**Senior football championship, semi-final v St Judes
in Parnell Park, 26 October 2019**

The “Dodder Derby” proved to be a fascinating contest between near neighbours that went right down to the wire. Judes wasted no time in getting on the scoreboard and had a point scored in the first minute. This was quickly followed by a goal and Boden knew that it was in for a hard fight to reach the county final. It took Boden five minutes to register its first score, a point by Ross McGarry. Judes cancelled this out and then a quickly taken free by Ryan Basquel found Darren O’Reilly and he blasted to the net. Boden found it hard to gain possession whereas Judes seemed capable of knocking over points at will and knocked over six points (2 frees) to Boden’s one in the remaining 20 minutes with just a solitary pointed free by Ryan Basquel to leave it 1 – 2 to 1 – 8 at half time and a mountain to climb in the second half, albeit with the aid of a breeze on our backs.

The second half started in a more positive note for Boden with Darragh Gogan knocking over a 45 after three minutes. However, Judes quickly cancelled this out. There then followed a purple patch for Boden with four points in a row from Declan O’Mahony, Darren O’Reilly and Collie Basquel (2 frees) to leave just two pints between the sides and over 15 minutes still left on the clock. Judes got one back from a free to restore their three-point advantage and now just 10 minutes remaining. Boden were still working hard and showing great patience in the build up and Collie Basquel scored a point from a free after a foul on Aran Waters. Then the big breakthrough. After huge pressure was applied to the Judes defence, the ball broke to Ryan Basquel. He passed to Collie Basquel who played a wonderful one two with Michael Darragh Macauley and Collie finished to the net from a tight angle, putting Boden in front for the first time with six minutes remaining. With the clock running down, Collie and Ryan Basquel knocked over two more points from play and we dared to dream

that a county final place might be waiting. As we entered added time, Jude's tried to break down the Boden defence but without success. Great credit is due to all of the Boden defenders, but no one will forget the tremendous fair shoulder by Shane Clayton on a Jude's player which resulted in him losing possession of the ball and another dangerous attack was repelled. The final whistle was greeted with enormous relief and celebrations and preparations now start for the second "Dodder Derby" against Thomas Davis.

Intermediate championship semi final

Ballyboden made their way through to the final of the Intermediate All County championship last Saturday 26th October after a narrow victory over Na Fianna's second team. This was a victory borne of hard work, craft and no small amount of skill. Na Fianna being the Division

2 outfit would have been favourites to progress but any chance there was of Boden following the script were dispelled in the first half of this gripping encounter.

Boden started the game in Blakestown with the aid of a stiff breeze and were encouraged by a good Boden following sitting in the stand. The pitch was immaculate despite the heavy rainfall the previous day.

From the outset it was apparent that the teams were evenly matched and it took all of eight minutes for the first score to be registered. It came from the boot of Mikey Dunne who went on to keep the Boden scoreboard ticking over for the day. Na Fianna responded almost immediately before Boden went on to score 1-2 on the trot. The goal came from a poor kick out that was gathered and fed to John McGinn who calmly slotted the ball home.

With the aid of the wind Boden were applying all the pressure and creating chaos in their opponents defence. The big men around the middle put all sorts of pressure on the Na Fianna kick-outs. On one of Na Fianna's forays forward a speculative long ball fell kindly to an attacker who drove the ball to the back of Mark's net. Mark had earlier made a fine save but this time the shot was placed beyond his reach. Boden finished the half with a few more points and led 1-8 to 1-1 at the break.

Because of the wind it was going to be a game of two halves and Na Fianna set their stall straight from the throw-in with a blistering attack that eventually yielded nothing. They eventually started knocking over points to reduce the lead but Boden kept plugging away and answered with points that held Na Fianna at bay. Mark was called into action on a couple of occasions and responded magnificently.

Despite the pressure the Boden defence was resolute in its purpose. Led by Scott and ably abetted by the Maguires, Fergal and Karl they continued to hold firm. Johnny met every challenge with purpose and offered the same going forward.

In the middle the towering presence of Luke, Ev and Liam offered reliable targets for Mark who pinged some precision arrows in their direction. The same three troubled the Na Fianna keeper who eventually resorted to short kicks to avoid the unfair lottery in the middle.

Up front the threat was carried to Na Fianna by Mikey and John Mc with industrious support from other team mates. The introduction of Chill midway through the half restored the ball retention element of our game and calmed a few nerves. Jamesie also entered the fray to add to the "experience" on the pitch.

After five minutes of injury time the referee finally blew the whistle to signal a historic victory for the Boden boys on a scoreline of 1-10 to 1-7.

It has been a magnificent season for this intermediate panel led by Scott and the irrepressible Evan. On the line Wally Durkin and Daire Walsh have engineered a transformation from which the entire squad has benefitted. The sage-like contribution of our Boden man exiled in Kildare, Mick Maher has won the minds of the players. Without them the journey would not have been possible. Let's give it one last push to reach our destination on Saturday 2nd November.

The match took place out on Lucan's main pitch at 12th Lock with great support from both sides on a lovely crisp autumn morning with the pitch holding up well after the week's rain.

Ballyboden dominated the early exchanges with lovely neat interplay resulting in an early point from Shauna Feely after great retention of the ball and patience from the forwards. The Boden domination continued and they could have been further ahead by the time they finally got their reward with a goal from Aine Rafter. After more pressure, Lucan conceded a penalty which was slotted home coolly by Shauna to give Boden a decent lead after 15 minutes. Lucan started to get into the game and got their first point to the delight of their home support. Boosted by this they broke again and would have netted only for a superb save from Boden keeper Karyn Burke.

Boden were still playing the better football and scored another point after great link up play between Megan Deignan and Kate Donaghy in moving the ball the length of the field and supplying Caoimhe O'Sullivan for the finish. However Lucan were starting to exert more pressure and after a couple of points they got a bit of luck with a goal looping into the Boden net.

Lucan came out strong in the second half, buoyed by the fact that they were only 2 points

behind after being outplayed for most of the first half. They scored an early free to reduce the gap to 1 but Boden continued to push and got 2 more points from frees from Aine. Then Lucan got the breakthrough they were looking for with a goal to level the match. This started a 10 minute period where Lucan dominated and the girls in blue defending for their lives. Lucan racked up another 1-2 in this period including a 2nd penalty of the day and with a 5 point lead they started to believe that the cup was coming their way.

However these Boden girls are not to be underestimated as they are made of strong stuff! With leaders across the pitch, they dug deep and started to take the game again to Lucan. A 3rd penalty was confidently dispatched by Kate Donaghy and then after a moment of indiscipline saw a Lucan player red-carded, the Boden girls really started to dominate. A great passage of play saw another score from Kate from a tight angle and then a deflected shot from Leah Cunningham saw Boden retake the lead. As the clock ticked into the red, another goal from Sarah Gleeson gave Boden a seemingly unassailable lead of 5 points. A late goal from Lucan set up a nervous finish but the Boden girls hung on and after 7 minutes of injury time the final whistle blew to give the girls their deserved victory – this a 3rd Championship in a row for this super group of girls. Joint captains Emmajane Weir and Aine Rafter collected the cup on behalf of their teammates from County Chairperson Joe Keane and graciously complimented their opponents on a hard fought game.

Laura Rourke made a crucial contribution to win a number of balls at a vital time. The defence was turned into attack with great probing runs from Megan Deignan, Megan Dignam and Caoimhe O'Sullivan. There was also an immense contribution down the spine of the team with Leonie Power, Alice Rudden and Ella Reid turning over Lucan on a number of occasions to turn the tide in the game. Then in attack, all of the hard work in training paid off as the forward unit of Shauna Feely, Aine Rafter, Kate Donaghy, Leah Cunningham, Hannah Byrne and Sarah Gleeson made and converted the chances. Also not forgetting Elly Rogers and Ella McNair both out injured but out to support their teammates.

Overall a fitting end to a great year with ups and downs along the way but ultimately a League and Cup double to show for their efforts. To cap it all, the night ended with medal presentations in the clubhouse from Club Chairman Ciaran Maguire and, fresh from starring in Parnell Park, Collie Basquel to the delight of the girls!

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
