With a place in the league final up for grabs against Ballymun Kickhams, it was important to keep our unbeaten run intact. With a lot of first team players not available due to injury or being rested, the depth of the squad would be tested. Tom Hayes took over the frees from the left and had a point on the board from a free in the first minute. Lucan replied with two points from play in the 7 and 19 minutes before Warren Egan restored parity a minute later. While scores were hard to come by in the first 20 minutes, the next 10 were more generous. Lucan went four points up with a goal and a point in the space of 2 minutes. This was putting it up to the home team and they duly responded. Tom Hayes scored twice from frees but Lucan got one back from a free. Then three points in a row from play from Conal Keaney, Tom Hayes and Alan Flood brought the sides level as the half time whistle blew. The second half started with Ross McGarry and Collie Basquel coming off the bench. Ross popped over a point after five minutes followed quickly by Alan Flood when he fisted over. Warren Egan then powered his way through the defence and finished to the back of the net. Collie Basquel converted two frees to put Boden 7 points ahead approaching the mid-way point of the half. The visitors got a point back and were awarded a penalty which they duly converted to bring the lead back to three points. The home team were then awarded a penalty and Warren Egan popped over for a point. Lucan cancelled this out to leave just three points between the sides. With time running out, and the home goalmouth under pressure, the ball was cleared to Kieran Kennedy who carried the ball up the right wing. He spotted Conal Keaney all alone in front of goal and duly found him. Although he was being tackled by a Lucan defender, Conal managed to get a shot off past the goalkeeper to put six points between the sides and the final whistle sounded shortly afterwards.

This was a match that gave some of the extended panel members an opportunity to show management that they were available for selection for the Leinster semi-final. Many of the players put their hands up, none more so than Cian Murray at corner back. It is now on to Mullingar on Sunday next for the Leinster semi-final against Garrycastle. U13 Boys Reflect On Successful Year of Hurling and Football.



As the year draws to a close, all of those involved with the U13 boys hurling and football can look back at the past 12 months with a sense of achievement and pride. Close to 90 boys are registered with this group and all have been active participants at training and matches throughout the year. Five football and three hurling teams were assembled to compete in the pre-season grading games and subsequently in their allocated divisions. At times it was a stretch to field a full complement of teams due to boys being away on any particular weekend or for those carrying injuries. Nevertheless, we never failed to fulfill our obligations and always provided the required numbers to play a full match. The large number of teams also ensured that all boys got maximum playing time, rather than spending time on the sideline. It is a great credit to all of the boys that they were willing to be subbed off at any stage without complaint. We also acknowledge the dedication of many boys who, when numbers were short, lined out for extra matches on the same day. It has always been our philosophy that, irrespective of ability, there is suitable team for every boy who wants to play. This has helped develop great camaraderie and teamwork among the boys.

It is also a great source of pride for the coaches to see a large number of boys move up through the ranks in line with their improving ability and commitment. It was always our intention to facilitate the boys moving between teams so that they could be challenged at higher levels. All of the hurling panel played in the top team either in the league or challenge matches, and it is clear that this has helped develop their core skills and game awareness. In football, Teams 1 & 3 changed the squad regularly with 72 players collectively rotating through these teams, aided by a constant supply of developing talent from Teams 2, 4 & 5.

The three hurling teams competed in Divisions 1, 3 & 6 and all competed very strongly finishing comfortably in the top half of their respective tables. The progression of hurling skills in each group has been particularly notable and there is little doubt that we now have the strongest panel of U13 hurlers in Dublin. There were 12 boys selected to play in the U14 hurling Feile and all showed that they were more than a match for the older boys. The five football teams competed in Divisions 1, 4, 5, 7 & 9 and all put in great performances throughout the year with credible final positions achieved in the league tables. There was great team spirit shown among the footballers and hurlers and they showed great commitment to grind out victories when all seemed lost. In one notable football match at the Hermitage involving Team 3, they were down by 10 points at half-time against a very determined team from Lucan, with only a record hammering to look forward to! In the second half, the boys strode out like giants, clawed their way back into the game, and through sheer effort won the match with a last minute goal. With the grin of victory shining brightly, the lead coach remarked that it reminded us all as to why we play the sport!

Other notable highlights of the year included the trip to Waterford by the hurling boys for a match against the mighty Ballygunner, with an excellent and informative side visit to the Waterford fire station and a spot of surfing on Tramore beach. On a warm Saturday in early June, the hurling boys also competed in the annual PJ Troy competition organised by Whitehall Colmcilles and later that month participated in the junior Poc Fada at Cherryfield. The football boys played many tough challenge matches and also spent a fantastic weekend in Tralee competing in the Austin Stacks Lee Strand invitational football tournament.

The boys have much to look forward to in 2020. This is their year of Feile competition, it is their coming of age and the opportunity to showcase all they have learned since back to the days when they turned out for the Academy. It will be a very exciting time in their sporting lives and is something we all look forward to. All of the coaches want to express their sincerest thanks to all of the parents and guardians who helped with the smooth running of the U13 squad during the year. It is also through their efforts and commitment that we managed to field full teams each week. We all look forward to more of the same in 2020. Well done to all the U13 boys!



Concussion Management




Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
