All seasons begin with hope and expectation, it is only afterwards that the belief develops as the season progresses following positive results and performances. This season has been rudely interrupted by a public health emergency and we've spent the last two months trying to recreate the positivity and belief that all teams desire. Working from a large panel due to the fact that our students are effectively grounded in Ireland the difficulty in providing all players with competitive game time is proving challenging. But to be fair, the players have accepted the challenges and have continued to train and apply themselves. Boden were meeting Na Fianna for the first time since the championship semi-final encounter in 2019 which Boden won with three points to spare. This year Na Fianna had finished top of their group unbeaten which made us more than a little wary.

The game started brightly for Boden who were playing into a strong breeze. And despite opening the scoring Na Fianna had us pegged back to 2 points apiece fairly swiftly. Just when it seemed that the congestion around the Na Fianna goal was going to hinder us Barra found a yard of space peeling off his defender to round the keeper and slot the ball home. The last quarter saw the introduction of Mono and Lewis in the attack and Tommy and Scott in defence. Mono capped his introduction with an aggressive run at goal which finished with him fisting the ball to the net from a 1-2 with Colly.

All in all a satisfying performance from a group of lads who've put in a great effort over the last few weeks. This includes the lads who didn't get on the pitch, namely Ste, Leachie, Batesy, Dylan, Enda, Owen and Jake. Plus a few others who were carrying knocks.

On a fine sunny morning in ideal hurling conditions the two teams served up a really entertaining clash for the Covid restricted crowd in attendance. The first quarter of the game was hard fought with Boden heading into the first water break ahead 0-3 to 0-2 thanks to a superb long range point from Evan Welsh right on the break.

Whatever the lads brought in the water bottles did the trick for our lads as we dominated the second quarter. We slowly gained the advantage around the middle of the field with Martin Mulligan-Lynch, Evan Welsh and Sean Bury coming to the fore. Jack Larkin was the star of the show during this period – scoring a superb 1-03 in the space of 5 or 6 minutes, the goal brilliantly set up by Dylan Smyth. Jack's contribution together with a couple from Charlie Brady either side got us to half time ahead by 6 on a score of 1-08 to 0-05.

The first period of the second half was a tight affair with both sides scoring 3 points each – the pick of ours a superb score from Mark McSharry, one of 3 excellent U16's we had out. The hardwork from the lads was led from the front with Setanta Sudway and Timmy Cleary putting in huge shifts in this critical phase. Timmy "unluckily" picked up a yellow card during this period. We reached the water break still 6 ahead but starting to feel the pressure from a resurgent Lucan team.

Lucan got the break they needed with a lucky goal right after the break finally beating the dominant Conor Barnes in the Boden goal. Lucan came at us in waves for the rest of the game but our back line stepped up to the challenge with Michael Hanrahan, Tom White outstanding in the corners and Scott McDonald at full back withstanding everything Lucan could throw at them.

With the lead down to 3 every score mattered and in our time of need the excellent Tom Culleton put over 2 monster frees to keep our noses in front. We headed into injury time ahead by 1 and the game still anyone's. These last few minutes seemed to be one Lucan attack after another followed by one Micheal Manning interception and clearance after another. Eventually one of these found Hugh Kelly - finally in a bit of space, Hugh put his head down and headed for the posts superbly slotting over the insurance point. 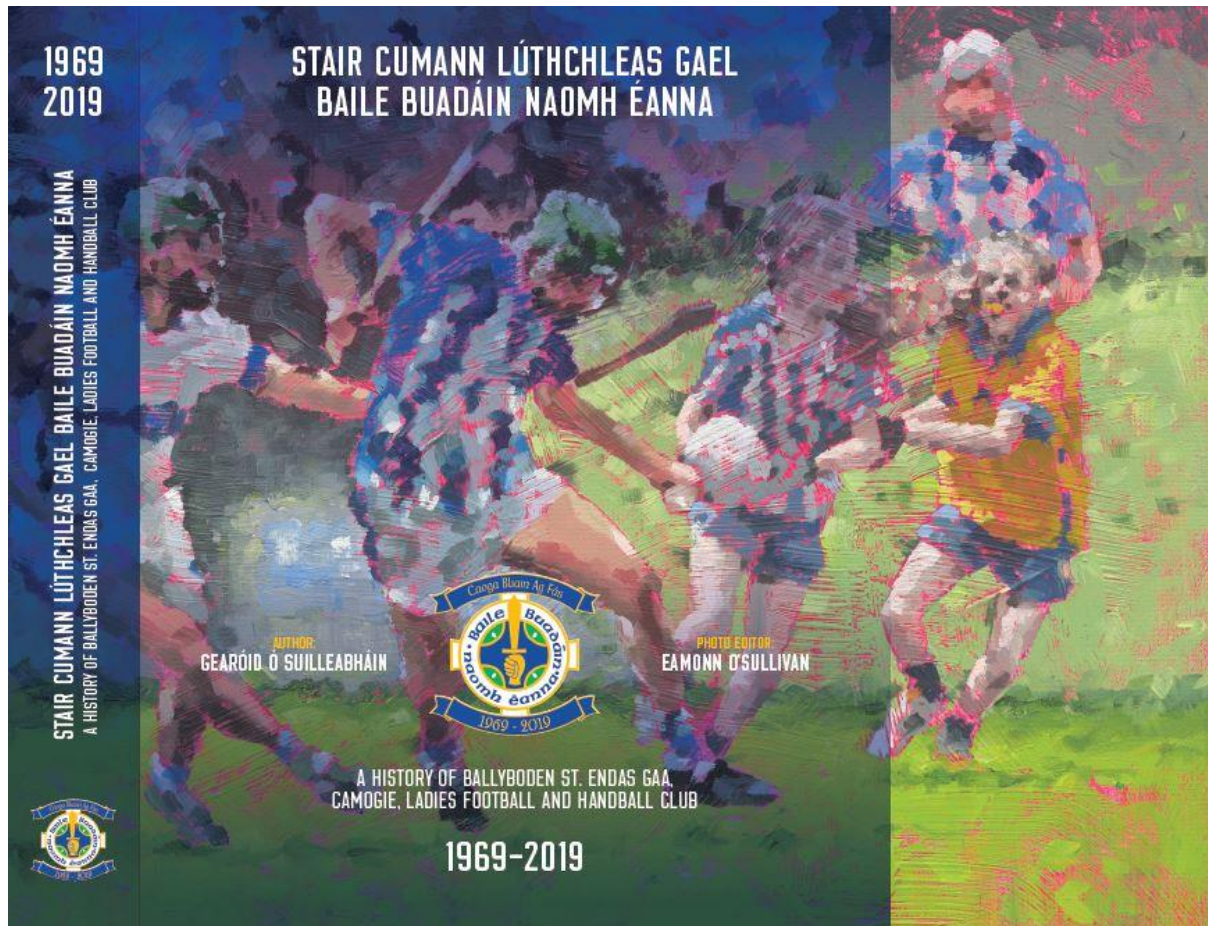

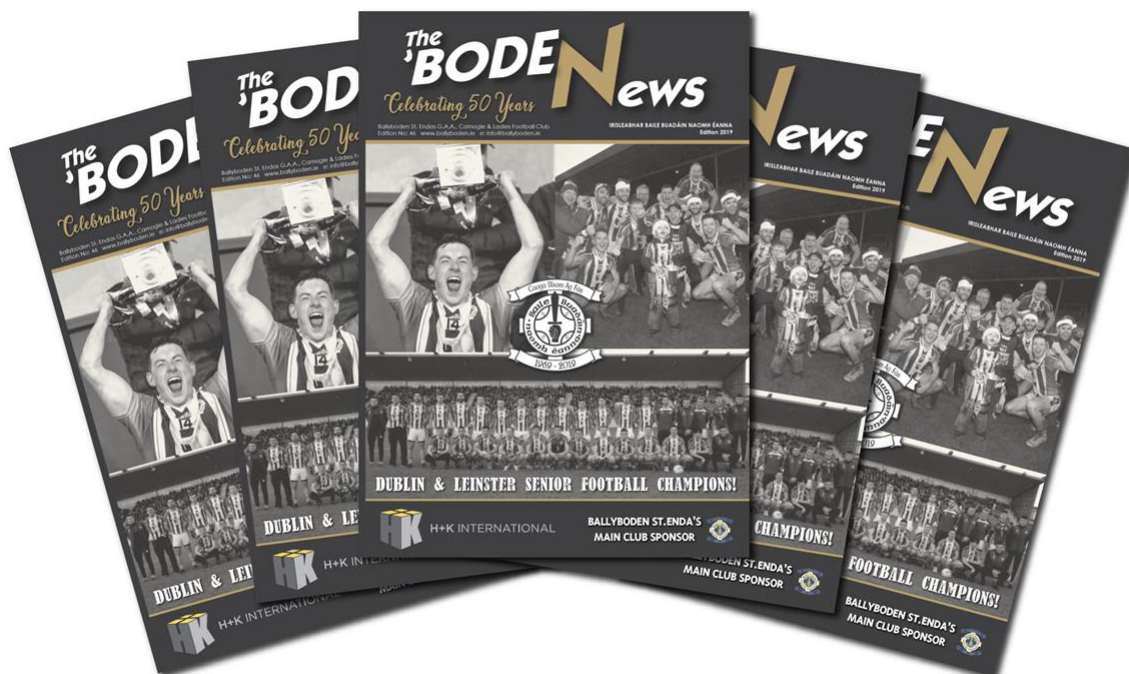

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

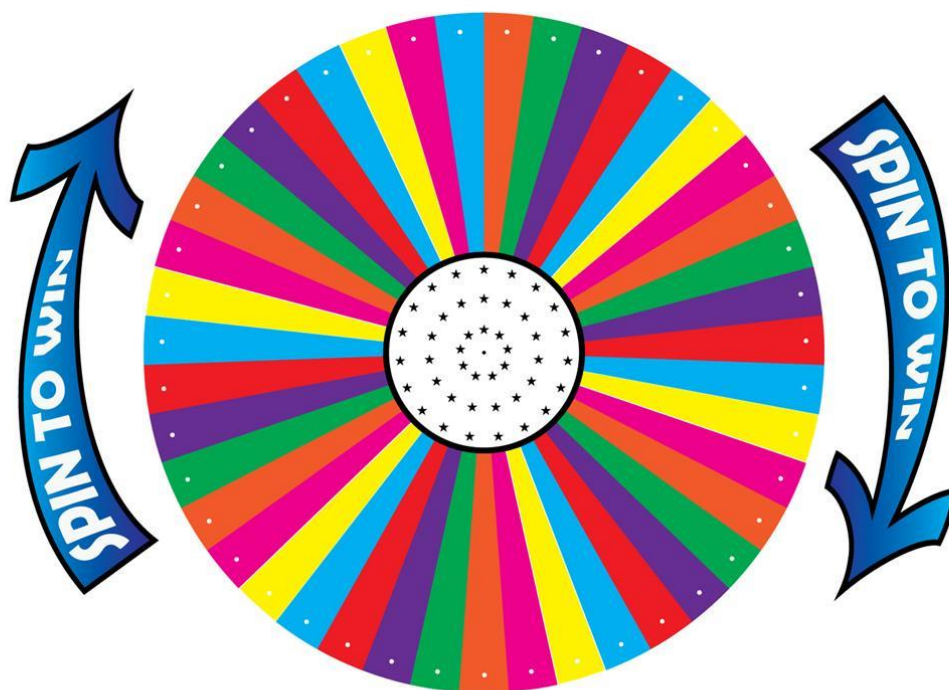
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
