Home league win for Boden Senior hurlers whets the appetite for the season



Ballyboden St Endas 2 22 Cuala 0 18

An early scoring blitz from Ballyboden paved the way for a comfortable win in the opening round of the new season league. By the first water-break the home side had notched up 1.08 to the visitors tally of just four points. The goal was well worked off the back of some effective play in the middle third. The final ball came from full forward Paul Doherty to the raiding Luke McDwyer who dispatched his shot wide of the reach of Cuala goalman Cormac Spain. McDwyer used his 'loose' role to good effect and also contributed a brace of points. That said, Boden had two other very fluent performers in corner-man Niall McMorrough and midfield speedster Aiden Mellett. McMorrough's first touch and elusive movement proved a menace to the Cuala defence and over the hour he contributed 1.06 as well as laying on many useful passes to better placed team-mates. One of these led to Niall Ryan splitting the posts for one of the best scores of the game. Boden's better workrate was best typified by Conor McKeon and he got his just reward when he pointed to make the score four to one. The early possession was mainly controlled by Boden with Seanie McDonnell and Mellett pressing all the right buttons from mid-field. In defence Captain Shane Durkin teamed up

well with Simon Lambert and Paddy Dunleavy to prevent ball from getting to Cuala's front line and thereby set up plenty of opportunities for the Boden forwards. Over the hour all six starting attackers chalked their names onto the slate, with perhaps the best roars of support coming from team-mates when debutant Eoin Behan pointed in the second half. Cuala worked off limited scoring opportunities with perhaps Jack Lahart, Eoghan O'Callaghan (yes, another one of that clan), and Emmett Murphy showing best for them.

Into the second quarter it was obvious that Mellett was relishing his new role in the midfield and he used his pace to open up plenty of space in the scoring zone. His partner McDonnell was heavily involved in a five pass movement that eventually reached McMorow. His shot to the onion-sack proved unstoppable. The score now stood at 2.13 to seven points and bar a collapse from Boden the game was as good as over as a contest. Boden's scoring range eventually included all players from the half-back line up whereas Cuala were expending a huge amount of energy chasing down raiding Boden forwards as well as Mellett. In defence Boden's goalkeeper Conor O'Donoghue showed lightning fast reactions to thwart at least three goal-bound shots and found useful support from the full-back line of Stephen O'Connor, Dean Curran and Rob Leddy. The latter found himself in a forward role on one occasion, but realising that he was surrounded by scoring forwards, he released the pass to add further to Cuala's woes.

In the dying embers of the game, Cuala went after goals and eventually were awarded a penalty, however with O'Donoghue having already advertised his stopping abilities, the Cuala shot was well wide of his reach, but too wide to be captured by the net. Both sides did well on placed balls with Paul Doherty a steady marksman for Boden.

Next up will be the fixture with Faughs on July 1st at 19.30, affording an opportunity for some late refreshments at the 'Surgery' under the management of Mick and his busy staff.

The only clouds on the horizon on Sunday were those forecast by Met Eireann. Half-time couldn't come quick enough in order to regroup and it was a surprise to all that we were only one point behind at the restart and about to play into a stiffening breeze. Lucan weren't given a chance to

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
