The Ballyboden Senior B Ladies team made the long trip to Dingle to compete in the Lidl Comortas Peile Páidí Ó Sé 2020. Having won the Junior competition in Dingle in 2019, the team were looking forward to defending the trophy and a weekend of football and fun.

It rained non stop on Friday and there was concern about pitches being playable on the Saturday but locals assured us the games would be going ahead as the weather had not stopped the games in the previous 30 years of the competition.

After a “quiet night” in Paul Geaney's pub on Friday we were well rested and prepared for a full day of football on Saturday. The weather had improved and the incessant rain had given way to occasional showers. We were based in the Gaeltacht GAA club grounds in Gallarus further west on the Dingle peninsula.

The games were played on a smaller pitch so we played 11 aside with roll on and off subs.

In our first game, we were drawn against West Kerry team Ballymacelligott. Our Captain for the weekend Laura Basquel won the toss and elected to play with the strong wind (the wind is always strong in Galaras). We got some early scores and took control of the game and ran out easy winners 6:12 to 0:02.

In the second game we were up against another Kerry team, Castlegregory / Annascaul. Again we won the toss and played with the wind. The team played some excellent football with slick interchange passes and well executed scores.

Highlights of the game was a hat trick of goals by Shauna Maher, 4 points from midfield by Eimear Duffy, a brilliantly taken point by cornerback Rachel Basquel and a cracker of a goal by Aoife O Toole following a fine passing move in which almost every Ballyboden player was involved.

In the final we faced Breaffy from Mayo. They had beaten Dingle in their group stages, a team who had given us a tough game last year. This time we started off playing against the wind but Ballyboden started brilliantly. Our score at half time was 4:04 to 0:03. We took the foot off the gas a little in the second half but finished out the game comfortable winners.

A rare sight, the sun, greeted a decent gathering of supporters at a windy Sancta Maria (all-weather surface) on Sunday morning last for the opening round of the hurling league, division 4. The initial speculation centred around the appearance (or otherwise) for our Palmerstown visitors of star Dublin hurler Liam Rushe, but he was central to the warm-up and donned his familiar number eleven jersey. This sight was greeted with a modicum of excitement by the audience, some of whom may have been concerned that if the star man was to be given sufficient room, that the home defence might fold like a cheap suit. That this did not happen was due to a solid showing by the Boden back seven. Centre-back Fergal Ryan did enough over the hour to deserve the accolade of MVP for Boden, but he was ably supported by Des O'Sullivan and the tenacious Andy Hand.

Morgan Ryan opened the Boden tally with a neat strike, but this was overturned by a quick brace for the visitors, the second by Rushe after he accepted an assist from the imposing Dave O'Hanlon. The sides levelled up when the evergreen Aiden Dundon pointed the first of his day's tally, after Daniel Nugent worked a clever ball to his grasp. The home side were dealt an immediate blow when a vicious ball-bounce in the Boden square was not cleared, leaving O'Hanlon with the easiest of tasks in tapping to the net. Boden responded immediately with a superb goal from a tight angle by Daniel O'Riordan and again a point from Dundon, re-visiting his glory days at Sarsfields, although lacking his youthful movement. Ryan opened a Boden lead of three points from a 65, followed by a share of a brace of frees by Rushe and Dundon. 1.06 to 1.03.

Into the second quarter Boden's combinations were working better than the visitors, and Eoin McKenna with a classy point and solid work by Chris Lambert made the task of playing into a 'four-point wind' look manageable. O'Riordan struck again as well as Lambert, making up for an earlier missed goal opportunity. Pats kept in touch with points from Rushe and a beauty from O'Hanlon. Half time had the scores at 1.09 to 1.07.

Talk on the rail was mainly about the Dublin loss to Wexford the previous evening and the generally held view articulated by commentator Marty Morrissey that the performance was as much about the referee as it was about the hurling. 'Shocko' was not slow in offering some explanation for the Limerick 'whistler's' persistent blowing, suggesting that the referee coming from a football area may have contributed to the high tally of frees given.

The second half opened with Boden taking over in the scoring stakes. Morgan fed Dundon....point, Ciaran Cashman moved into good positions and notched the first of three

points, and again Dundon landed a fine effort. Lambert raided into the Pats square and came away with a goal.....game as good as over.....score 2.14 to 1.08. Ryan and the increasingly imposing Lambert added to the Boden tally, only to be checked back by Rushe with his goal from a penalty. In defence Boden's Des O'Sullivan stood tall and commanded the rear-guard with authority, but his best was no match for a superb Pats goal from Brain Mooney after two triangular movements worked a treat. The visitors now stripped their defence placing centre-back Graham Kelly upside with Rushe in search of more goals. At the other end, Boden's forwards went on the same goal mission and Ciaran McDonald along with Ruairi MacMahuna hit the onion-sack for Boden. In between Cashman pointed a fine contribution, capping an accomplished second-half performance.

Dan Boland and his mentors will be well pleased with this solid team showing and will hope to build on it towards the group championship stages later in the spring.

Skerries Harp out of tune with Bullish Boden

Being so far up into north County Dublin, this game could easily have carried the tag of being an International. "I have kept my petrol and toll receipts." said the notoriously tight-fisted Liam O'Dwyer, the new manager of the 2020 Minor A footballers. He went on to say, "Do you think I could claim a lunch allowance as well." When pushed on matters football he said, "We have a good bunch of lads and we will try and give everyone substantial game time throughout the league." He added, "Skerries is a difficult place to come to, so let's see how the group get on with their first taste of competitive Division 1 football. It is about the first-year minors adapting to the pace and physicality of the game and how the overall team dynamic works out".

With 7 first year minors in the starting 15, the team looked like they were playing together for years as they raced into an early lead. Aided by a wind stiffer than Jack Nolan's wallet clasp, the Boden lads battled hard and laid siege to the Skerries goal. Ryan O'Dwyers' nerve settling 2-2 laid the platform for a dominant first half. A blistering 15 minutes spell saw Luke Mulligan Lynch add 1-1 and Luke Byrne 1-2 to the score board. David Kane and Evan Welsh capitalised on the hard graft of the midfield duo of Harry Colcough and Michael McDonald jnr., whose father still dons the Boden Jersey for the Junior C's, (an inspiration to the rest of his friends in the Active Retirement group). Leading 4-9 to 1-3 at half time, mutterings of "That's a ten-point wind...." and other such trivial statements could be heard rumbling through the travelling Boden support.

On the way to the dressing room we caught up with Andy Kerins, the team's skill's coach, he said, "O'Dwyer stiffed me for half the petrol money on the way out here, fifty bleedin' Euro. There were only fumes in the tank." When asked for a reaction to the game, he said, "I am happy with how things are working out. We will make a few changes now and give everyone a good run."

The introduction of fresh legs gave Boden a new impetus as they bagged the opening score of the second half, a cracking goal from the boot of Eoin Behan. Tireless work from Long, Donaghy, Leahy and O'Sullivan attempted to stem the tide of Skerries attacks. As they grew in confidence, Boden just needed to get their hands on the ball and build from the back. And that they did with a seasoned professionalism, patient build up's with off the shoulder running created multiple opportunities for the inside forwards to put this tie to bed.

Running out winners on a score line of 5-11 to 2-10, this was a bright start from a team that is still finding its feet. "Apart from the score line, what impressed me the most was the honesty and work rate from the lads. A team is nothing without a solid work ethic." said Jack Donaghy who, along with being O'Dwyer's personal financial adviser, is also a key member of the coaching ticket. "We still have a lot to work on, me especially, as I have to get Liam's expenses claim lodged by 5pm."

Next game is Sunday 8th March at home to Kilmacud Crokes.

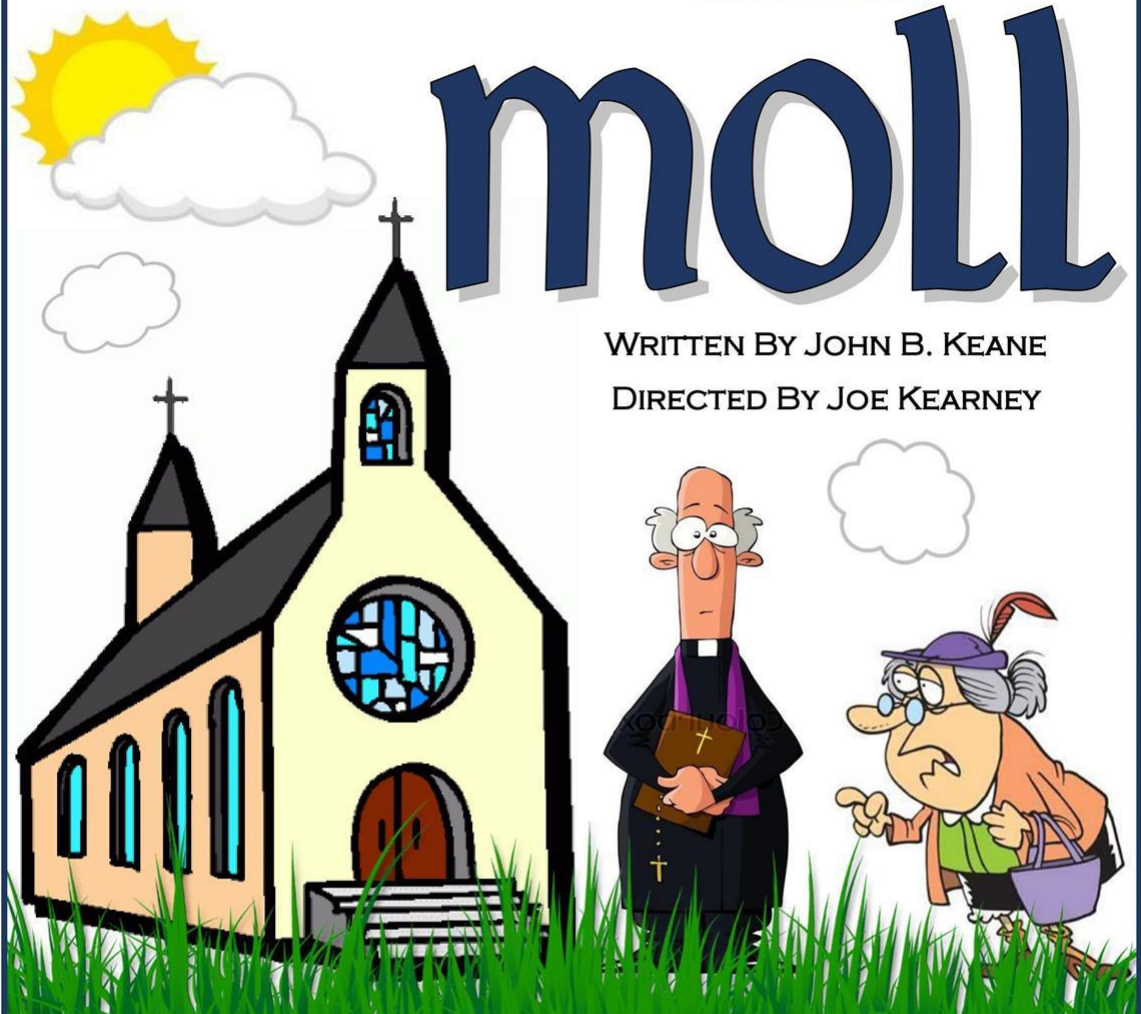
Club Membership 2020

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

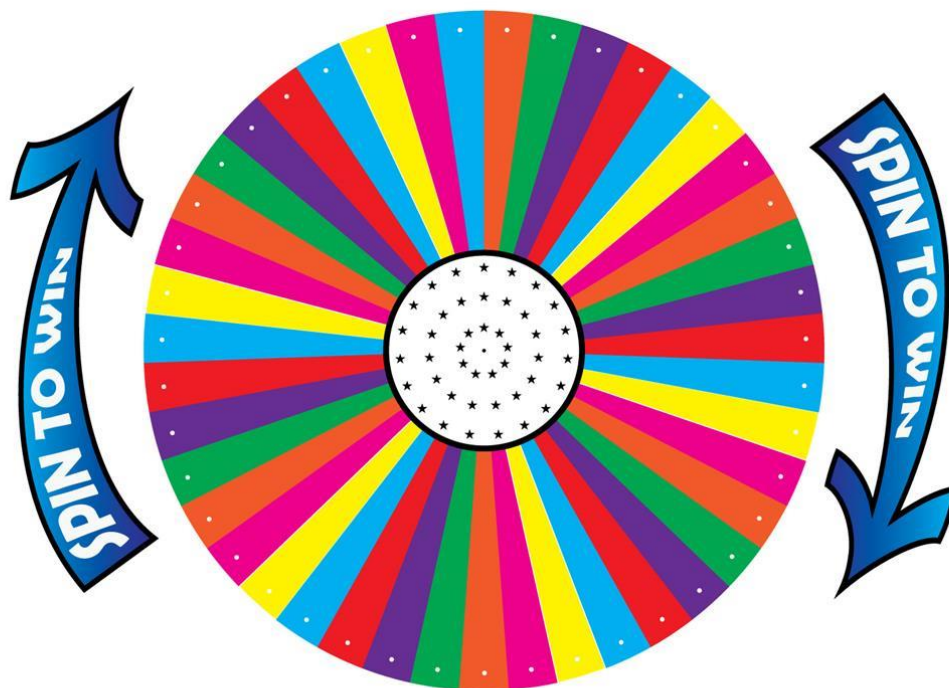
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
