Club President John O'Neill RIP



A Ballyboden and GAA giant left us on Sat (Aug 15th). It is with great sadness that we learned that club President and Trustee, John O'Neill, has gone to his eternal reward. John was a Corkman, a GAA man and a Ballyboden man to his marrow, and his legacy will be felt for generations in Rathfarnham, Knocklyon, Firhouse and Ballyboden. He filled many roles in running teams and running Ballyboden St. Enda's through the last forty plus years, and everything he did was approached with a principled stance, with passion and with a little bit of divilment.

John truly loved Ballyboden St. Endas; he enjoyed the company of fellow members, enjoyed a pint in the bar, loved GAA and especially football, and he made it his life's work to ensure that the club's ethos, culture and assets were fiercely protected and defended. He was a man of hugely high standards and morals and insisted that Ballyboden St. Endas would adopt and maintain similarly high standards in all aspects of club activity. John visited the club in the last weeks of his life, and it was a relief to the Executive to hear from his daughter Sheena that the President approved of the improvement works undertaken during lockdown! John suffered ill health in the last number of months, but such was his courage, faith and backbone that he was ready to leave this world to rejoin his beloved wife Maureen. I am absolutely certain that Chief O'Neill will be looking down on us from above and holding us to account for the principled stewardship of the club which he paid such a huge part in building. It is often said, but in this case it is undeniably true - Ní bheidh a leithéid arís ann.

Everybody in the club extends our sincere sympathy to all of the O'Neill family on the loss of their dad and grandad and our President.

Covid Practice - Update

As a club, we have been very diligent regarding implementation of measures to ensure the safety of spectators and players, and this has been as a result of hard work and effort by many, many people who have been tracking player check-ins, stewarding games, providing signage and sanitiser, ensuring a safe environment etc. This has been tremendously hard work on top of the normal effort to train and prepare teams and compete in games, and we have received compliments from referees and opposition mentors as to the quality of the preparation and precautions taken at games.

As the numbers of cases reported increases across the country, we must remain steadfast and diligent in implementation of the protective measures and procedures. Can we especially:

- Continue with health check-ins before every session
- Continue to sanitise equipment used after every session
- Avoid car-pooling to training or games. If car-pooling cannot be avoided and members of different households must travel in the same car, then masks should be worn.
- Encourage all club members and players over the age of 16 to download the HSE app to their phones as this is hugely helpful for tracing in the event of a scare.
- Continue to insist that all players bring their own water bottle to training and matches. Shared water bottles must not be used.

- Check-in to the GAA app to confirm health status should be done on the morning of an evening session or the night before for a morning game or session.

Many thanks for all your efforts up to now - let's continue to be diligent to ensure that we can complete our full programme of games in a safe manner.

Whitehall got the first score in the first minute to take an early lead, but it didn't last long. In the 2nd minute Conal Keaney saw his first effort for a goal well blocked by the goalkeeper but when it rebounded to him, Conal made no mistake as he finished to the net. Kieran Kennedy, although wearing No. 2, lined out in the half forward line and had his name on the board a minute later. Brian Bobbett made one of his customary runs up the middle from his half back position and as he sought a colleague to pass to, he saw a gap opening up and decided to go for it and he finished confidently to the net. Whitehall got a point back, but Ross McGarry and Robbie McDaid added further points for Boden. As the first water break approached, Whitehall had their purple patch scoring a goal and two points, to leave just two points between the sides. After the short break, Boden added 9 points with just two in reply for Whitehall. Ross McGarry (3, 1 mark), Warren Egan (2, 1x45), Conal Keaney (1), Aran

Waters (1), Robbie McDaid (1) and Colm Basquel (1 free) to leave Boden in front 2 – 12 to 1 – 6 at half time.

Colm Basquel got the first score of the second half after four minutes, but this was quickly cancelled by a Whitehall point. Robbie McDaid and Whitehall exchanged points before Warren Egan and Colm Basquel (free) added to Boden's total. Michael Darragh Macauley was working hard and a rasper of a shot for goal came back off the cross bar and was cleared and Whitehall followed their good luck with another point. If there was any doubt about the result up to this, it was put beyond doubt when Tom Hayes set up Colm Basquel for a tap in goal. Colm added a point from a free and Ross McGarry added to his tally before Tom Hayes finished to the net after good work by Donogh McCabe. Whitehall managed one more point but Boden finished in style with Colm Basquel (2 frees), Warren Egan (1) and Brian Bobbett (1, with his fist). This leaves Boden at the top of its group, unbeaten, and will face the runners-up of Group 4 in the quarter final.

Boden edge out Na Fianna to book a spot in Championship Semi-Final, Sunday 16th August 2020

The Boden girls pulled off a dramatic victory in the senior camogie championship in Mobhi Road on Sunday. This was a tense, tough and dramatic game given the stakes were so high as Na Fianna needed to win to stay in the Championship whilst a Boden win would likely take them to a semi-final. With the breeze at their back, Boden got off to a good start with two early points however Na Fianna drew level within a few minutes. Immediately after the water break, a Na Fianna attack almost caught Boden cold however a great save once again from Sile Ni Coitir denied Na Fianna a goal. The game was flowing nicely with some good passages of play from both sides and tough but fair physical exchanges happening across the pitch. The Boden girls moved to 0-5 to 0-2 on the scoreboard but Na Fianna rallied to draw level and by half time Boden just had their noses in front by a point 0-7 to 0-6. A highlight of that half was a superb long range point from play from Darina Ryan.

With the breeze at their back now, the Na Fianna onslaught was expected and they did not disappoint. They quickly levelled the game and then went ahead by a point. They did not have it all their own way however as the Boden girls fought valiantly in every position by hooking and blocking their opponents and a good point from Doireann Mullany kept Boden in touch. The game was in the melting pot now and both teams went toe to toe in true championship style. Sile once again pulled out a great save diving full stretch to parry a cross

shot that was heading to the corner of the net. Laura Nagle got a fine long range point and Martha O Donoghue pointed from closer in having received a perfect hand pass from Jodie White. Boden were leading now by two points when Na Fianna scored a goal in the 25th minute of the second half against the run of play. This was a fillip for Na Fianna as they were now one point ahead with little time remaining. The Boden girls however displayed true character and resilience. They fought intensely to deny Na Fianna scores they otherwise would have gotten but for the pressure put on them. Another point from Doireann Mullany levelled the game. Na Fianna took the lead again from a free and then in the 30th minute, defender Sarah Nagle surged forward into the heart of the Na Fianna defence and when the ball went to ground from a tackle, Darina Ryan swept in and with a fine ground stroke, blasted the ball to the net. Boden were now two points ahead shortly reduced to one point entering the final phase of play. Na Fianna attacked several times in the 6 minutes of added time played but were repelled by the collective efforts of the Boden girls. Try as they might Na Fianna could not find a way through and at the final whistle Boden had edged it by the slimmest of margins in a dramatic finale. Well done to all the players and management involved. Given tight squad numbers and summer holidays the planning has been ongoing for weeks and through a combination of regulars, returnees and some great support from under 15 C squad we landed with 18 players for the warm-up.

Once the ball was thrown in it was clear that the Boden lads were up for the game and with Conor Murphy directing affairs from 6 Boden had a series of relentless attacks with the midfield pair of Alex Stewart and Matthew Gray driving forward and linking well with the half forward line of Eoghan Walsh, Dan Kennedy and Liam Smithers. Crokes had no answer to the relentless running of these lads and the tone was set from the off with a couple of early goals and some excellent points from accurate kicking. Any occasional efforts from Crokes to break forward were cut off by the tough tackling of Paul O'Grady and Sam Byrne on the wings. At the first water break Boden had established a comfortable lead and the words from Manager Peter Gray were to conserve energy and to manage the full hour. The first subs were sprung from the bench but on the restart the original tempo was restored with more scores coming including a free from Kevin O'Donoghue to add to a couple of goals from play. Crokes did apply a bit more pressure but the full back line now called into play didn't fail to deliver. Josh Coyle and Cathal O'Toole either side of Oran Kelly tackled like tigers and Crokes were reduced to shots from the outside and Tim Giblin in goal was untroubled save for kick outs. Highlights of the first half were a point off his left from Liam Smithers and a neat finish to the back of the net from Andrew Duffy on the stroke of half time after a long ball from Alex Stewart. Half time Boden 5-5 Crokes 0-2.

Face coverings should be worn at all times in the shop and customers are additionally encouraged not to try on any items of clothing.

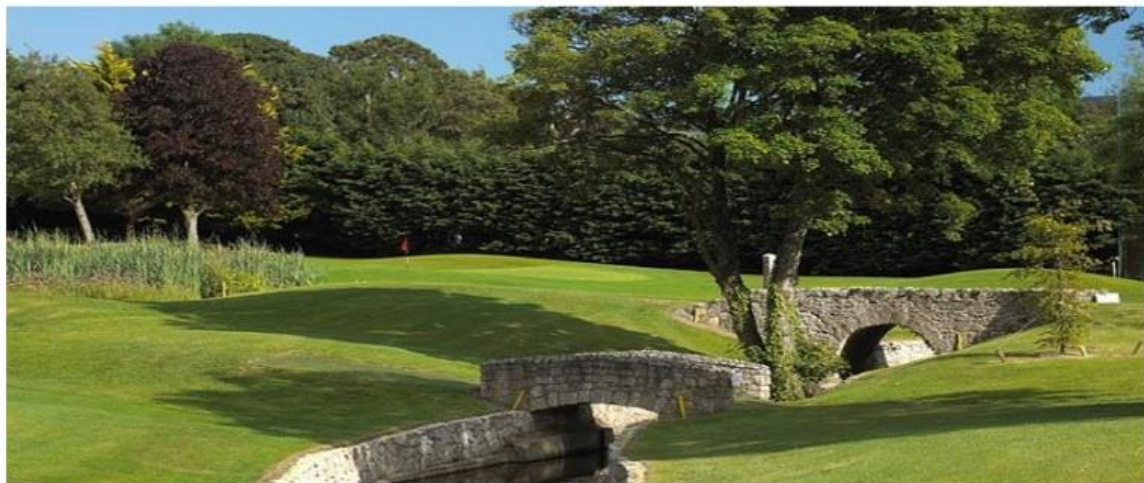

We would encourage all of our club members to check in on elderly neighbours and vulnerable people in our community, and especially older club members who live close by.

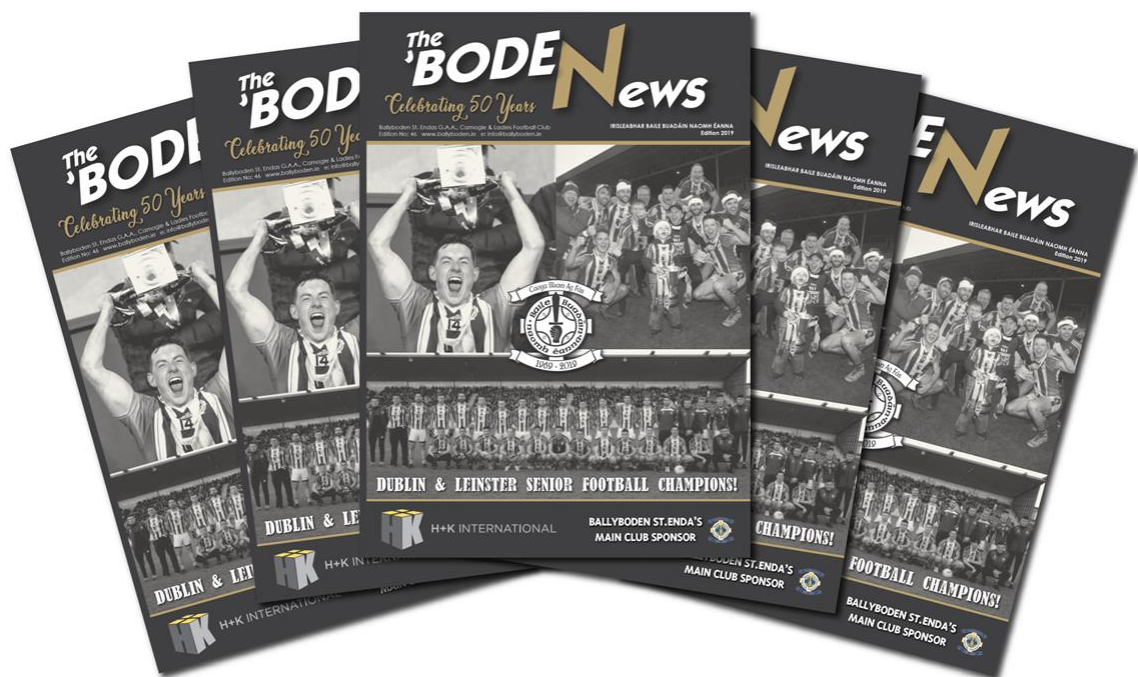
Our adult player's committees would also like to volunteer their assistance to support any member of the community who is unable to leave their house.

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

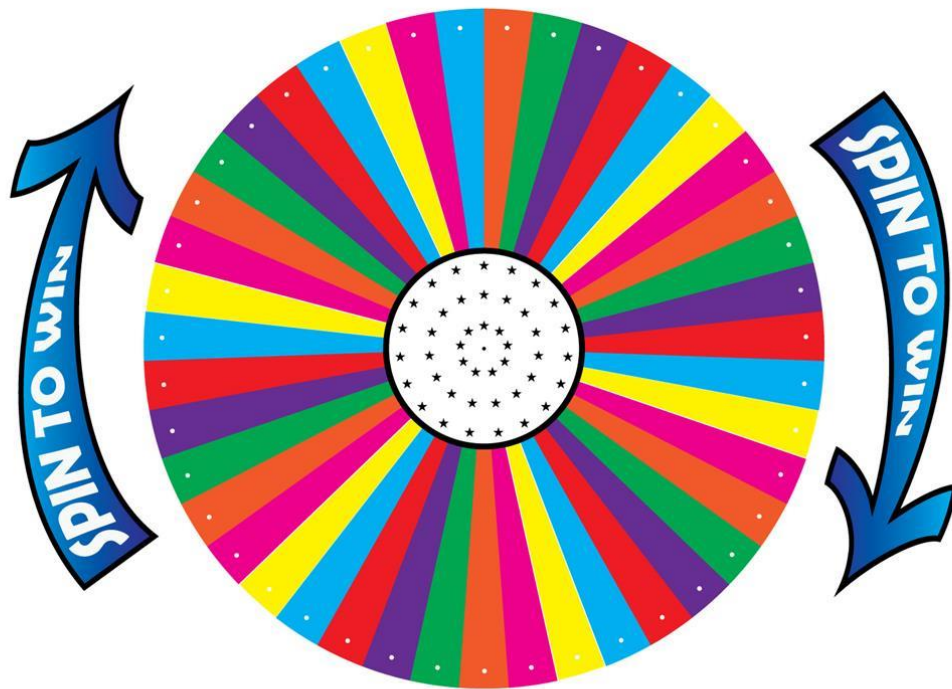
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
