28

minutes, this piece was looking like an obituary rather than a match report. But wing forward Cian Corcoran (and umpire Daragh Monahan) had different ideas, while chasing down what looked like a lost cause, Cian drove the sliotar over the whitewash and hopefully turned down the volume on the "Bollicking" that was about to be delivered at half time. Trailing 1-9 to 1-3 at the break, we'll just leave it there about that half of hurling.

O'Donnell, Cashman and Ryan began to take control of the middle third while O'Dwyer took over free taking duties Slotting over point numbers 5 and 6, the comeback was on. The back line of Donaghy, Maguire and Mulligan-Lynch were turning over ball and reducing Castleknock to scraps but there was still a mountain to climb. Fergal Ryan and Luke Mulligan-Lynch's ability to carry the ball out of defence and support the forwards was exactly the platform that was required. "Sean O'Donnell at wing back was exceptional", commented mentor Emmet Carroll, "he like a Werther's Original, silky and smooth to look at but if you're not careful, will break your teeth ". During a period of intense pressure, half forward Kenny, with no regard for his own personal safety, put in a flying block to turn over the ball again. He had to leave the field after an almighty blow to the head from the "Follow through" but it epitomised the true spirit of this team. The introduction of Davy Keogh sparked new life into the forward line, he's the only lad I know that would beat you 1 on 1 in a phone box. His off the ball running, and enthusiasm instilled a dark fear into the Castleknock defence, which Ryan O'Dwyer was only too happy to exploit. Plucking a ball from the sky with hands dipped in Bostick (that's a glue, by the way) O'Dwyer turned and buried the sliotar into the top corner. Now only a point behind with 10 minutes left, the impossible was beginning to look possible.

After another scorching point from play by O'Dwyer, he latched on to an inch perfect pass from Cian Hassett to raise Boden's 4th green flag of the morning. Further points from Rhys McDonnell and Cian Corcoran gave Boden a three-point cushion in the dying embers of normal time. But Castleknock weren't giving up without a fight and staged a mini comeback of their own. Cutting a long story short, deep into injury time, Castleknock ended up with a 21-yard free with only one option available. 'Keeper Lambert ordered his own players out of his area, opting for the minimum of 4 teammates and himself to face off the inevitable. As it turns out, he didn't need the other 4, choosing to pull off a fantastic save himself and, in the ensuing melee, taking a kick to the head in an effort to defend his goal. "That was enough for me" said Mum, first aider, dog walker, physio, chef and general voice of reason in the management team, Linda O'Donnell, "I thought it was over and I just couldn't believe it when they got another opportunity with the very last puck of the game." After a questionable "foul" (the Boden defender is claiming that he was backed into!!!!) on the Castleknock and Dublin dual star Luke Swan, they had one more opportunity, this time from a more difficult angle.

Lambert set up the goal mouth with the same 4 "Token" players and pulled off another stunning save. Game Over.

The sense of relief from the Boden faithful was tangible, "I never doubted it for a minute", quipped parent Maurice Sweeney, "when Jack [Lambert] buried that free, Castleknock sensed danger and our boys exploited it. In fairness, Boden played some incredible hurling and scored 3-3 in a 12-minute spell of dominance." which is an incredibly insightful commentary from a Donegal man, surprised even me to be honest. Mentor Brendan Ryan said, "Castleknock didn't blow it, we won it. Yes, we had a wobble, but these lads have a character and and wisdom way beyond their years."

A special mention to the under 16 hurlers Davy Keogh and Rhys McDonnell, whose contribution to the spectacle was outstanding. Also, to A & E regulars Adam Kelleher, Paddy Dunleavy and Conor Lowe, look after yourselves lads, you have five weeks to get back to full health for the County Final (sounds good, doesn't it).

Finally, please note that the mentor's weekly game of Monopoly has been cancelled as the Get Out of Jail card is missing.....

Well done to our U14B hurlers who won promotion to Division 3 following a 3:09 to 3:08 win over Brigids at Cherryfield on Saturday.







# **Concussion Management**



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
