Crokes unleash strength and skill on under-par Boden

Our senior A hurlers have it all to do in the group stage of the Dublin Senior A Hurling championship after a fluent display from our near neighbours Kilmacud Crokes. The tie took place at an almost empty Parnell park and formed the Sunday afternoon home viewing for many fans, compliments of TG4. The game was decided by goals, or rather how best to convert them. Depending on whom you talk to, Crokes converted four big ones from about

seven attempts, whereas Boden had a zero tally from about four reasonable attempts. Matt Collins in the Crokes goal had some good fortune with a couple of Boden's efforts, but surely the Boden management will review proceeding in the light of their failure to convert good chances to goals.

The game opened with Crokes greater efficiency in point taking and by the fifth minute, they led by four points to a single from Niall McMorrow after Niall Ryan found him in good space. Crokes Oisín O'Rourke converted one of his trademark placed balls to extend the lead for the Stillorgan side. There followed Boden's best spell of play and points from Ryan, Conal Keaney, Aiden Mellett, Paul Ryan from a line-cut, and again Mellett (McMorrow assist), brought the score to six apiece.....water break on the quarter.

Even by this early stage, it was clear that Crokes posed a serious threat through Mark Howard, Ronan Hayes, Fergal Whitely and a player who played particularly well in the last meeting of the sides in a March league fixture, Alex Considine. On the resumption Boden led for the only time in the game at eight points to seven after McMorrow grabbed his second point. This good team score was followed by a Ryan free. At this point and the game finely balanced, Crokes were awarded a dubious penalty in an incident that merely looked like 'steps' from the attacker. In any case Finn McGarry in the Boden net was given no chance of stopping Ronan Hayes's bullet of a shot. Caolan Conway followed the goal with classy Crokes point and O'Rourke finished the first-half scoring with his sixth score from a placed ball. 1.10 to 0.08.

Crokes took over in the first five minutes of the second half and capped a fine spell with a Considine goal high into the Boden net. During this spell, seasoned campaigner for Crokes Sean McGrath bagged a classy point, Score now at 2.14 to 0.09. Howard was then allowed the freedom of the park and an economy on the solo in scoring Crokes third goal. Boden struggled to find form and were depending on Shane Durkin and the Ryan cousins for a modest response. The Crokes support had one more highlight to acknowledge, a fine goal finish from Hayes, capping a fine performance from the Dublin star.

Boden Manager Joe Fortune has plenty to consider in the light of this heavy defeat, particularly with Craobh Chiarán as their next opponents in the round robin series. Crokes will take huge satisfaction from the win, particularly in light of their previous losses to Boden over the last couple of years, championship and league. Their bigger names performed well in attack, and Bill O'Carroll along with captain Mark Grogan marshalled their defence to prevent the Boden attack from creating good goal chances.

7 days after Brendan Moran went straight up to Heaven a minutes silence was held in his honour – just minutes before the sliotar was thrown in on the Junior A hurling championship clash between BBSE Junior A's and Ballinteer St John's. It was an honest, dignified and understated tribute to a true gentleman.

It was a glorious morning for a match and a crowd – just shy of 200 – turned up to see a great contest.

Unusual for Boden – we had a lively start with Chris Lambert going for goal early on (after a good pass by Owen Wigglesworth) when a point was maybe the better option but it showed his intent and Chris went on to have an strong influence on proceedings – especially under the high ball.

There was a youthful look to the team as some of the old guard were either cocooning or injured but in fairness they were prominent on the line in supporting their comrades.

The forwards en bloc were on song with Ciaran Cashman scoring from frees committed by under pressure BSJ backs. Dan Nugent scored a fine point from out on the wing but the best of the day was a goal scored by Ben Kelly following a majestic pass delivered into his hand by Morgan Ryan.

Not to be outdone Fergal Ryan, another son of the famed Brendan began to gather a lot of ball around the half back line and hit good low balls into our full forward line of Cashman, Wigglesworth and Nugent who were showing well for the ball.

The more seasoned players, Des O' Sullivan, Andy Hand, Alan O'Connor, Darren Lennox were all playing well and well up to the challenge of the relatively younger and pacey BSJ's forwards. Boden were dominating the play but St John's slipped in for a fairly soft goal from an acute angle. Slightly worrying was that the few times St John's were in the Boden half they scored, mostly from frees.

Chris Lambert caught 2 great balls and Neal Farrell put in a great run and a challenge to draw a free which Cashman put over. The Ryan's combined to put Wigglesworth through and he scored a good goal. Nugent scored a point, Des made a great high catch, Ben Kelly threw a nice dummy and drew a free, Alan O'Connor was fouled (hard to believe) and Cashman duly obliged with both frees.

Score at half time was BBSE 2 – 10 / BSJ 1 – 6. The 1st half was absolutely class hurling of a very high standard.

The 2nd half after a lively startwith Cashman, Morgan Ryan, Lambert and Kelly scoring early faded somewhat and we began to defend too deep and lost our shape around the middle. We got careless in our tackling and gave away some needless frees which St John's put over the bar.

Daniel O'Riordan came on for the injured Ben Kelly and got an immediate point, followed shortly after with a goal after good pass from Austen Lynch, Daniel Nugent scored from a sideline. Ruairi MacMathuna, Jack Kenny and John McCormack were introduced and freshened things up a bit. However St John's slipped in for another 2 handy enough goals to put a more respectable score on the board, final score BBSE 3 – 18 / 3 – 8 BSJ'S

Considering the long 'lock-in' and 1st match of the championshipthe performance particularly in the 1st half was very good and shows what this team is capable of but against a better opposition we have to curtail the frees conceded and hold our concentration and shape for the duration of the match.

p.s. Well done to Enda Cashman (left full back) on his debut at this level, he was part of a very good full back line and a good back division overall.

Battle-hardened Boden sink Sylvester's in Minor A football championship

A glorious Sunday morning saw the travelling Boden support make the long trip to the "Poor Man's Dalkey". The St. Sylvester's pitch, in the heart of.....well, nowhere, was in immaculate condition. Rumours of tumbling property prices due to the establishment of a Sailing Centre for Midland Culchies was the idle pre match gossip amongst the chattering classes. "It will be just like Portmarnock" said Blanaidh from Estuary View "You know those boggers drink milk from Bodhrans."

Thoughts quickly turned to matters football, when Liam O'Dwyer's charges appeared from behind a hedgerow, the new normal for dressing rooms. There was a sombre moment as the untimely passing of Brendan Moran was marked with a minute's silence. Like every other team in Ballyboden, when they first walk through the gates of the Academy, Brendan had a sincere interest in this group of lads. Down through the years, he constantly enquired as to how they were getting on. He would often remark that they were a lovely group of young fellas and that the club is more about the people and not always about the medals. It would be fair to say there was a collective lump in the throat of the Boden support as they felt his, almost tangible, spirit descend to every square inch of the pitch.

Playing into the "marina" end, the game started at a ferocious pace with both teams exchanging early schkelps to enforce their superiority. Boden were first to trim the sails of

Sylvester's from the boot of corner forward Luke Byrne. Cheers of "Ahoy and tally ho " rang around Broomfield Demesne as Sylvester's registered their first point after 6 minutes. Under the 'Death Stare' of defence coach Andy Gardiner, the Boden back six quickly responded to "The Enforcer's" instruction and nothing 'but the wind' got past them. Forced into long range shots, Sylvester's registered just 5 scores in the first 30 minutes. On a number of occasions, Boden split the Sylvester's defence and Keogh was unlucky when his pile driver came back off the woodwork. The ever industrious McGlynn was creating mayhem up front which allowed Byrne and O'Dwyer register 6 of Bodens 7 first half points with McGlynn himself getting the other one.

At half time, we caught up with mentor Jack Donaghy, who was looking a little the worse for wear. Picture a fat Ronnie Wood in drag. Asked how he thought things were going, he said, "I put on a little Lockdown weight and all of a sudden everyone is Jane Fonda." When pressed about the match, he said, "The half time stats are good, turnovers won, completed passes, shot conversion and, like Liam O'Dwyer's wallet, the defence is on 100% lockdown."

As the 2nd half got underway, Boden raised the intensity and a point a piece from the hard-working midfield duo of McDonald and Colcough saw Boden open up a four-point lead and they were beginning to look comfortable. Sylvester's did not like the cut of the Boden jib and tacked towards a more traditional set up with a 'Big Man' up front. But living in fear of the menacing presence of 'The Enforcer' Leahy, Maguire, Gannon and Gavin snuffed out any chances of a comeback. Calls from the Sly's bench to move the ball from Port to Starboard to get a breakthrough were quickly extinguished by O'Sullivan and Donaghy out on the wings. And somewhat ironically, Sylvester's were the ones at sea.

The introduction of Sweeney, Keane and Lynch into the forwards saw Boden drop anchor on the game as they extended their lead to 8 points.

As the final whistle sounded, we grabbed salad intolerant mentor Declan Maguire for a reaction. "It was a solid overall performance with lots of positives to take into the Ballymun game, even Harry Donaghy got on the score sheet." When asked for a more insightful analysis, he panicingly muttered, "Get out of me way before 'The Enforcer' catches up with me, I made a remark about how he is the first person from Ballycastle that I met, to have all their own teeth. He's not best pleased."

So as this Hack headed for home, my thoughts once again turned to Brendan Moran, the 'Gentleman of GAA'. And how he would have had a broad smile after such an honest team performance, comfortable in the knowledge that these fine young men are a credit to their families and club. A club which he was passionate about and one he tirelessly and unselfishly invested years upon years of hard work. That's some legacy Brendan..... Rest Easy.

We would encourage all of our club members to check in on elderly neighbours and vulnerable people in our community, and especially older club members who live close by.

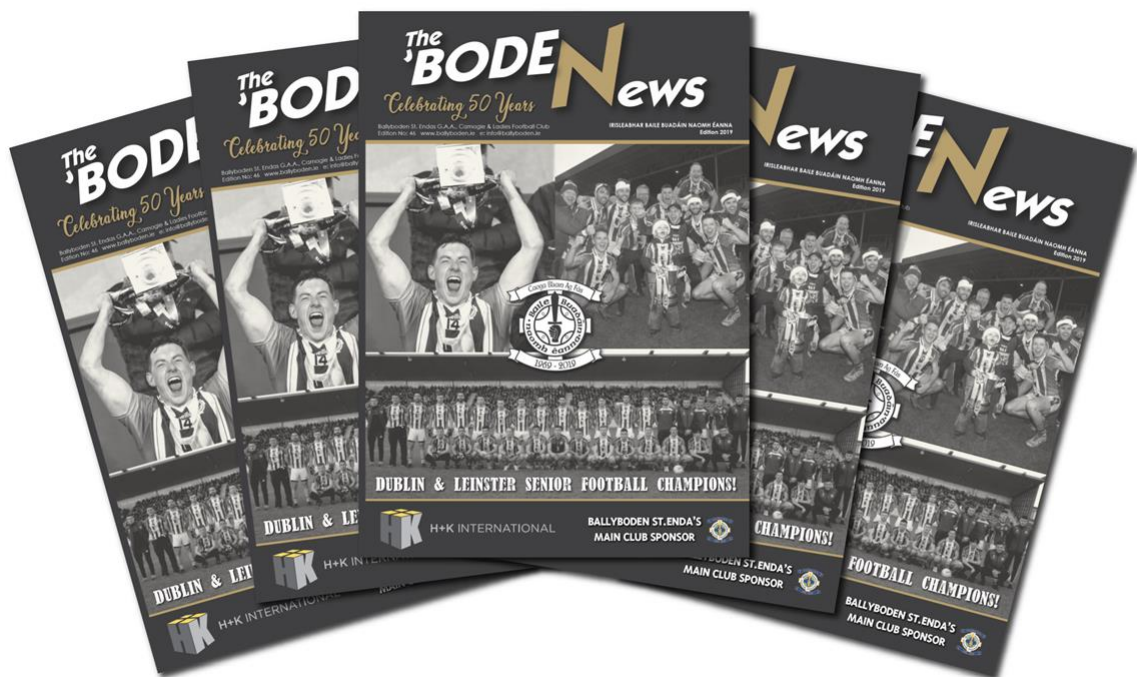
Our adult player's committees would also like to volunteer their assistance to support any member of the community who is unable to leave their house.

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

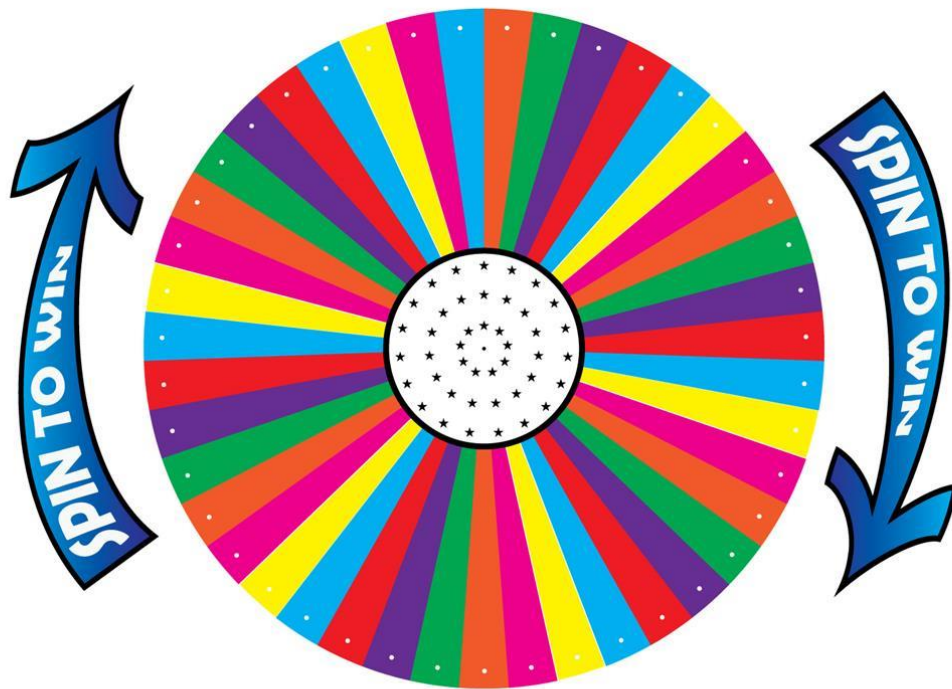
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
