Senior footballers off to winning start in Championship

Three young players made their senior football championship debuts in this first match in the round robin series, Harry Donaghy, Paddy Dunleavey and Luke O'Donoghue. In the early minutes, both sides showed patience in the build-up and also missed some chances before Aran Waters broke the deadlock in the 7th minute with a fine point. On the 10th minute Raheny drew level and went ahead in the 14th minute. As the first water break approached, Alan Flood passed to Ryan Basquel and he popped over the equaliser. In the 6 minutes after the game resumed, Boden added four unanswered points. First, after a good run, Warren Egan fed Alan Flood and he scored. Then, Warren himself scored a point. After Aran Waters was fouled, Colm Basquel converted the free. Finally, Conal Keaney put Boden four points ahead with a well-taken point. While Raheny added three points (1 free), Ryan Basquel finished the scoring with a break-away point to leave two points between the sides at

half time, 0 – 7 to 0 – 5. Things might have been very different if it wasn't for some great defending by one of the debutantes referred to earlier. Harry Donaghy, who won a 2020 county minor medal just a few weeks ago, made a great catch after five minutes to prevent a good goal chance for Raheny. Then, on three further occasions, he cleared the ball off the line, diverting one of them over the bar.

Paddy Dunleavey, replaced Donagh McCabe in midfield at the start of the second half with the job of marking Dublin senior player, Brian Fenton. The half exploded into life in the first minute. After Conal Keaney disposed a Raheny player, the ball fell to Alan Flood who fed Warren Egan and he rifled the ball to the net. While Raheny got a point back a minute later, Boden added another goal and five points before the 2nd water break, all from play. First up was Warren Egan with the fist followed by Ryan Basquel. Then, from a side-line kick near the halfway line, Cathal Flaherty found Colm Basquel further up the line near the 45-metre line. After he turned the defender, Colm showed a clean pair of heels as he carried the ball towards the goal before beating the goalkeeper with a good shot to the corner of the net. Conal Keaney and Simon Lambert (2) added further points to keep the score board ticking over before Raheny got a point back. Warren Egan added two more points and had another goal effort deflected for a 45 by the Raheny goalkeeper, which Darragh Gogan converted. Although Raheny added one more point to their tally, Colm and Ryan Basquel (free) completed the Boden scoring in added time.

There are a lot of positives in there and apart from the 'never to be spoken about', second quarter, we were actually not a million miles away". He went on to say, "Does anyone know what day of the week it is and, more importantly, where are my clothes?". I think the Benzo's were beginning to wear off.





If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
