First-half goals from Shane Kennedy and Aidan Mellett put Ballyboden St Enda's on their way to victory over St Oliver Plunkett/Eoghan Ruadh (4-19 to 1- 16) in Friday night's Go-Ahead Dublin SHC Group 4 encounter at Parnell Park. Shane Kennedys goal came just before the first water stoppage which pushed his side into a 1-5 to 0-4 lead.

Good anticipation by Boden full-back Luke Corcoran intercepted a long ball down the terrace side and he switched the play crossfield to his keeper Finn McGarry, the netminders long delivery was brilliantly judged by Niall McMorrow who slipped a pass to his corner-forward team-mate who made no mistake from ten metres.

Ballyboden had opened impressively with the first five points of the contest through Conor Dooley (two, one free), James Roche and two from Niall Ryan. Dooley had also missed a penalty.

However, points from Cillian Hayes (two), Niall Arthur and Jack O'Shea saw Plunkett's reel in their opponents before Kennedy's three-pointer.

Boden held the upperhand in the second quarter and had moved seven points clear before Aidan Mellett showed great pace to score Bodens second goal in the 27th minute. He added a point from halfway immediately after and suddenly the Firhouse Road side were 2-10 to 0-6 clear.

By half-time Malachy Travers; men were 2-13 to 0-8 ahead and at the start of the second period Conor Dooley, who tallied 0-9 (0-8f) overall, converted a free before Pearse Christie hit Bodens third goal following good interplay between

James Madden and John Maguire to make it 3-14 to 0-8.

In the 52nd minute Cian Boland scored an excellent individual goal when coming in from the terrace side before firing to the net.



The Senior Camogie Championship campaign got off to a great start, with a win at PUM last Sunday morning.

A tentative opening 15 minutes saw Boden taking some time to get up to the tempo of the game, as Faughs were full value when taking an early lead. Boden however, began to get into their stride and, sustained pressure on the Faughs defence led to a number of frees for Boden which Sarah Nagle pointed.

Faughs did set up some attacks of their own but were kept at bay by a strong defensive performance and sound goalkeeping from Sile Ni Coitir. Two fine points from Katie McDonald saw Boden leading by 5 points, 0-7 to 0-2, at half time.

Boden continued to pick off points early in the second half from Jodie White, Áine Rafter, Doireann Mullany, and Katie McDonald. Faughs responded with two points of their own. Any ideas of Boden having it all their own way were dispelled when Faughs scored a goal from a high ball into the square which was doubled on, into the net. This narrowed the margin to just five points.

A sunny Pairc Ui Mhurchu played host to Round 1 of the Minor A football championship encounter between Boden and the Mobhi Road boys. Just 18 days after our 2020 success, the first of 3 teams looking to make their mark on Group B and our young men.

Na Fianna certainly were not long showing, that the 2021 championship is a whole new ball game, bringing intensity and hard tackling to PUM. The Boden lads were more than up for the fight. An early score from David Keane settled the team into the game, and this was followed by good work and an equally good score from McDonald. There were ferocious turnovers and blocks flying in everywhere with excellent defending from the Boden rearguard.

Na Fianna got the next 3 scores before two pointed frees brought us back into the game. The Boden dominance lasted up until the end of the quarter.

The last quarter saw Na Fianna fight back into the game but a great team move saw Duggan finish to the net to complement an earlier point. Keane got another towards the end of the game to give our guys a 5 point win. Next up is a trip to Tymon North for the Spawell Derby against the Old Enemy on Sunday 18th @11am.


U9 hurling boys in action at Go Games



violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
