A letter from our Club Chairman Ciaran Maguire follows:

Fellow Ballyboden St. Endas Members,

The Club Executive would like to wish all of our members a very happy and safe new year. Gaelic Games, at both club and county level, were one of the few normal activities which helped us all through 2020 and players, mentors and supporters enjoyed the opportunity to play in a safe environment when lockdown was lifted. As we look ahead to the uncertainty which will undoubtedly continue into 2021, we can only hope that we will soon be able to get back to playing, training, watching matches and socialising together soon.

As you can imagine, the drop-off in revenues from sponsorship, fundraising, bar and rent due to lockdown, has impacted severely on us in Ballyboden St. Endas as it has on all sporting organisations across the country. At the same time, many of our costs for registration, insurance and maintenance remain fixed which meant that the club ran at a deficit for 2020. There is considerable uncertainty about our ability to raise funds and earn revenue for at least for the first half of 2021. For this reason and in order to help with cashflow and keep the club running at the level and standards we have come to expect, we ask all of our members to pay their 2021 membership fees as early as your personal circumstances allow. As always, if members are experiencing financial difficulty, they

can speak in confidence with their section registrar, and a suitable arrangement will be made.

The strength of our community and spirit will bring us through this pandemic, and we will emerge even stronger when it is all over – níl tuile dá mhéad nach dtránn.

## **Appeal for new Referees at Adult and Minor levels.**

Dublin GAA Appeal for new Referees at Adult and Minor levels

Please see message below from the County Board seeking new referees. Anyone interested in signing up for the referee course should forward their details to [secretary.ballybodenstendas.dublin@gaa.ie](mailto:secretary.ballybodenstendas.dublin@gaa.ie) before Friday 12th March.

As you are aware, in anticipation of the lifting of current Covid restrictions, CCC is preparing for the season ahead. This year (2021) we have received a significant increase in the number of teams entered in our competitions across both codes at Adult and Minor levels with a significant number of clubs entering more teams than any previous year.

With the increase in teams, combined with withdrawals due to Covid fears, age, etc. comes an additional requirement for new referees. We are already operating with insufficient referees and this increase in teams will put even more pressure on CCC being able to appoint referees for all games.

Without an increase in referee numbers CCC will be unable to guarantee referees for all games in the coming season.

CCC plan to run a Foundation (Beginners) Course as soon as Public Health advice allows.

### **Improving your Irish in the next 6 weeks**

Many of you may have thought about improving your Irish but are not sure how to make a start. The first thing you need to do is schedule some time, ideally three to four 40-minute periods per week. For those with Leaving Cert Irish, even if that was many years ago, a great free learning resource is Vifax. With about 6 weeks to go to Lá le Pádraig, and still in lockdown, now might be a good time to give it a go. If you schedule three to four periods per week, after 6 weeks, a lot of the Irish that you thought you had lost will come back to you.

### **How does it work?**

Vifax don Ghaeilge is a FREE resource for Irish language learners which is run by Maynooth University and it is available seven days a week. It consists of videos and snippets as well as lessons based on Nuacht TG4 which are put up on Maynooth University's website every week.

It is available online both nationally and internationally and according to statistics gathered by Lárionad na Gaeilge there are a great number of people from the United States of America and the United Kingdom using the system. For the last six months an increase of 64% has occurred in the number of users due to the emphasis on learning online.

### **How to get started:**

Ideally study with one other person.

Open the Website <https://vifax.maynoothuniversity.ie/>

Click on the link An Chartlann (The Archive)

Choose a topic.

Decide on a level Ard (Higher) Meán (Middle) or Bun (Lower)

Once you press on the level, you are brought to a PDF document that you can download. At the bottom of the document is the script from the accompanying video. You can listen to the video and read the script at the same time. The document has a series of questions based on the script that you can attempt. When you are finished the questions, you can check your answers in the document.

Keep a notebook and jot down any new phrases.


If you are lacking a bit of confidence, start at the Bunleibhéal

If you have a 'Good' or 'Very Good' standard of Irish, the Ardleibhéal or Meán leibheál will provide a challenge for you.

**Tip of the week:** Read the instructions and the script out loud. When you have listened to the video a few times and followed the script, try reading the script out loud a couple of times yourself.



## Covid Practice - Update

As a club, we have been very diligent regarding implementation of measures to ensure the safety of spectators and players, and this has been as a result of hard work and effort by many, many people who have been tracking player check-ins, stewarding games, providing signage and sanitiser, ensuring a safe environment etc. This has been tremendously hard work on top of the normal effort to train and prepare teams and compete in games, and we have received compliments from referees and opposition mentors as to the quality of the preparation and precautions taken at games.

As the numbers of cases reported increases across the country, we must remain steadfast and diligent in implementation of the protective measures and procedures. Can we especially:

- Continue with health check-ins before every session
- Continue to sanitise equipment used after every session
- Avoid car-pooling to training or games. If car-pooling cannot be avoided and members of different households must travel in the same car, then masks should be worn.
- Encourage all club members and players over the age of 16 to download the HSE app to their phones as this is hugely helpful for tracing in the event of a scare.
- Continue to insist that all players bring their own water bottle to training and matches. Shared water bottles must not be used.
- Check-in to the GAA app to confirm health status should be done on the morning of an evening session or the night before for a morning game or session.

Many thanks for all your efforts up to now - let's continue to be diligent to ensure that we can complete our full programme of games in a safe manner.

# Concussion Management

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out


Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
