Coming in from convincing opening wins in the competition, two of the top guns in Dublin hurling met on Thursday evening on a carpet of perfect turf with a balmy temperature of 20C. What should have been a competitive contest eventually petered out to an easy win for the home side. Referee Tom Tansey blew his first whistle for a solemn minute of silence in memory of dedicated clubman Noel Madden. His memory was very much in the thoughts of the assembled support.

Boden set out their game-plan from the second whistle and opened up a lead that they were not to lose. Four quick-fire points came from Gavin Corrigan, Corkman Tom Mullins (Rob Leddy and Naoise Maguire providing the links), Corrigan again after Leddy found him, and Jonno Driscoll after Maguire laid on the pass. Crokes replied with a fine point from their top marksman Michael Roche. Boden kept the pressure on with Fionn Maguire on the mark followed by Finn McDonagh after Kenny Wigglesworth laid on a long pass. Crokes were not without chances and may have been unlucky not to goal from a brace of chances. But perhaps that was their undoing over the hour, with their consistent pressure for green flags. They did close the margin between the sides to just a brace by the water-break with Alex Carroll, Conor Galvin and Roche raising white flags. Boden's solitary addition came from Mullins. 07 to 05.

With the referee letting the game flow, Mullins created his own space for his third point. O'Driscoll raided into Crokes rearguard but he found goalkeeper Sean Garvey in top form and the goal opportunity went abegging. Naoise was in top form in defence and he flashed a great point over the black-spot, double scores 10 to 05. Roche and Naoise then exchanged long-range points. Corrigan confirmed Boden's dominance with a classy point from outfield, Leddy heavily involved in the creation. Half-time score 12 to 07.

The third quarter was somewhat scrappy, but that did not bother Boden's goalkeeper Conor

O'Donoghue with a double save from Crokes raiders. Mid-field man Eoghan O'Neill for Boden was showing up well in the engine-room and he completed some good play with a fine point. Carroll replied for Crokes, but the end-game was well in sight for Boden and O'Driscoll set about closing the game out with the first of a plethora of fine scores over the remaining third of the game. O'Neill and introduction Mattie Weldon became providers to Corrigan and McDonagh who both contributed to 17 to 10 lead going into the final quarter. O'Driscoll showed some economic touches to create a bullet of a goal and he was followed by Aaron Coffey with his own green flag. Crokes tried hard to close the gap but points from Roche were well matched by O'Driscoll and Shane Kennedy.

Over the hour Boden never looked in trouble with their better touch and overall game-plan. Crokes tried hard for goals but they found the Boden last line of defence of Reddy, McCarron and Wiigglesworth hard to breach with Adam Jermin also in particularly solid form. Naoise, Corrigan and O'Driscoll competed well for the game's MVP, but perhaps the fairest summation was that this was an efficient team performance.

Ballyboden were unable to hold back a spirited second half fight back from Civil Service on Independence Day at Memorial Park on Sunday last. As we assembled amidst the early morning walkers Boden would have felt that they could have continued as they had left off 2 weeks previously when they accounted for a strong Kilmacud outfit.

As some of the curious strollers looked on Ballyboden hurtled into the match and by the first sos uisce they had a useful lead of 0-8 to 0-3. This trend continued throughout the first half and with some sweet scores the away side took command. The highlights of this half were a couple of beautiful strikes from Denis Callanan, his first struck over from somewhere near Kilmainham Hospital, a great score from corner forward Adam Fischer while giving his marker a run around the park, a further Liam MacPhaidin point from way over on the left hand side, while a monster score from young Cian Hassett even had the buggy joggers gasping in awe. Ballyboden were full value for the half time lead of 0-13 to 0-6.

With no breeze to contend with on a rather humid morning it was a case of seeing out the second half. However, the public servants roused themselves throughout the half and slowly got themselves into the game. The turning score was a goal from the hosts right on the stroke of the second water break. It was the turn of our two U15 hurling teams to fly the flag for Ballyboden on Sunday as they travelled to take on Kilmacud Crokes and Cuala GAA. Our A team were playing in the Hurling Div 1. Qualifying League Round 2 against Crokes at Silverpark. With the reward of two points for the victors and a step closer to qualification for the play-offs both teams were prepared for a battle. It was clear from the early play that this was going to be an intense and tough encounter. The hosts, despite facing into the wind, got off to the better start and were quickly setting the pace. Our lads were under constant pressure but eventually got up to speed. Two quick goals brought the scoreboard back to level and with the benefit of some really good play, Ballyboden pushed ahead opening a gap of 7 points to lead 3-7 to 1-6 at the halfway mark. Two quick goals by Kilmacud followed by a brace of points put them back in the driving seat. Our lads kept going and at the water break the game was evenly balanced with 1pt in favour of the home team. The last quarter was a sheer battle of wits and skills where despite heroic efforts by Ballyboden the hosts eventually took full points on a score line of 3-17 to 4-10.

The B team played against Cuala B on a very narrow, dry and dusty pitch at Thomastown Park. This meant that much of the play was centred on a line running from goal to goal, which made it difficult for both sides to create free-flowing chances. Playing with the breeze at their backs in the first half, the BBSE boys struggled to build up sufficient scores to put distance between themselves and Cuala, who played some deft hurling to keep themselves in the game. 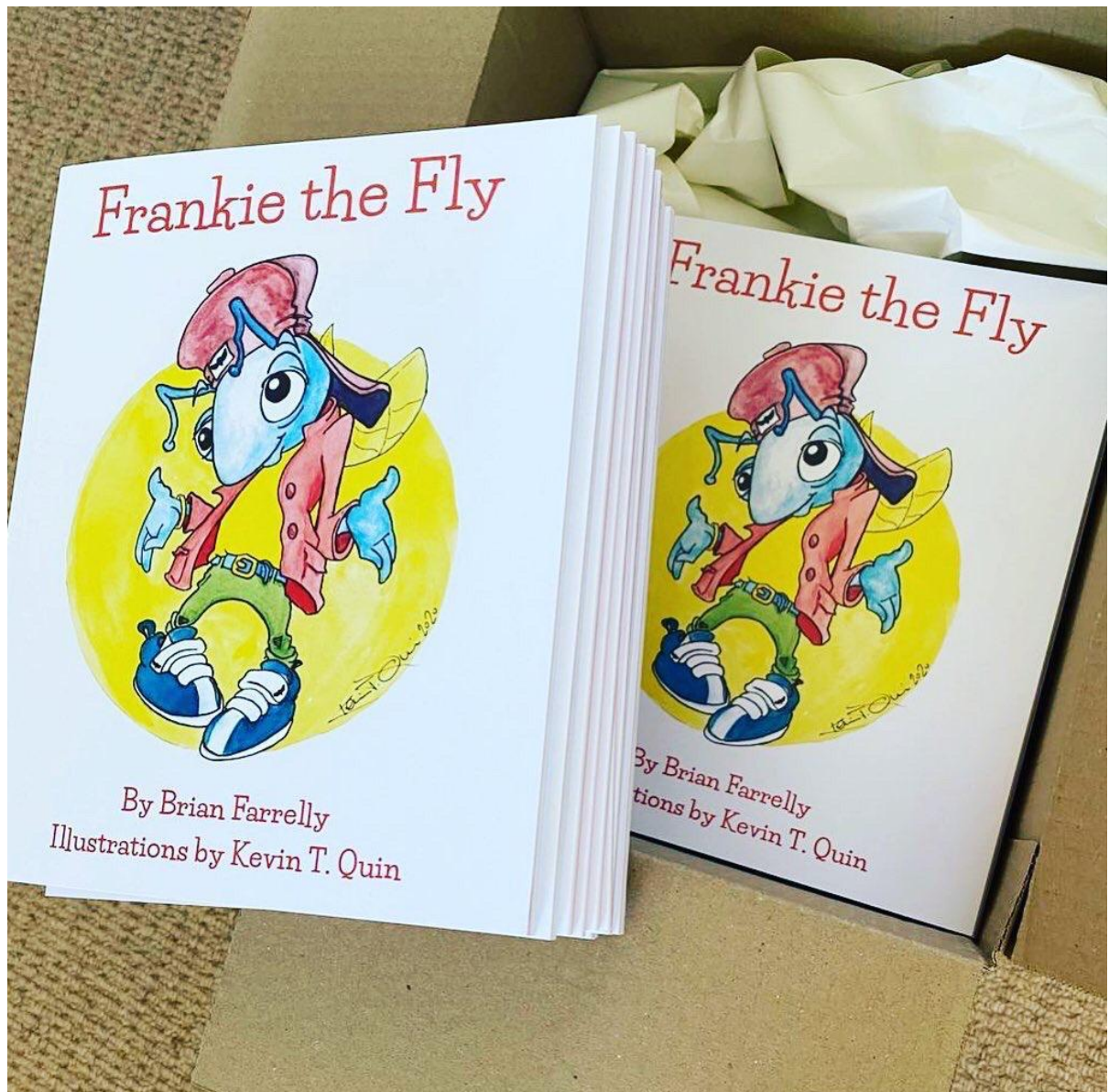
Home vs Foxrock Cabinteely

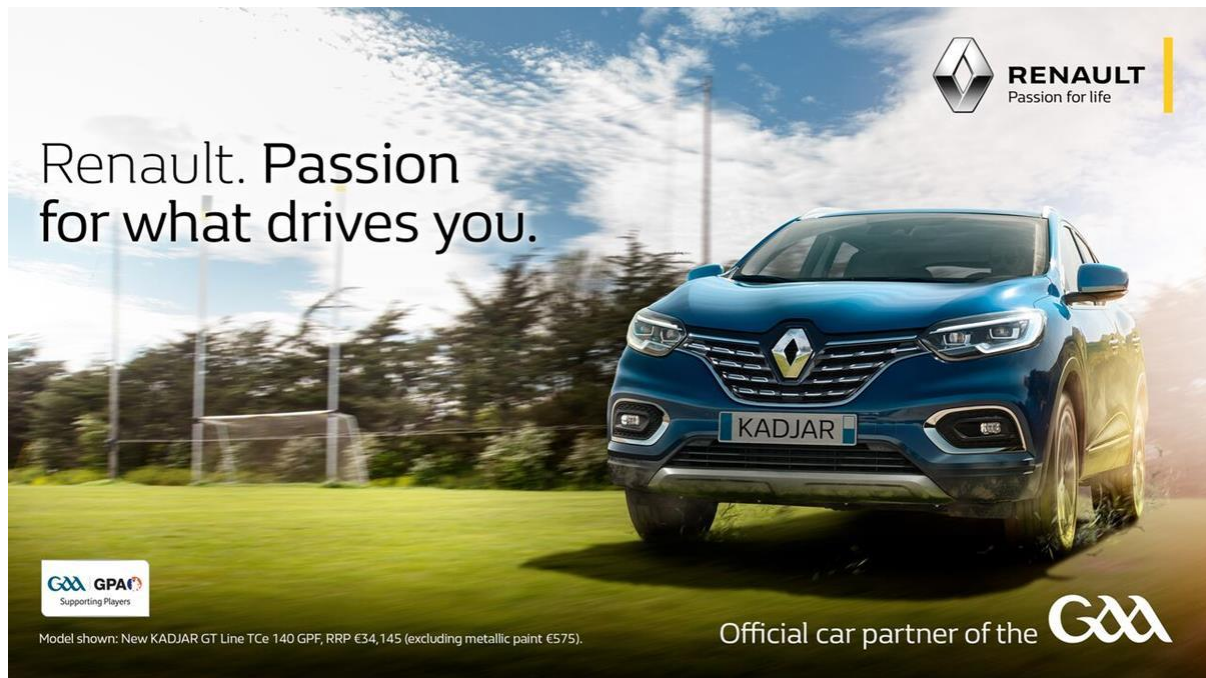

If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
