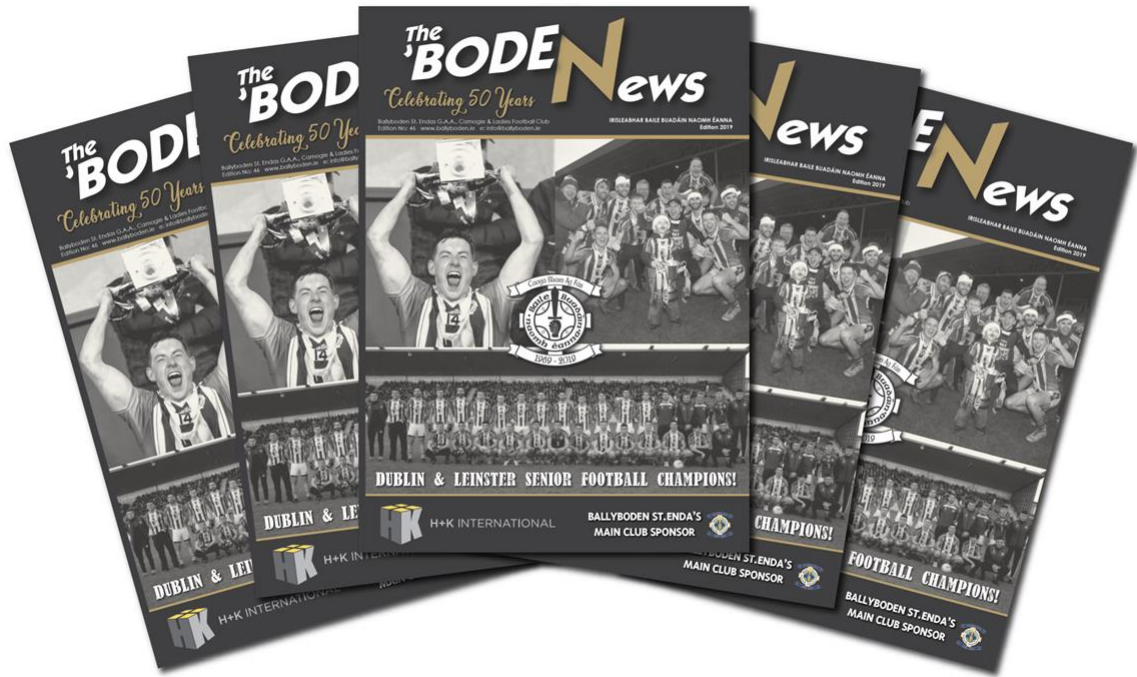

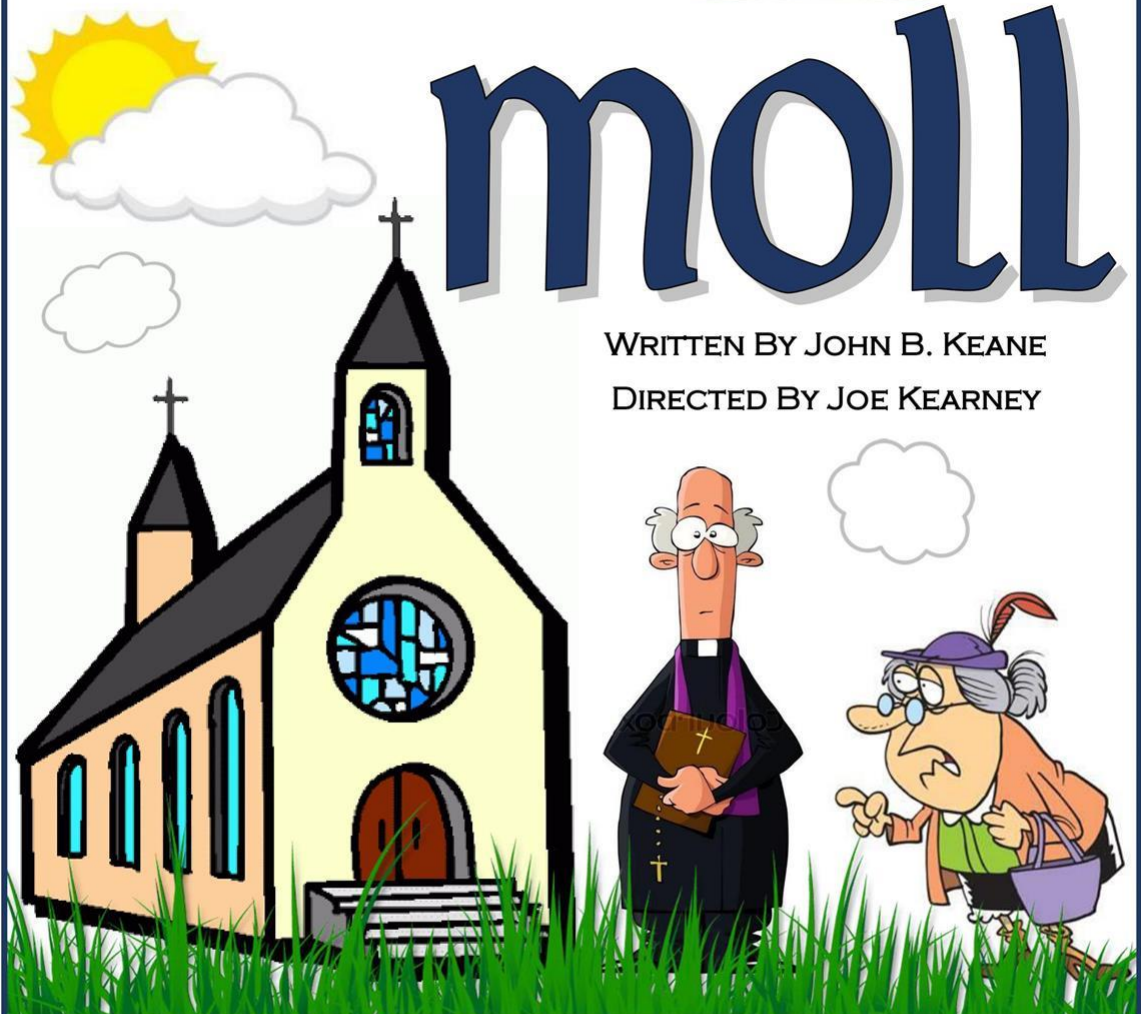
Club Membership 2020

The next ten minutes went by with no score from either team until Darragh Malone was taken down inside the box to give St Colmcilles a penalty. Rob Cullen stood up to take the penalty and placed it beautifully in the top corner of the net. St. Colmcilles then went on their own scoring spree with another goal by Connell McGlynn that rattled the net. They finished off the first half a point behind with the score 2-4 to 2-3 to Virginia.

The second half got underway with St. Colmcilles playing into a stronger wind. Virginia came out fighting taking early scores and pulling ahead. St. Colmcilles answered back with

scores from Michael McDonald, James O'Brien, Darragh Kenny and Lorcan O'Dell. Virginia were still a good bit ahead but in the last ten minutes James O'Brien was played a beautiful ball in from his team mates and then put it in the back of the net to close the gap in the dying minutes of the game. In the last minute of the game Lorcan O'Dell was fouled just outside the 21-yard line. Michael McDonald stood up to take the free and put it over the bar to level the game. With three minutes of injury time to be played both teams were working as hard as they could to try to get a score. The ball was given to Darragh Kenny who worked his way up the left side of the pitch taking on players putting an immense amount of pressure on him. He then laid a high ball into Conor Cullen who was waiting on the edge of the box. He slipped past his player and took a shot at goal. The ball rolled under the keeper and rattled the back of the net. The supporters and teammates erupted giving St Colmcilles the energy they needed to finish out the game. Virginia tried to come back with a point of their own but had run out of time. As the St Colmcilles keeper Seamus Boyle kicked the ball out for the last time, the referee blew his whistle to end the game. St Colmcilles had gotten through to their first All-Ireland football final ever, with the final score of 4-9 to 3-10. An All Ireland final now awaits the boys on March 28 against St Joseph's of Foxford, Co Mayo (venue and time tbc) . Well done lads, Ballyboden is supporting you all the way for the final.

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

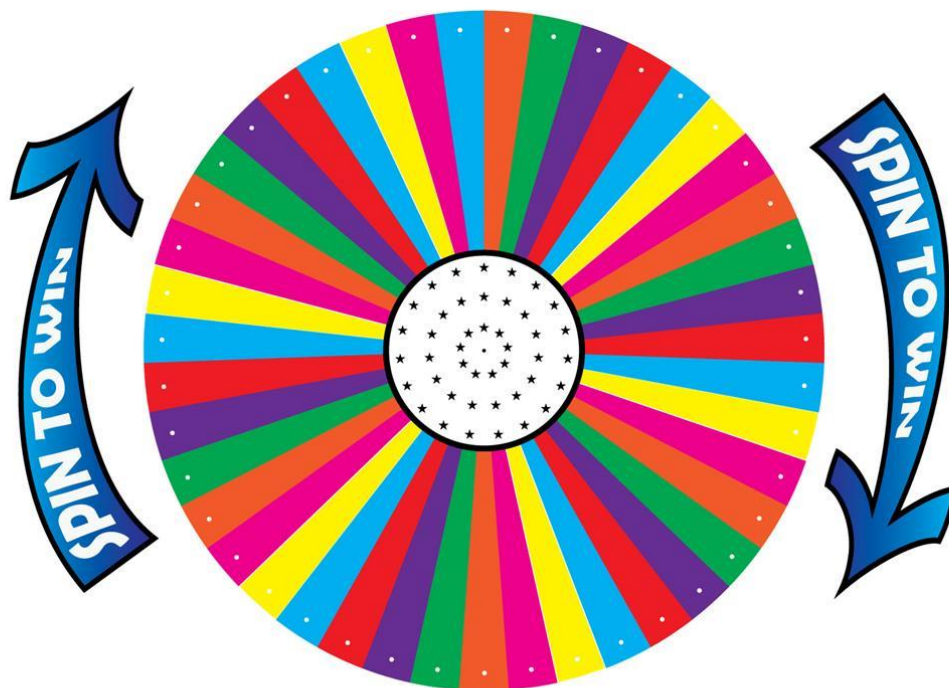
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
