Senior footballers impress V Clontarf



Senior football championship v Clontarf, Páirc Uí Mhurchú, 25 July 2020

Ballyboden St Endas 4 - 20Clontarf 2 - 8

This was a unique occasion in many ways - a senior football championship match, played in July, on home turf, players togging out under gazebos while the rain pelted down.

The club grounds, pitch, car park and surrounds and indeed the clubhouse were resplendent after recent improvement works as the match got under way. However, Clontarf were not interested in the surrounds and within a minute had the ball in the back of the net, quickly followed by a point. Ross McGarry pulled a point back a minute later but two more points by the visitors, and another effort off the post, had the home team wondering what had hit them. Conal Keaney and Clontarf shared 4 points in the next five minutes (one of Clontarf's points clipped the upper side of the cross bar and could easily have been another goal) and just before the water break, Colm Basquel had his first point (free). Conal Keaney pulled back another point just after the break to leave a goal separating the sides. Then Clontarf hit with another goal. This seemed to have woken the county champions from their slumbers as, in the remaining 8 minutes to half time, they scored 1-4 to Clontarf's one point to leave the half time scores level, 1-9 to 2-6. The goal was a cracker, just a minute after Clontarf's goal, and was scored by Warren Egan after some intricate passing moves among the forwards. Colm Basquel converted three of the points (2 frees) with Conal Keaney scoring the other from a free.

The second half started with Ross McGarry popping over the first two points before Clontarf got one back. Two more points by Declan O'Mahony and Colm Basquel were followed by what turned out to be Clontarf's last score, to leave Boden two points ahead, half-way through the second half. Colm Basquel scored the next two points (1 free) followed by another from Ross McGarry before Darragh Nelson was in the right place to prevent Clontarf from raising another green flag. The game was ended as a contest when Colm Basquel coolly converted a penalty after Conal Keaney was fouled in the small square. Colm then added another three points (1 free). Tom Hayes got on the scoreboard with a point as the clock ticked towards full time. However, there was still time to improve the teams scoring difference with goals from Warren Egan (his second), after good work by Alan Flood, and Simon Lambert, from a neat pass from Tom Hayes. Clontarf didn't give up without a fight and Darragh Gogan had to be alert to make a good save on 60 minutes and he followed up with another save when Clontarf went for goal from a close in free.

So, unlike our two previous clashes with Clontarf in the championship in recent years which ended with late one and two point wins, this was a more comprehensive win to give the team confidence as they face what will inevitably be a tough contest against *St Vincents in the next round in Páirc Naomh Uinsionn on Wednesday 5 August at 7.30pm*.

Our lives are regimented by time; we set alarms, we meet deadlines and we measure how long it takes to do something. Our lives are busy and we're always looking for more time;

sometimes 24/7 isn't enough. To make up for our lack of time we only partially complete tasks or complete them to a standard that we are not happy with.

There's too much time left and no subs. Ah no, no, no. Down to 14, on the back foot and time is our enemy.

Final whistle. Lost.

We would encourage all of our dub members to check in on elderly neighbours and vulnerable people in our community, and especially older club members who live close by.


Our adult player's committees would also like to volunteer their assistance to support any member of the community who is unable to leave their house.



Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
