

Senior A Hurlers Fall Short in Competitive County Final



Cuala 2 20 Ballyboden St Endas 1 18

Our senior hurlers faded out of the county final at the business end of a hugely competitive contest at Parnell Park on Sunday afternoon. Their final quarter tally of just a brace of points from Aiden Mellett and Niall Ryan was no match for the defending champions tally of 1 05. Boden actually led their Dalkey opponents when referee Sean Stack restarted the game with just a quarter to run. Cuala effectively closed down on Boden's attackers and deprived them of scorable ball. Credit must go to the Cuala defence where Cian O'Callaghan was hugely effective.

The game opened brightly for Boden with three excellent points from play off the hurleys of Ryan, Conor Dooley (a monster strike) and a classy strike from Paul Ryan. The latter gave a quality performance over the hour from play and 'dead balls'. However, it was his cousin Niall who was most effective from play on the score-sheet. Boden's good play continued with Paul again on the mark from out wide (a Conal Keaney pass) followed by Mellett, a tasty strike. With the score difference at three points, enter Cuala's Sean Moran on a thundering run and a final unstoppable shot to the roof of the Boden net. Game tied! The remaining scores for Boden in the first quarter fell to Ryan from placed balls responding to a Jake Malone point for Cuala - Boden led 0 08 to 1 04.

The quality of Boden's play improved on resumption and they opened up a decent lead by half-time of four points. Of course this lead could have been better were it not for the

concession of a brace of late Cuala scores from their big men Con O'Callaghan and Mark Schutte. Boden's goal-man Finn McGarry showed his blocking skills with a good bat-away from Cuala's Colm Cronin. Niall Ryan, Dooley and Keaney all pointed and Mellett proved an elusive customer by getting ball-in-hand into the Cuala square only to be pushed over and earn a penalty. Keaney was the goal scorer after he reacted to the rebound – 1 11 to 1 06. The quarter continued with the Ryan cousins slotting an excellent brace before the concession of late Cuala scores. HT 1 13 to 1 09.

The first signs of a Cuala revival came early in the second half with David Treacy making his presence felt with scored frees. Boden's Paul Doherty came to the rescue with a fine point from the stand side-line. There followed a whole series of scrums that probably came out 50/50, but the telling point that must be made is that Cuala were now better closing out the space for Boden scores. Over the quarter Boden only raised three white flags and it was Ryan that was the scorer of a brace of frees that just kept the Boden in front.

The less said about Boden's final quarter disruption to the score-board, the better. The Cuala men stepped up the pace of the game and with Keaney and team Captain Simon Lambert forced off early, the writing was on the Donnycarney wall that the champions would prevail. Con O'Callaghan scored a goal with defenders hanging out of him, only for the referee to ask free-taker Sean Moran to place the ball on the penalty spot. The goal laid the foundation for the Cuala win. Boden had a few late chances for goals, but the Cuala defence held out. Schutte and O'Callaghan used their considerable strength down the middle to unsure that Boden were kept at bay.

Of course the club will be disappointed by this loss, but it must be stated that Cuala are worthy champions once again. Boden's poor second half allowed their opponents back into a game that appeared to be slipping away from them once they opened up a decent lead. Cuala showed a better eye for the goal-posts by only being wide of the target on two occasions. On the other hand, Boden notched up ten wides over the hour. Of the Boden players, perhaps Niall Ryan proved the most effective over the hour. On Cuala's side, the placing of Sean Moran at corner forward made a significant contribution to their attack.

DUBLIN GAA STATEMENT- LEVEL 3 COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS

FRI, 18TH SEPTEMBER 2020

A Chara,

I wish to advise that as a result of the Government's decision to move to Level 3 Covid-19 restrictions, all Minor Club games scheduled for the duration of Level 3 restrictions have been postponed.

This includes all Minor Championship, Cup and challenge game fixtures. The CCC will reschedule outstanding fixtures as soon as possible, subject to Dublin Minor and Under 20 inter-county Championship fixtures.

All Adult games remain ON (behind closed doors). Clubs using pitches in DCC Public Parks should note that the City Council has closed their pitches for all activity until we return to Level 2 or lower.

The other three Councils have not made us aware of any pitch closures.

Clubs affected by the closure of their home venues in Public Parks must concede home advantage where their opponents have a venue available.

Big victory for Intermediate camogie in Championship Final



Boden secures its first Intermediate Camogie crown in 19 years after a titanic battle

"Good things come to those who wait "– 16th century proverb attributed to Fane. Yes, hard to believe but up until last Sunday the last Intermediate Camogie title won by the club stretched all the way back to 2001.

From the start of this season, this talented bunch set out ending that hiatus and achieved it in spectacular fashion after a pulsating affair in Abbottstown.

The final played in dry, chilly conditions was billed as the clash of the titans as both teams had justifiably finished 1-2 in the Group stages of the Inter 2 competition, Ballyboden holding a slight edge going into the final after defeating Whitehall during the latter part of the group stages.

But, as the game started, it became clear that Whitehall had not come to play second fiddle to our young team and set down a marker with a score in the first minute. The tackling was fierce yet fair and in an extremely competitive and tight first half our girls found their range with three unanswered points from Hollyn Kennedy, Erica Tobin – the score of the game – and a fine effort from Ciara Lambert , only to see that lead pegged back by a late first half reply from Whitehall. The match was very much in the balance at half time.

The first 15 minutes of the second half will be long remembered by our girls, the mentors and the 3,500 viewers who watched the game streamed live on Facebook with the audience including supporters and some ex- players tuning in from the UK and Belgium.

Most finals can hinge on one crucial moment, not this one! Every score was going to be vital in this tight encounter and Whitehall struck very early in the second half with a very well

finished goal to strike a dagger into the heart of our team who had up until that point only conceded two goals in the whole campaign and had never been behind at any stage in any of their previous matches. Two points behind and the momentum was with Whitehall. Our backs were up against the wall.

What happened after that was quite remarkable as our defensive line Orlagh O'Shea, Yvonne Gargan, Clodagh Delaney, Sadhbh Nic Mhathuna, Anna O'Shea, Robyn Flynn and Erin Christie repelled everything and anything that this well drilled Whitehall team, which was filled with quality throughout their forward line, threw at them. For the remaining 25 minutes incredibly, we conceded just one score and that from a free. The stoic endeavours of our backline was the backbone for our pending comeback.

As Whitehall began to look to hold onto their lead the determination and energy of the Barnes sisters at midfield, Aoife and Ciara, and the ever-increasing influence of Olivia Meagher – who deservedly won Player of the Match - began to play dividends. The team set about bravely to eat away at the Whitehall lead with the battling qualities of Ciara Barnes leading to a half chance for Hollyn Kennedy – who had now moved into the full forward line after an inspired switch by coach, George O'Shea. Hollyn duly converted the opportunity, and this was shortly followed by a fine score from Barnes herself. Our tails were up , back on level terms and with the water break approaching the team produced the finest period of camogie of the final just when it was needed most as precise and clever passing across the width of the field instigated by Olivia Meagher ,with Chloe Murphy and Julie Vaughan heavily involved, yielded two more chances for Hollyn to slot two further terrific points, we were up by two .This final was on a knife edge, the last 15 minutes would decide the destiny of the Inter 2 crown . Would the 19-year wait be ended, or would the trophy reside on the Northside?

And once again, to Whitehall's credit they were not finished, and fought back valiantly to score just after the water break, five minutes left, and one point between the teams. Our girls set about their response and duly did our great club proud as they simply refused to lay down, they would not be defeated.

With untold bravery they secured a 45 after a good effort by Erica Tobin and won a close in free with Julie Vaughan being fouled as hurls flew everywhere, both chances expertly converted by Hollyn. And yet, with only seconds to go Whitehall launched one final attack but we were not to be defeated and as our backs stood strong, the referee blew the final whistle. The Inter 2 Camogie Championship was finally back in the hands of Ballyboden St Enda's and the win represented the first ladies senior, intermediate or junior title in Camogie for the club since 2015.

In a very special moment for the team, Ciara Lambert (captain) asked both Rachel Walsh and Lucy O'Shea – both of whom have contributed enormously to our success - to accept the trophy. Covid Practice - Update

As a club, we have been very diligent regarding implementation of measures to ensure the safety of spectators and players, and this has been as a result of hard work and effort by many, many people who have been tracking player check-ins, stewarding games, providing signage and sanitiser, ensuring a safe environment etc. This has been tremendously hard work on top of the normal effort to train and prepare teams and compete in games, and we have received compliments from referees and opposition mentors as to the quality of the preparation and precautions taken at games.

As the numbers of cases reported increases across the country, we must remain steadfast and diligent in implementation of the protective measures and procedures. Can we especially:

- Continue with health check-ins before every session
- Continue to sanitise equipment used after every session
- Avoid car-pooling to training or games. If car-pooling cannot be avoided and members of different households must travel in the same car, then masks should be worn.
- Encourage all club members and players over the age of 16 to download the HSE app to their phones as this is hugely helpful for tracing in the event of a scare.

- Continue to insist that all players bring their own water bottle to training and matches. Shared water bottles must not be used.
- Check-in to the GAA app to confirm health status should be done on the morning of an evening session or the night before for a morning game or session.

Many thanks for all your efforts up to now - let's continue to be diligent to ensure that we can complete our full programme of games in a safe manner.

We would encourage all of our dub members to check in on elderly neighbours and vulnerable people in our community, and especially older club members who live close by.



violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
