As was expected, this turned out to be a very tough, competitive, championship game against the recently crowned league champions. Ryan Basquel had the first point after two minutes, but this was cancelled out two minutes later. The next three points were scored by Boden when Darren O'Reilly, Conal Keaney and Ryan Basquel all converted good chances. However, the next five points were scored by Na Fianna (2 marks) as they took control from the 10th to the 16th minutes. Ryan Basquel broke the sequence with a fisted point, but Na Fianna added three more to go four points ahead. As half time approached, Simon Lambert pointed but Na Fianna added another to restore their four-point advantage at half time, 0-6 to 0-10.

The third quarter was Boden's finest. In the first minute, after good work by Warren Egan down the right wing, he passed to Alan Flood who finished to the net with his left boot. Darren O'Reilly added a point in the third minute. Then in the fourth minute, Darren

O'Reilly was fouled by the Na Fianna number 9 who was shown a black card. Colm Basquel converted the resulting free. In the 8th minute, a long pass from Kieran Kennedy was caught by Colm behind the last Na Fianna defender. As Colm bore down on goal, he was brought to ground in the square. However, to the consternation and disbelief of Colm and all Boden players and supporters, the referee waved play on. In the next three minutes, Warren Egan, Conal Keaney and Ryan Basquel added points to leave Boden four points ahead. Just before the water break, Na Fianna got their first score of the 2nd half. They added two more in the 8 minutes after the break to bring the Boden lead back to one point. In the next five minutes, Ryan Basquel, Ross McGarry and Robbie McDaid added points. With time running out Na Fianna were looking for goals but good defending by Colm Basquel and an interception by Harry Donaghy protected the goal area. As time was almost up, Na Fianna got the last point of the match to leave three points between the sides at the end.





Important Notice: Firhouse Road /Ballycullen Car Parking

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.

SPIN THE WHEEL @ BODEN
