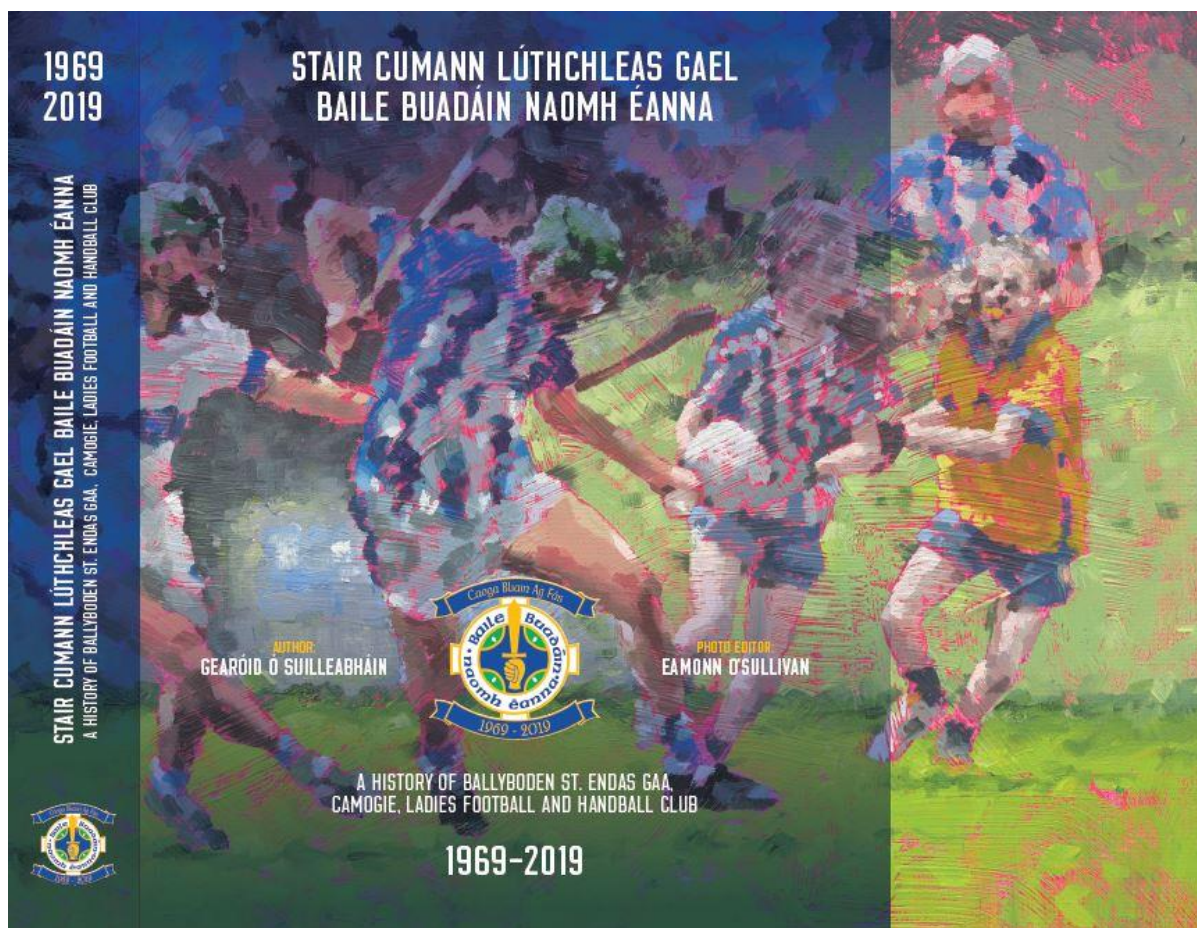

End of an Era



We have experienced many unforeseen changes in 2020, and it is a year that will be remembered in history for a long time to come. A further significant change in the life of Ballyboden St. Endas will occur when our club General Manager of 17 years, Noel Sheridan, will retire at the end of October. Noel has been a constant figure of kindness and consistency in the club for as long as most of us can remember; he has been the foundational rock on which much of the good things that have happened in the club have been based; Noel always has time for club members, and, no matter how much his patience was tested, he never spoke a bad word about anybody. Noel's wisdom and sound judgement have been of great help to me in my time as chairman as it has been to those who went before me. Whenever we needed to test an idea or a suggestion, we could be sure that Noel would give a considered response based on his unique insight and years of experience. No job was too big or too small for Noel to take on, and he has been the glue that held the administration of the club together since he took on the role of General Manager in 2003.

Of course Noel's contribution to Ballyboden St. Endas long predates his taking on the role of GM. Kathleen O'Sullivan identified a Kilkenny man with daughters as a prospective camogie coach in the Hermitage in 1982, and what foresight she displayed in her choice! He managed camogie teams that won Junior and Intermediate championships as well as being a selector on Junior, Intermediate and Senior hurling teams with championship success at Junior and Intermediate. Noel served as Secretary of both the Camogie and Hurling sections and was Chairman of the Social Committee, in which role he was instrumental in organising the famed St. Patrick's weekend trips around the country. Noel has served on the club Executive under at least four chairpersons, where his calm, organised, facilitative manner has exerted a huge influence over Ballyboden St. Endas during all of those years. It was my privilege and honour to recognise Noel's singular contribution to the club through the presentation of a Gradam an Chathaoirleach at the Gala event last year as part of our 50th anniversary celebrations.

Thankfully, this is not the end of a road but simply a turn and a change of direction as Noel has committed to continue his immense contribution as a volunteer once Covid restrictions and his health allow, and we look forward to seeing him back on the Firhouse road before long. In the meantime, Noel is always available at the end of the phone to provide advice, information or simply for a chat.

We would like to thank Noel for his enormous contribution to 'Boden, and, of course, we thank his wife Rose both for her own work in the club and for her support to Noel and for lending him to us over the past 17 years. Thanks also to Noel's family, and especially his daughter Aideen who regularly lent her expertise in formatting and submitting monthly accounts. Once current restrictions are lifted, we will find a way for club members to acknowledge Noel's unique contribution to Ballyboden, but for now we wish him all the best as he steps down as club General Manager.

GAA Covid Update.. 5ú Deireadh Fómhair 2020

The GAA's Management Committee has today endorsed a decision to suspend all GAA Club games at all levels with immediate effect and until further notice.

The decision has been taken in the interest of public safety following a number of incidents that have been brought to our attention in recent days. In particular, post-match celebrations and a lack of social distancing at certain events have proved disappointing and problematic.

This directive applies to all ages and all grades across the island.

Club Social Centres / bars are also to close.

Training will continue to be permitted as per the guidelines outlined for the relevant levels in the Government's National Framework for Living with Covid 19 and relevant guidelines in the Six Counties.

The GAA will continue to monitor the situation in the coming days and weeks, regarding changes in government guidelines, before liaising with our units accordingly.

The Association would also like to acknowledge all of those units who have worked diligently in complying with the public health advice around the staging of our games and training sessions since activity resumed.

More than ever, we ask that you continue with this approach where training sessions for your players is continuing.

Ladies senior A footballers continue their goal fest

However the score of the game must surely go to our captain and centre half back Jenny Walsh whose goal will be remembered for a long time to come. Picking up a loose ball on the 40 metre line, she headed towards goal but was being policed away from danger by the Cuala defence only for her to suddenly take a shot “ Messi like” with the outside of her right boot to amazingly lodge the leather into the bottom right hand corner of the net.

Covid Practice - Update

As a club, we have been very diligent regarding implementation of measures to ensure the safety of spectators and players, and this has been as a result of hard work and effort by many, many people who have been tracking player check-ins, stewarding games, providing signage and sanitiser, ensuring a safe environment etc. This has been tremendously hard work on top of the normal effort to train and prepare teams and compete in games, and we have received compliments from referees and opposition mentors as to the quality of the preparation and precautions taken at games.

As the numbers of cases reported increases across the country, we must remain steadfast and diligent in implementation of the protective measures and procedures. Can we especially:

- Continue with health check-ins before every session
- Continue to sanitise equipment used after every session
- Avoid car-pooling to training or games. If car-pooling cannot be avoided and members of different households must travel in the same car, then masks should be worn.
- Encourage all club members and players over the age of 16 to download the HSE app to their phones as this is hugely helpful for tracing in the event of a scare.
- Continue to insist that all players bring their own water bottle to training and matches. Shared water bottles must not be used.
- Check-in to the GAA app to confirm health status should be done on the morning of an evening session or the night before for a morning game or session.

Many thanks for all your efforts up to now - let's continue to be diligent to ensure that we can complete our full programme of games in a safe manner.

We would encourage all of our club members to check in on elderly neighbours and vulnerable people in our community, and especially older club members who live close by.

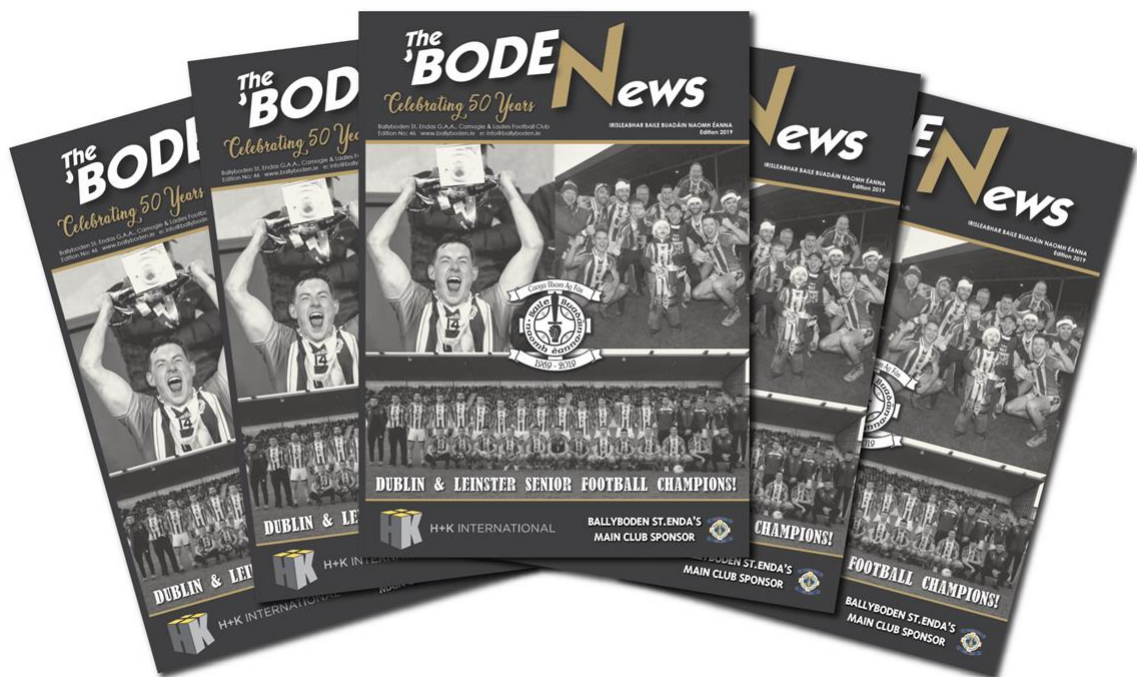
Our adult player's committees would also like to volunteer their assistance to support any member of the community who is unable to leave their house.

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

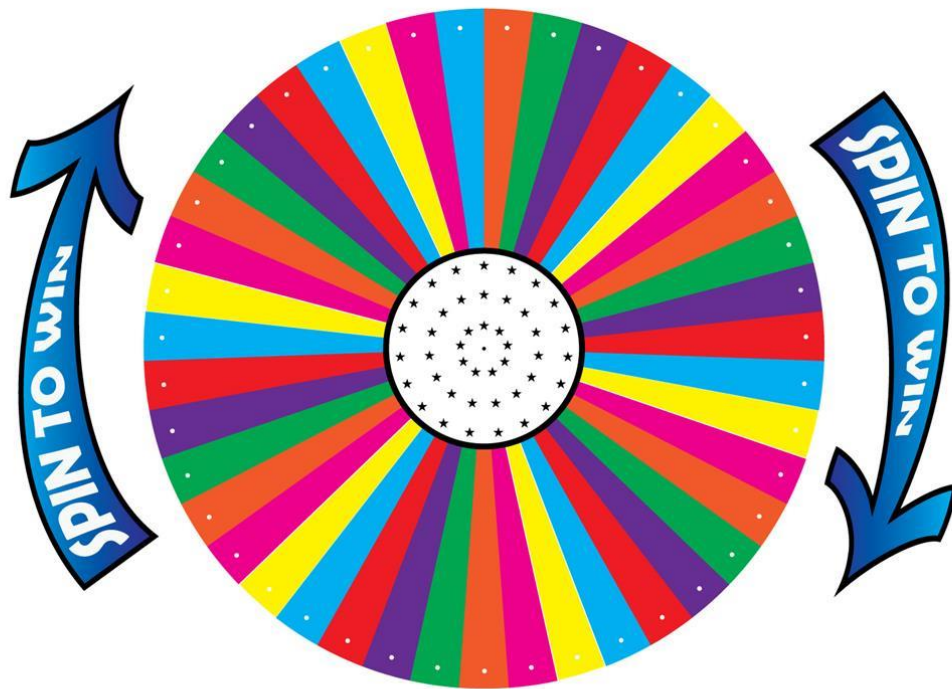
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
