On a very windy day in Dalkey the seniors had a convincing win to bring this year's COVID half league to a close, unbeaten.

Playing against the strong wind, Aran Waters had the ball over the bar inside the first minute. Darren O'Reilly added another three minutes later before Cuala got their first. Despite the wind, Boden got the next five points, three from Conal Keaney (1 free) and two from Warren Egan (1 free). Cuala got two back (1 free) before Conal added another pointed free. The home team had the last score of the half in added time leaving the score 0 – 8 to 0 – 4.

Almost from the throw-in, Conal Keaney had the ball over the bar with the aid of the wind. By the 11th minute Conal had added three more from play while Warren Egan added two from frees with Cuala yet to score. The home team had a goal attempt cleared off the line by Shane Clayton and a minute later their plight was worsened when Michael Darragh Macauley caught a high ball in midfield that eventually reached Darren O'Reilly

bearing down on goal and he finished to the net. Cuala got their first point of the half from a free, but Conal Keaney quickly cancelled this out. The Dalkey side then had their best spell with three pointed frees in succession. Conal Keaney and Mikey Dunne added points for the visitors, but then Cuala managed to beat the Boden defence and finished to the net. Simon Lambert (from a 45) and Alan Flood got two points back as normal time was up. Cuala managed two more points in added time with Conal Keaney adding to his haul with the last score of the match from play.

This win was not sufficient to achieve a place in the league final as three draws earlier in the campaign meant we dropped three points. Crokes only dropped two points, coincidently to Boden, and are now in the league final.

The final 2021 league game took place on Saturday 7th August in Ballyboden HQ, Páirc Uí Mhurchú. Despite the date the conditions were more akin to autumn - heavy blustery showers and a stiff breeze blowing into the Cremorne stand.

The pitch was in immaculate condition even after two games in the inaugural Brendan Moran tournament.

After the recent losses of players to injuries it was great to assemble something approaching an intermediate football team. The return from long-term injury of Jack Lambert was most welcome as took his place in the starting lineup. He would go on to make a robust contribution indicating that all the pieces had been reassembled in the right order - thank God for that.

Making his debut start in the corner was young Davey Keane. Again another valuable and calm contribution that belied his youth (and paternal DNA, sorry Pat).

Playing with the aid of a stiff breeze Boden opened brightly. Movement was good, communications were good but the radar was faulty. Johnny and Eoin were solid creating a barrier for the opposition and a launching pad for Boden. In the middle Conor and Tommy contested and controlled the central exchanges.

Despite owning the ball in the opening half the score was 8-4 in favour of Boden. Luke, Davey and Emmet were lively, benefitting from the movement and cleverness of Bagsie,

Dillon and Enda. Even Truck got on the scoreboard. Emmet was lively and threatening. Leachie had worked his socks off but the recent time off was taking its toll.

Following a couple of changes at the break with Mark and big Joe entering the fray Boden again started brightly tapping over a couple of scores. The visitors now with the aid of the breeze finally woke up. Pressure increased as the gap was narrowed. Gillo entered to replace Jack who had an impressive return to play. Between Josh, Gillo and Conor they managed to deny visitors easy chances and protected the goal well.

The game was levelled at 12 points a piece at the final water break and very much in the melting pot. Young Sweeney made an appearance, the son of a Donegal man replaced a native Donegal man. His ball carrying abilities were crucial in the final quarter. Boden had stared into the abyss of defeat before and decided it wasn't going to happen today. 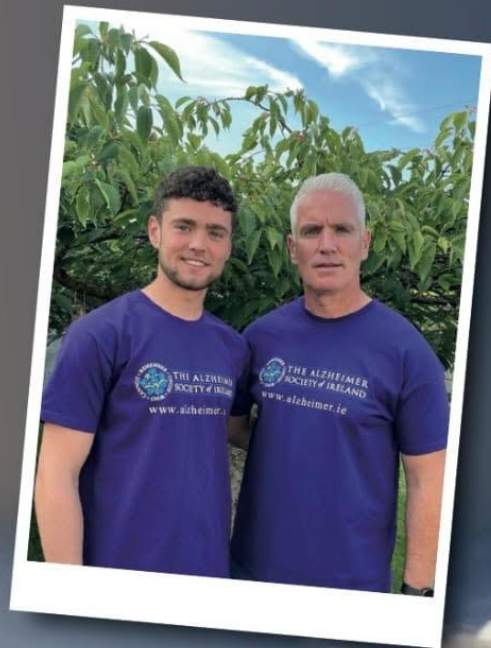

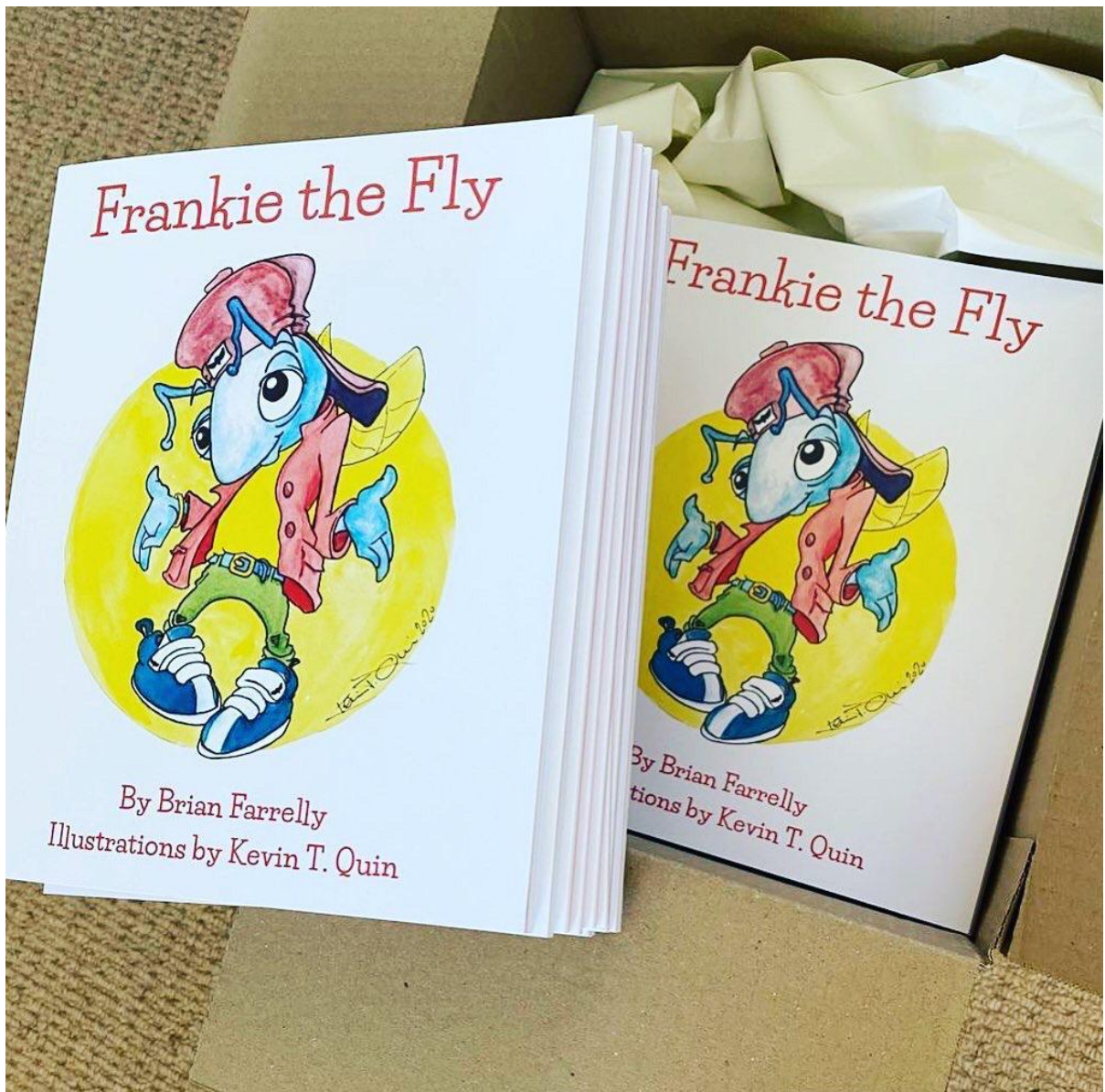

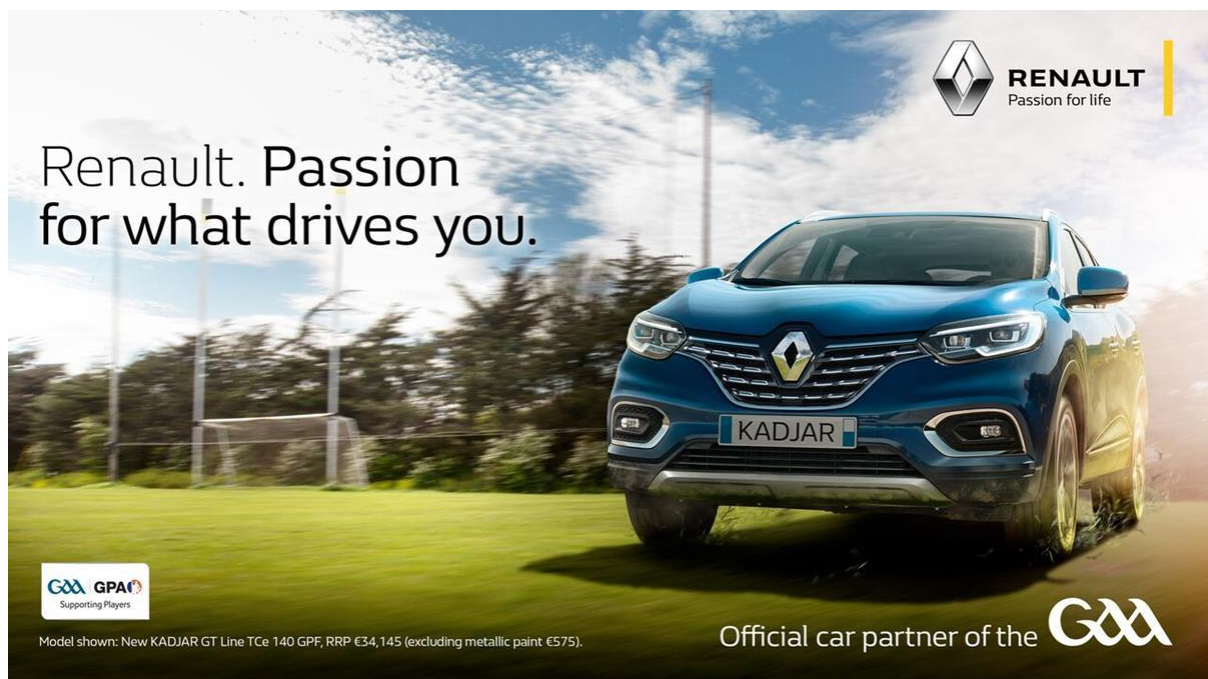

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

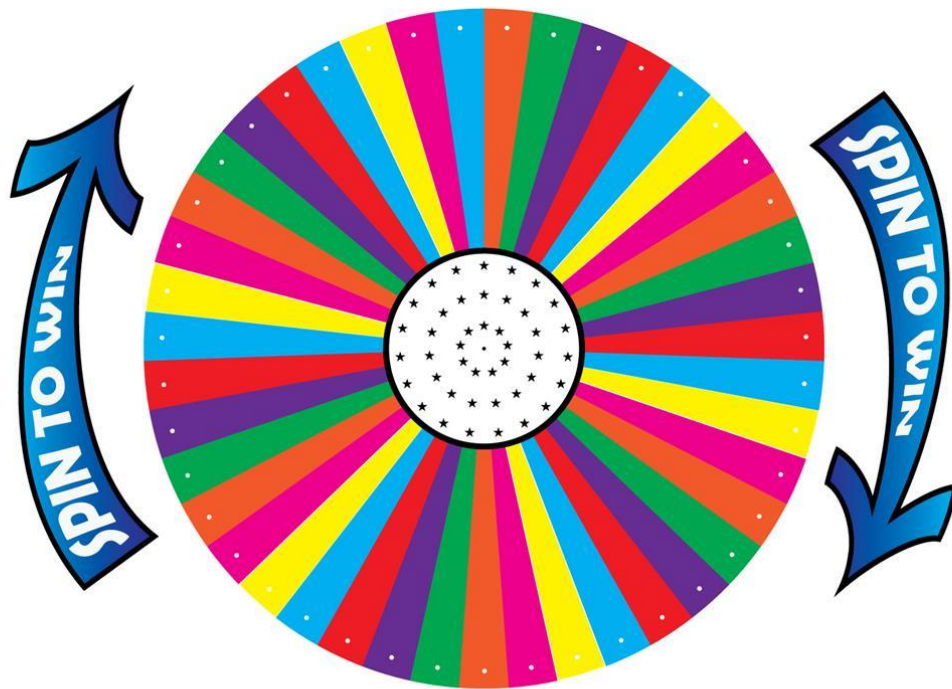
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
