Wordsworth reports from O' Toole Park

As we walked across the field to the far side in O'Toole Park, more than one observer commented on the quality of the pitch – looking better than it had in years, with a beautiful cut of grass throughout. Bright sunshine and a stiff breeze were the conditions as the referee threw in the ball for this Group 4 Round 3 tie between Ballyboden St Endas and Scoil Uí Chonaill on 2nd October.

Boden started brightly with the forwards running hard at the Scoil defence. A pair of Niall McMorrow frees either side of a John Maguire goal gave them the perfect start. Further points were added by Conor McKeon and Conal Keaney. Any efforts by the Scoil forwards to breach the Boden defence were repelled, led by Shane Durkin and Dean Curran. The pressure continued and Boden got the second goal with a rasper from Keaney just before the first water break.

Further points followed with McMorrow accurate from the placed ball and a Kevin Desmond effort from distance. On the 20 minute mark Scoil registered their first score when their full forward pulled on a fine sideline puck from the left – a green flag was raised. Boden kept their shape and further points followed from McMorrow, Keaney and McKeon to leave the half-time score Boden 2-14 to 1-1 ahead.

Scoil started well in the second half and registered the first two scores. Substitute Niall Ryan picked off a nice couple of points following strong running into space This was Scoil's best quarter however and they added four more points by the second water break. Boden steadied at this point and some good runs from Aidan Mellett, McMorrow and McKeon drew frees. Mc Morrow duly obliged and Boden finished the match strongly to leave the final score Ballyboden St Endas 2-27 Scoil Uí Chonaill 1-7.

That's the end of the championship road for the Clontarf side while Boden now look forward to a quarter-final against holders Cuala. Boden abú.

Long Fella Reports from Pearse Park

The Boden boys left it late in this final group game for qualification to the knock-out stage of the senior B championship. It took a final quarter tally of 1.07 which almost matched their tally for the opening three quarters. Credit must go to a determined effort from Crumlin on their home pitch at William Pearse Park at Crumlin Village. Mind you there was another major factor in Boden's tardiness in securing the victory. They are guilty of huge waste, something that might even shake the confidence of Gretta Thunberg. Their opening half wide tally of eight trumped their point scoring of just five points.

With questionable support from a fresh breeze, Boden set out to dominate possession, something they did with credit, but spare a thought for Crumlin's better distribution. Where they (Crumlin) fell down was in the shooting stakes and were dependent on giant centre-forward Shane Ryan and inside men Philip Daly and Adam McGrael. Another Crumlin man to influence matters was centre back Conor Murphy. By the first water Daly and Ryan had pointed as well as a cracker from Boden's Fionn Maguire. But it was the brother Naoise who was showing best for Boden at the heart of the defence. His general mopping up of attacking ball kept the Boden attack fed with opportunities. A brace to three for Crumlin.

On resumption Boden's Mark Lambert had added from play to his earlier free, followed by another from the spot. By the half the sides were level after the visitor's Darragh Kenny pointed, matching a brace from Crumlin. There were signs that Boden were getting to grips with Crumlin, doing a 'Limerick' on them with swarming mid-field tackling, but the scores would now have to come from a second half against the wind. Five each. Boden's Eoin Behan showed well for a point to match the second half's opener from Ryan. In defence Boden's Conor Robinson and recent arrival from Thurles (Sarsfields) James Ryan were showing well along with the ageless Mattie Weldon, who rolled back the years with a work-rate matching team-mates half his age. The visitors Adam Jermyn roared into the game with one of the scores of the game, a high catch from the clouds followed by his shot from fully sixty metres. Kenny finished the period's scoring with a quality point. Nine to Eight in Boden's favour.

Introductions were to play a huge part in the final quarter scoring for Boden, but it was Weldon who showed leadership with a fine point. Then it was the turn of the first of the 'new' men Fergal Ryan who announce his arrival with a brace of real class, but these early scores were cancelled out by a poachers goal from Crumlin's 'Wheelo'. The second of Boden's arrivals Finnian McDonagh had a golden spell with a brace of quality as well as a significant assist. And then the goal for Boden finally gave them some head-room. Conor Kennedy and Eoin Behan swept down the whitewash to the narrow angles only to find Kenny upsides in a better scoring position. He out-ran the defence to the best spot before firing to the net out of reach of the goalman. He capped a solid performance with the final score of the game from fifty metres. In between Crumlin showed their determination with a fine run on Matthew Nolan's goal, but the attack came to just a pointed free after a 'muststop' tackle.

The Boden management of Ritchie Sweetman, Brian O'Shaughnessy and Simon Daly will be somewhat relieved to have gotten over this tough assignment, with some homework on the telling art of score-taking. For Boden Kenny was always prominent, as well as Weldon, Nolan, Robinson, Lambert and Behan, but Naoise deserves special mention for his calmness and general quality play.

Not to be deterred the boys came out flying and they quickly stamped their authority on the match with an early point, quickly followed by a goal. Our boys adapted to the conditions really well with fine free flowing football and crisp short passes. The scores kept coming and after the 1st water break they were completely dominant, going into half time leading 7-1 to 1-4. Despite playing against the wind Erins Isle put in a very strong 3rd quarter finding the net with a well-taken penalty. Wth injuries mounting Boden were forced to reshuffle the team. They quickly found their rhythm in the 4th quarter and ran out comfortable winners. A fine all round team performance which sets them up very nicely for their final game vs Kilmacud Crokes in two weeks. Our B team made the relatively long journey to the north County Dublin town of Rush to take on the locals from St Maurs. The strong westerly winds blowing straight across the pitch left little advantage from opting to play in any particular direction during the first half. Playing on home turf St Maurs settled into the match straight from the throw-in and seemed to win most of the contested possession in the early

encounters. Having conceded a few points, Boden then hit back, working the ball up through the lines eventually finding the back of the net. This set the scene for the rest of the first half with multiple points from St Maurs quickly cancelled out by goals from Boden. At half time our boys were only a point behind with everything to play for. Patrons parking vehicles are asked to park in manner that is respectful to the residents in the area and to those using the cycle lanes, bus lanes and footpaths.


- It is illegal to park on a grass verge, cycle lane, bus lane, double yellow lines, footpath.



violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
