With his first start, Ryan O'Dwyer scored his first point as a senior footballer followed by another free by Warren Egan. Davis's equalised again with two points (1 free). Ryan O'Dwyer got Boden back in front with a point but the visitors again equalised from a free. The decisive score of the half then arrived with just three minutes to half time when Boden were awarded a penalty. Warren Egan made no mistake, to put a goal between the sides. However, Davis's did not give up and scored two more points (1 free) to leave just a point in it at half time, 1-5 to 0-7.

The 2nd half started with a bang. Almost from the throw-in Warren Egan got possession and headed straight for goal. He clearly had only one thing on his mind, and he unleashed an unstoppable shot to the corner of the net. Four minutes later he converted a free for a point. On six minutes Darren O'Reilly was heading for goal but was pulled down. Ciarán O'Reilly converted the free to give Boden a two-goal lead. However, the visitors hit back with a goal of their own on ten minutes. Declan O'Mahony converted a long-range effort but Thomas Davis's responded with three points in a row (1 free) to leave just a point between the sides with full-time approaching. A match that started brightly developed into a dogfight with Boden maintaing a marginal advantage throughout the latter stages of the game.


There was welcome cameo appearance from rising stars Mark McNamee and Harry Donaghy; both of whom acquitted themselves with aplomb.

Battle of the Ballyboden sees St. Enda's Junior A's pip Wanderers



After a day and evening of torrential rain, the Junior A's swam up to Ballyboden Wanderers' temporary home in St. Columba's College. 


The defibrillator is located on the external wall of the Clubhouse, between the Tribe coffee station and the bar emergency exit double doors.



violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
