The wait is over - Minor A Football Champions 2020



Gizmo reports from Parnell Park

After a ten (well, eleven) year wait, Ballyboden St. Endas have been crowned 2020 Minor A Football Champions for only the 7th time in the last 51 years. "It's a great night for the lads and just reward for all their hard work and commitment" said an ecstatic Liam O'Dwyer. He went on to say, "It was a tough battle in humid conditions, but they didn't panic, stuck to the plan and got what they deserved. Drinks are on me" which is completely out of character as he is so miserable, he wouldn't tip you in a game of chasing.

Omens:

For the heathens amongst you, there were several omens hanging over this fixture which may give you reason to profess that the result was written in the stars. (Ye could do with a good Latin Mass, that's all I'd say.)

- 1. Mentor and forwards coach Andy Kerrin, was part of the 1998 Minor Football Championship winning team, when the final was not played until 1999.
- 2. The last time Boden lifted the Fitzgerald Cup was in 2010, the final was also not played until the following year.
- 3. The captain of the 2010 team, has a cousin playing with this current team.
- 4. 18th August 2021 is World Beer Day, and everyone knows that mentor Maguire all too frequently worships at the altar of Arthur Guinness. Stop, I've said too much.

So, for believers in Fate, the universe was realigning around the Firhouse road.

Tough Start:

Following a delayed throw in, the game started at a ferocious pace. Each team traded points in the opening 7 minutes, the pick of the bunch coming from Kenny off his left peg. Byrne and Keane were creating havoc within the Ballinteer defence and they carved out a 1 on 1 that saw the Ballinteer net minder produce a fantastic save. "The momentum seemed to swing to Ballinteer when they netted the opening goal," said defensive coach Jack Donaghy, who has all the charm of a war crime. He went on to say, "although we went to the water break 4 points behind, we reiterated the plan and each individual's role."

Comeback:

Early 2nd quarter frees from O'Dwyer and Byrne set the tone for the next 15 minutes. Constant pressure from midfield duo of Colclough and McDonald, ably assisted by the industrious Behan, led to a defensive mix up between the goalkeeper and centre back which was pounced on by Byrne, as he palmed the ball into the back of the net. The noise from the travelling support could be heard back in Knocklyon and visibly lifted the team. "There is a lot to be said for that 16th man tripe, there may actually be something in it", said rotund water boy Declan Maguire, "We stuck on 1-4 and restricted Ballinteer to just 2 points in those 15 minutes." Impressive statistics from the numerically dyslexic Maguire, particularly when he owes you a few bob.

Turning Point:

Leading by a solitary point entering the 2nd half, the Boden defence were expecting a backlash, and it duly arrived. Mulligan-Lynch, Maguire and Gannon were unflappable and soaked up wave after wave of attack. But 3 quick fire Ballinteer points had them back in the driving seat by two. Sick of defending, the half back line of O'Sullivan, Donaghy and Gavin took matters into their own hands and decided to carry the ball into the forwards. One of these lung bursting runs, set up O'Dwyer to neatly finish into the bottom corner of the Ballinteer net. The resulting forward press (I haven't a clue what that means either) saw

multiple turnovers and kick out errors, one of which fell to young Keane, who coolly placed the ball beyond the 'keeper's reach. The crowd went wild. Football chairman Jack Nolan, who was looking like something you would see strapped to the front grille of a bin lorry, said "There is an incredible maturity about this team. The calmness and composure that they go about their business is a credit to them and will stand to them in future years. There's no palaver"

Finish the job:

With a six-point lead going into the final quarter, Boden didn't sit back, they went for the jugular. Like a Springer Spaniel on the 1st November, Sweeney and Keogh smelt blood in the air and terrorised the Ballinteer defence. Their only answer was to concede free after free. Wing back Gavin found himself in the 'Butter Zone' late on and dropped like a shot seagull when he was hacked to the ground by the Ballinteer keeper. (It kept physio Eamon O'Reilly busy and, let's be honest, he could do with the exercise). The resultant penalty was dispatched by Byrne and that put the game beyond doubt. The introduction of Hassett, O'Halloran and McGlynn added to Ballinteers woes, as the fresh legs and footballing cuteness allowed Boden to keep the ball and only make line breaking runs when necessary. This was enough to see out the game and collect the crown of Minor A Football Champions.

Reaction:

After the game, we caught up with club chairman Ciaran Maguire, who, like a fat version of Kim Jong-Un, is clinging onto power at the head of the Ballyboden family. He said, "That was a good game." Truly insightful stuff. Administration has always been that man's calling. Club veteran and academy co-ordinator for this 2002 group, Tony Hassett spoke at extreme length about......well, I'm not quite sure what he spoke about. I'm not saying Tony is boring but after talking to him you are warned not to drive or operate heavy machinery. We also ran into Mentor Liam O'Dwyer, a fine footballer and a gentleman. I spoke to all three of them and they didn't have much to say either.

Reflection:

As the lights began to dim around Parnell Park, it gave this hack time to look back on the journey, covering the trials and tribulations of this group of players. The wins, the losses, the expectations, the realities, the smiles, the tears, the hard training, the lashing rain, the freezing cold, the glorious sunshine, the fights, the feuds, the laughs and the craic. Only then did it dawn on me......it actually wouldn't have mattered had we lost the game tonight, because 26 babies in 2002 have become fine respectful, fun-loving gentlemen that are an absolute credit to their families and to Ballyboden St. Endas. And that, in itself, is the real big prize.

So, like a 16 year old Alsatian heading for the vets, we have finally come to the end of the road. It's been a blast.

Na Fianna Prevail in Senior Hurling League Final Joust



Ballyboden St Endas 0 17 Na Fianna 0 22 Long Fella Reports from Parnell Park

"At least we stayed dry", a wry throwaway comment from a somewhat underwhelmed Ballyboden supporter perhaps summed up Saturday evening's performance at a poorly supported Parnell Park. Of course the weather's behaviour meant zilch to the Fianna support when stood against their side's showing with Boden, their conquerors in last year's championship knock-out stage and the previous year's league final. Purists might have been more judgemental, in that the overall hurling display was way short of what might be expected just days away from the commencement of the championship. Na Fianna can celebrate their league win with some pride, but they should reflect that their opponents fielded a young side and without several experienced first fifteen regulars.

The opening quarter was very much a "getting to know you" session when coupled with some economical use of the whistle. Recent signing Dublin's Liam Rushe set his stall out with an early charge into the Boden defence, but the final pass failed to produce a score for the Glasnevin men. However, within a minute fellow Dub Donal Burke had opened the scoring with a Na Fianna point. Bodens Niall Ryan went on one of his trademark runs only to see his shot wide of the target. Team-mate Conor Dooley profited from a Shane Durkin pass to level matters. Ryan then became provider with a lay-off to Dooley and the lead for Boden. By the seventh minute Na Fianna were level when Colin Currie bagged the first of his several points for Na Fianna. Na Fianna then raced into a lead of three with points from Burke twice and a fine effort from A J Murphy. Boden responded with Shane Kennedy in for a brace and an absolute smasher of a point from Niall McMorrow. Score at 5 each.

The second quarter was very much Na Fianna's when they raced into a four-point lead. Martin Quilty, Sean Baxter and Burke provided the points to stretch their tally to twelve. Burke's second point of this period was perhaps the score of the game, he operating in the tightest of spaces to get his shot away. Boden were more subdued in their showing and only had Kennedy, Simon Lambert and again McMorrow with a superb effort when appearing to lose control of the ball. HT score 0.8 to 0.12.

The third quarter was very broken with a series of injuries as well as some sloppy turnovers. Currie and Burke were Na Fianna's best performers, with the former scoring three quality points. Comically for some, but unhelpful to Boden's cause, the umpires (neutral) disagreed on a score, only to have the referee decide in the negative. In the heel of the hunt, Boden only had Dooley (three frees) and Aiden Mellett to thank for scores. The game was now taking on

a very defined picture, with Na Fianna sticking to the old Kilkenny style of making the ball do the work. Boden became converts to the modern Cork running game, with mixed results. Three quarters had it at 18 to 12.

The final chapter was very much Boden's, with no easy explanation for Na Fianna's near collapse in the possession stakes. Boden had up to four great chances for goals, including a penalty which, in fairness, was excellently saved by Eoin Skelly. On any other day perhaps one of the chances would have raised the expectations of the Boden following. Luke McDwyer took over on the frees and converted his share as well as pointing from play. He also had one of the goal chances but with the difference at four, his shot went narrowly wide. The following play produced the insurance point for Na Fianna and left Boden ruing the misses. Another Boden man to make his mark was Conor McKeon and his point came off some good pressure in the middle third. Lambert had a late chance for a goal but his blast with the boot went wide. He had earlier converted a fine effort from outfield to cancel a point from the in-form Currie.

All in all this was Na Fianna's day and they well deserve their silver. Boden will regroup in advance of the championship where Plunketts await, fresh from their earlier victory in the second division final. Manager Malachy Travers will be somewhat buoyed up by the late showing of his young charges as well as the way the side fought back against physically stronger men. Dooley was always involved as well as James Roche in defence, an unusual role for him. McMorrow showed his class for the limited time allocated to him.






The defibrillator is located on the external wall of the Clubhouse, between the Tribe coffee station and the bar emergency exit double doors.



violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
