A good week for the club's top mens teams was confirmed at HQ on Saturday evening in front of a Covid crowd when the home side accounted for Craobh Chiaran. The sides were well aware of their qualification position as they lined out in glorious summer weather. It was a case of a win to guarantee progress to the quarter finals. Boden benefited hugely from two fine goals from Pearse Christie and Paul Ryan. Christie's bullet of a shot came after some quality team play and a measured pass from Aiden Mellett. This put Boden in the ascendancy by six points a few minutes into the second quarter. Ryan's rasper into the visitors net came after the referee Chris Mooney whistled the final quarter into action. Boden's net minder Finn McGarry spotted Ryan in oceans of territory and he took full advantage by running forty yards and firing high into the far corner of the net.

The game opened in its expected flurry of action and some manly shoulders. Games between these sides have almost always been strenuous affairs. That said it was the home side who raced into a lead thanks to points from Niall Ryan (Keaney assist), Keaney off a Niall McMorrough pass, a long-ranger off the rail white-wash from Paul Doherty, and a Paul Ryan 65. The visitors replied with a Cian Derwin free, the first of his tally of 2.09. Bear in mind Chiarans total for the evening. In between Keaney had the visitors goal at his mercy but his shot was well parried. Ryan followed with pointed frees and McMorrough took Mellett's pass and converted it expertly. Derwin stopped the rot with the first of his goals, although McGarry had all but repulsed his effort only for the attacker staying the course to prod the sliotar home. Score now 7 pts to 1.01. McMorrough continued the point taking for Boden followed by Mellett after a superb trade-mark turn and strike. The teams took on some well-earned water with the home side on nine points.

Derwin opened the scoring on resumption with a brace, only for Christie to take his chance as a blood sub to stretch Bodens lead to six points. In defence Simon Lambert was dominant

for Boden, while in the crowded middle third, James Madden and Conor McKeown were gaining the upper hand. The quarter continued more or less 'even steven' with Derwin cancelling out some of the Boden scores, but not a superb effort from Paul Ryan off the rail white-wash. By the half-hour Boden held a five point lead.....all to play for. A significant feature of Boden's opening half play was their ability to pounce on loose ball from batted clearances.

Boden raced into a generous lead on the resumption with Ryan frees and a Keaney beauty after Christie passed him. Immediately the latter was upended on the run only for Ryan to heap further misery on the Craobh. By the second water break Boden had a lead of ten points, the last of which came from Niall Ryan and his usual fleet of foot. The feature of the final quarter was Chiaran's play for goals, only one of which was conceded, Derwin again the marksman. This cancelled the fine opportunist goal from Paul Ryan. Boden's defence held firm under considerable pressure with Luke Corcoran, Stephen O'Connor and Lambert holding their lines. Ryan continued his almost perfect free-taking and maintained a generous margin to the final whistle.

Boden now look forward to the quarter finals against St. Vincents and will hope to progress off the back of this balanced team performance. Incidentally the match programme featured a fine tribute to the late Brendan Moran. Also two names stood out on the team sheet, Waterford-man Richie Foley, a recent signing, and Stephen Hiney who was last featured in a championship team list four years ago.

With 10 minutes gone in this match the figures were, 9 wides to Vincents, 1 wide to Boden. This slow start could have had the team in real trouble if the Vincents forwards had their shooting boots on. Despite the home side's dominance at this early stage it was the visitors that got the first score, a long-range point by Alan Flood after a patient build up. This was followed by a Darren O'Reilly point following a good run by Darragh Nelson. Then Michael Darragh and Alan Flood did the hard work and Alan found Colm Basquel who finished coolly to the net: 1 – 2 to no score. The home team got their first scores as Mossy Quinn converted two frees and Vins added another from play before the water break. After the break, Vincents continued where they left off and added two points from play to bring the sides level. It could have been worse if Darragh Gogan hadn't brought off a great save to deny what looked like a certain goal. Having gone 10 minutes without a score, Warren Egan came to the rescue with a good point before Colm Basquel was again at the end of a good move involving Alan Flood, to finish to the net. Each side scored three points before half time, Boden's coming from Conal Keaney, Colm Basquel (free) and Ross McGarry. One of the Vincents points could have easily been a goal when Mossy Quinn had only the keeper to beat but he blasted over the bar. At the other end, Alan Flood found himself one-on-one with the Vincents keeper but Michael Savage made a good save. The half time score was 2 – 6 to 0 – 8.

At the start of the second half, two quick points from Vincents were followed by a Colm Basquel free from near the 50 metre line, and then the home team added three more to bring the sides level with just 7 minutes gone. Kieran Kennedy, although playing at corner back, was eventually rewarded for his many runs forward when he pointed and this was quickly followed by another Warren Egan point, this time with his left boot. The Boden subs then showed what they can do when, first, Simon Lambert found the back of the net following a good run by Brian Bobbett. A Michael Darragh effort at a fisted point hit the cross bar but it was recycled to Warren Egan who fed Donogh McCabe and he fired to the net from distance. In between the two goals, Vincents had got a point and after the goals, Colm Basquel popped over a long-range free from close to the side-line. But the subs weren't finished, as, after Vincents scored another point, Tom Hayes found the net; the hard-working Ross McGarry kept the ball in play near the side-line, 40 yards out, and fed Tom. Tom's first effort was saved but Conal Keaney retrieved the ball and passed to Tom who made no mistake the second time. Vincents managed a late goal and two points, the last from a close-in free that was diverted over the bar by Darragh Gogan when Mossy Quinn went for goal. As he did in the first half, Ross McGarry brought the scoring to a close with a long-range point.

Hyde park in the heart of Dalkey, a hotbed of vegan activism, was the venue for this much anticipated 3rd round clash. well as the technical ability. Two beautifully struck 45's from O'Sullivan saw Boden go to the break 9 points to 6 to the good.

The action got back underway and Boden picked up where they left off. Sandwiched between a couple of frees from the boot of Luke Byrne came the turning point of the game. After Maguire and Gavin broke up a Cuala attack, Boden moved the ball quickly down the pitch and Mulligan-Lynch found the gap to get through on goal. With three Cuala defenders hanging off him, he calmly slotted the ball beyond the outstretched arm of the Cuala keeper and finally the green flag was raised.

As the game moved into the last quarter, Boden emptied the bench and the energy levels rose another notch. Long, Hickey, Welsh and Keogh responded to the deafening enthusiasm of the Boden support and showed exactly why this panel has a real depth to it. As Cuala threw the hand-crafted, heavy duty fireclay ceramic Belfast sink at it, Boden soaked up the pressure and broke downfield to register 4 points in the final 15 minutes. The pick of the crop being a lung bursting solo run from team captain, Harry Colcough and a sublime finish to split the posts.

As the final whistle sounded, we caught up with some of the 'hangers on' for comment. "The Magnificent 7 [defensive unit] were firing on all cylinders again today. That's three games and no goals conceded", said defensive coach Andy Gardiner, who hails from the small town of Ballycastle in Mayo. Cold, miserable and wet, Andy is an important member of the backroom team.

Mentor Jack Donaghy who was sporting his 'New Look' after shifting the "Corona-carbs" and smelling like a new toilet in a McInerney home, said, "We've changed things up for this game and the lads have responded well." He went on to say, "A championship is about a squad and not any one individual and these lads are playing their part. Now get out of my way fatty, I need to power walk to the line." You could cut the tension with a knife.

Morale is still high within the team and we look forward to our next game to get back to the winning ways.

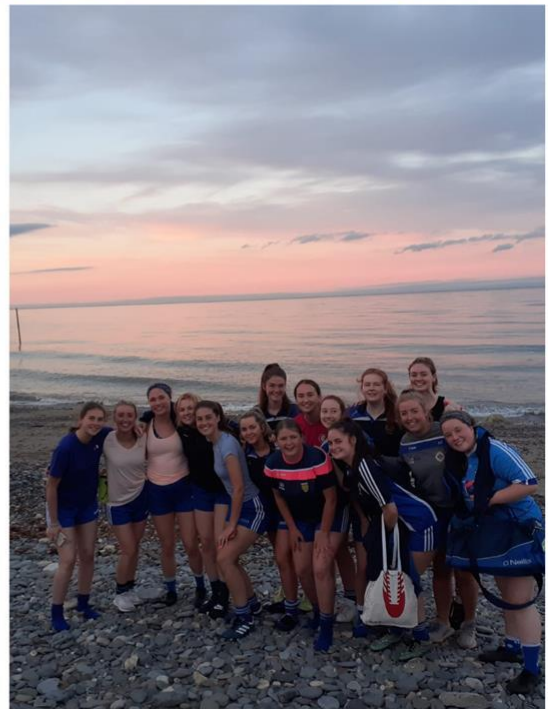

Under 16 C hurlers edge Lucan in Championship



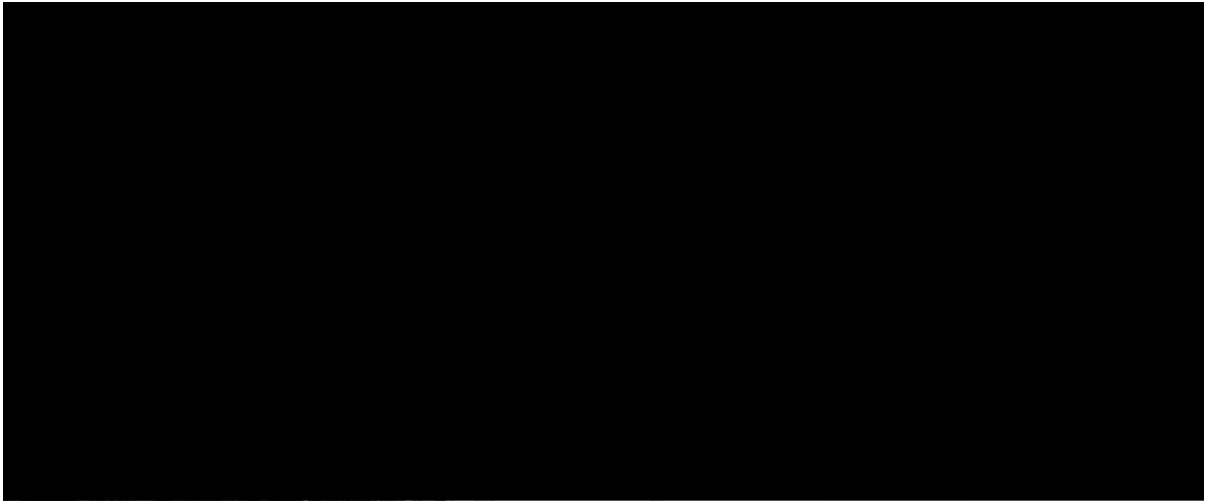

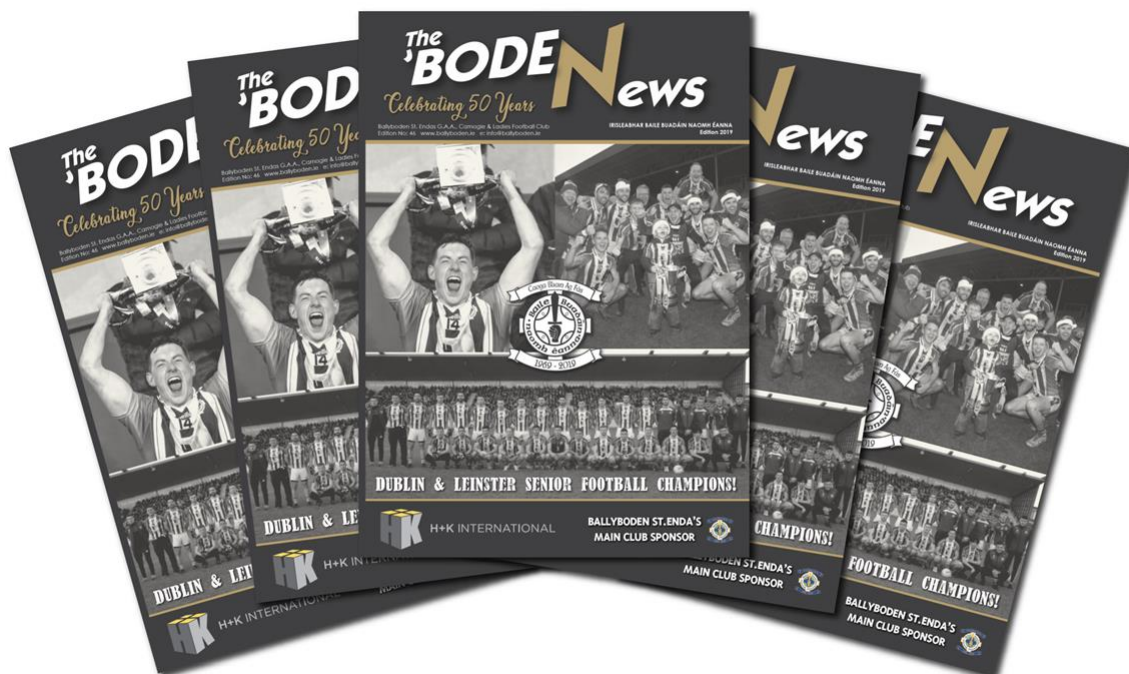

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

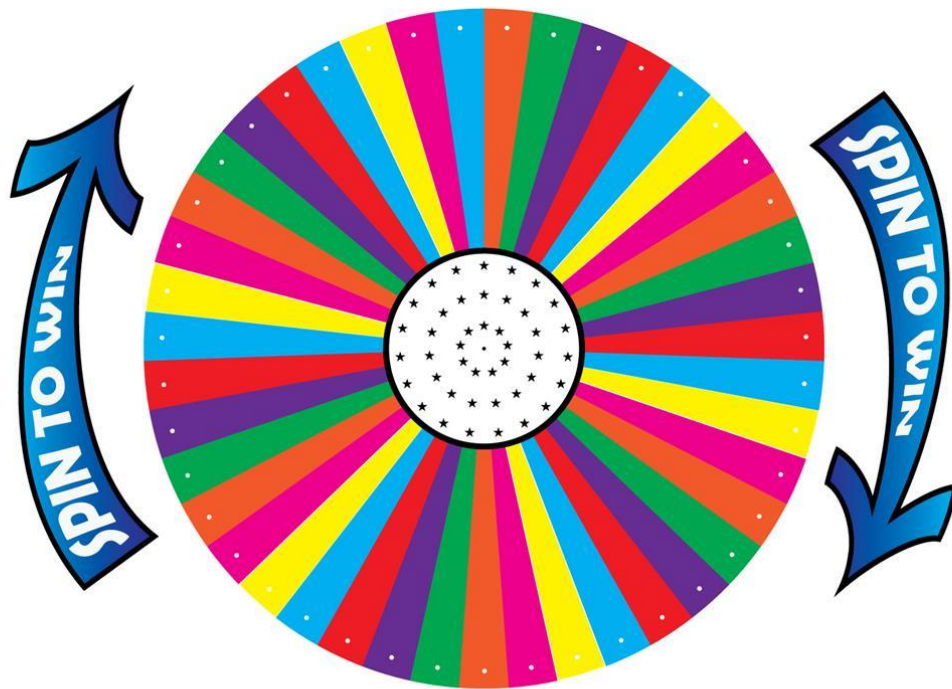
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
