Garrycastle were first off the mark with a point from a free in the first minute. Boden took over then with Collie Basquel pointing a free followed by a great goal by Robbie McDaid when he raced through the home defence and finished to the net with his left foot. Further points by Collie Basquel (2), Alan Flood and Ross McGarry put the side 7 points up with just 11 minutes gone. Garrycastle got two points back but during this period Warren Egan had a good goal chance and Ross McGarry's shot for a point hit the top of the post and was adjudged to have gone over the post and therefore was waved wide. With 10 minutes left, Ryan Basquel fired over three points from play, one with his less favoured right foot while Alan Flood and Ross McGarry also pointed. Garrycastle got two points back in this period, leaving the half time score at 1-10 to 0-5.

An 8-point lead at this stage looked fairly safe as the second half commenced but Garrycastle

started positively and converted three frees in the first five minutes to bring the lead down to five points. Robbie McDaid raised the siege with a surging run forward before laying the ball off to Ross McGarry who pointed. Garrycastle cancelled this out with another free but Robbie McDaid then broke through again and took his own point. Darren O'Reilly added to this score before Darragh Gogan made a great save to keep Garrycastle from reducing the lead to four points. Garrycastle missed the resultant 45 but soon after Darragh was called on again to make another great save which he turned over the bar. With 7 minutes left on the clock, Collie Basquel scored a goal to give the team and supporters some breathing space. James Holland came off the bench and, after a pass from Sean Gibbons, James burst through and finished with a rocket to the net and finished the game as a contest. Garrycastle did manage two more points, one free and the other a save by Darragh Gogan when he knocked the ball over the bar as it was dipping into the goal. Conal Keaney finished the Boden scoring with a pointed free.

MAGNIFICENT ST. MARY'S WALTZ PAST MARINO









From 8am on the morning of Tuesday 22nd October 2019 the excitement on the Grange Road was palpable. It was no ordinary school day as the boys prepared for another trip to Jones' Road across the city. The team were given a great send off by Mr Edward O' Riordain, ably assisted by coaches Mr Don O'Neill and Mr Fearghal Duffy.

"Something inside so strong" performed superbly by the school choir complemented an earlier performance from Mr Lyons' trad band. Donnacha on the drums set the tempo for the day as the St. Mary's team received the traditional guard of honour from the Junior classes as they nervously made their way to the team bus.

Later that afternoon around 12.10 p.m. they had shaken off the nerves and took the game to Marino from the very start. They faced fierce resistance from a strong Marino midfield diamond but in truth the Rathfarnham boys were stronger all over the field.

They had built up a resilience after a tough qualifying route where St Pius, Drimnagh Castle, Ballyroan Boys, Lucan BNS and a gallant St. Colmcilles were defeated along the way.

Goalkeeper Conor Fitzgerald saved his best performance for the big stage keeping a clean sheet. The full back line of Tariq Almasry, Ben Sheahan and Mark Power repelled attack after attack. Cillian Noonan, Conor Quigley and the rugged Riagan Dunne got to grips with a lively Marino half forward line.

Josh Mooney was "Darragh O'Shea" esque as he galloped up the middle on several occasions. Jack Cooney, back from injury hammered home a rasping shot to the roof of the Marino net at a crucial early stage.

Seán Homan (son of Darren) played a captain's part from centre forward adding a second Corn Kitterick medal to his haul from a previous Croker visit in October 2017. ChisomChime seemed to pop up everywhere and capped a brilliant season with a personal tally of 1-3. Rory Curry belied his tender years by winning lots of possession and setting up wave after wave of attack. Zach Grady was an ideal target man and kicked an excellent score off his left.

Alan Delaney, the four-goal hero of the semi-final, finished off the goal of the game just after half time and in truth Marino never recovered. Eoin Dennehy who also had a terrific Corn Kitterick campaign kicked a beauty over the bar.

Leon Ceighton, a late addition to the panel expertly slotted home two late goals. Evan Brady used his physical presence very well all season and had a fine second half. Gavin Fusco who also improved with every game of the campaign, contributed well when introduced. Donal Manzorand Luke Duggan tasted Croke Park action late on and never shirked responsibility once introduced.

Late replacements of kitmen Seán Lloyd and Louis Smith capped a great team effort, expertly managed by Don O'Neill (enjoying his second Corn Kitterick win in three years) and Fearghal Duffy (himself a Corn Kitterick winner with the school back in 2003, even if it was called the Sweet Afton Cup back then!)



Concussion Management




Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
