Senior footballers qualify as group winners with Whitehall win and Raheny draw

On a sunny October Sunday, the senior footballers did enough to ensure that they qualified for the quarter finals of the championship. Whitehall were first to score from a free after two minutes, but Ryan Basquel equalised two minutes later after a good pass from Conal Keaney. Kieran Kennedy and Warren Egan added further points before Whitehall's next point after 17 minutes. Ryan and Colm Basquel scored a point each in the 18th minute to put Boden three points ahead. Another point by Whitehall from a free was cancelled out by a Colm Basquel free before Whitehall had the last score of the half, again from a free, as half time approached leaving Boden in front 0 - 6 to 0 - 4.

The second half was dominated by Boden, but they found it hard to score as Whitehall regularly had 15 players in their own half. Ryan Basquel converted two frees each side of an Aran Waters point before Whitehall got their only score of the second half on 11 minutes. The major score of the game came on 13 minutes when a Warren Egan fisted pass across the goalmouth was boxed into the net by Conal Keaney. In the final 10 minutes, Colm Basquel closed out the scoring with three points (2 frees) to see Boden safely into the knock-out stages.

Senior football championship replay v Raheny, Parnell Park, 6 October 2021

Ballyboden St Endas 2 – 9 Raheny 1 – 12

A simple error that resulted in six substitutes being played in the first round-robin match against Raheny, nearly proved very costly in this replayed match, which was ordered by the CCC in upholding a Raheny objection. Raheny seemed more focused from the start and were first to score with a point after 3 minutes. Kieran Kennedy responded following good work by James Holland. Raheny regained the lead two minutes later. Then, in a move that went the length of the field, Colm Basquel gained possession and buried the ball in the back of the net. The next three points came from Raheny to put them a point ahead with 20 minutes gone. Aran Waters drew the sides level again. Ryan (free) and Colm Basquel put Boden two points ahead as half time approached. In the space of a minute Raheny added a point and a goal. First, they were awarded a free on the 45-metre line but following dissent by a Boden player, the referee moved the ball forward to make it a simple free which they duly converted. The kickout that followed went out over the side-line. Raheny took the side-line kick quickly and worked the ball to the back of the Boden net. Aran Waters won the next kick-out and the ball reached Warren Egan and he made no mistake and buried the ball in the back of the net to leave Boden ahead 2 - 4 to 1 - 6.

The second half was cagey in the early minutes and on four minutes Conal Keaney increased Boden's lead with a well taken point. Two points in quick succession brought Raheny level again after 11 minutes. Three points in as many minutes from Simon lambert, Conal Keaney and Ryan Basquel seemed to suggest that Boden were taking control, but Raheny did not give up. On 18 minutes, Shane Clayton was on hand to clear the ball off the line with Darragh Gogan beaten. This seemed to galvanise Raheny into further action and they scored the next three points (2 frees) to draw the sides level on the 24th minute. Boden had a number of chances from frees to close out the game but were unsuccessful. With normal time nearly up, Conal Keaney converted a free to put Boden a point ahead. As added time dragged on, Raheny were awarded a free from around the 45-metre line and managed to score it to leave the sides level when the final whistle finally sounded to the relief of the Boden players, management and supporters.

"A very busy and sunkissed morning in Shanganagh Park was the venue for this Round 3 group match between our Minor A hurlers and their counterparts from Cuala. Both teams met in Pairc Ui Mhurchu during the League campaign, when the last strike of the ball ended up in the Cuala net giving the home team an unlikely win that day, so it is fair to say that the Dalkey club would be confident of leveraging that display and turning home advantage this time out into a reversal of fortune and put them into the shake up for inclusion in the knock-out stages. For Ballyboden, having a win and a loss on record from their two earlier games, a victory in Shankhill would guarantee their qualification. So, it was all to play for as far as both teams were concerned, and from the minute referee Donal Ryan threw in the sliotar at 11am, it was evident from the intensity from both sides that every player knew what was at stake.

A couple of early frees from Ballyboden settled the team and once they found their rhythm it was obvious that they weren't going to risk having their fate decided in the final minutes this

time out. The defensive unit looked solid throughout and had the measure of a lively Cuala attacking force, and displayed great discipline in the tackle and provided some purposeful ball for their own inside forwards, who likewise were causing problems for the Cuala defence with their constant movement and good decision making. Once they had established a lead by the first water break, it looked like they were in no mood to relinquish it, and for the rest of the match they built upon that start and had amassed a score of 3-20 when the referee's whistle blew for the last time. Clontarf conquer courageous Junior A footballers



Gizmo reports from the Junior A Championship

Not since the Spring of 1014 have the men of Clontarf found themselves entangled in such a do-or-die battle. Trading their horseback for horsepower, Clontarf arrived at dawn (that is genuinely true) in a fleet of Volvo's, Audi's and Tesla's, armed to the teeth with carbon neutral, chocolate mocha skinny lattes and fistfuls of gruyere & shiitake mushroom canapès. Brian Boru would be spinning in his tomb.

The game got under way just as the last of the vegan blinis with carrot lox were being polished off. Bookies favourites Clontarf were Junior A championship finalists in 2020 and were runaway winners of the 2021 Division 4 league title. This would require a gargantuan effort from Boden to upset the odds. Tony Duffy's charges took to the pitch wild-eyed and barbarian, like men plucked from the queue outside Copper's at 1 in the morning. As the game got underway, Boden stunned the visitors with their organisation and intensity, taking an early two-point lead courtesy of Weldon and a free from O'Dwyer. Football chairman, Jack Nolan, was so surprised the Botox fell from his face. Clontarf were staying in touch with the 'Wild Men of Ballycullen' due to the accuracy of their long-range point taking. Another free from the trusted boot of O'Dwyer along with a beautiful effort from play and this game was finely balanced. It wasn't until just before half time that Clontarf were able to unlock the Boden defence and raise the only green flag of the day.

Going into half-time trailing 1-5 to 0-4, we caught up with mentor Richie Connell for comment, "Our defence are busier than a cat burying shit on a hardwood floor but we are managing to withstand the pressure and creating some significant goal chances on the counter attack." Speaking to supporter and activist from the "Clontarf Liberation Front", Ceóla Shaver-Bouche said, "We just want independence from the Northside, be the new Monaco, if you will." When pressed about the game, she said "This is not going to plan. Those savages were supposed to just roll over, take their beating and be grateful for the experience. Now would anyone like to sign my petition to have Clontarf golf club exiled and renamed Donnycarney pitch and putt? We plan to capture Royal Dublin and rename it The Royal & Ancient Clontarf"

Shooting into the dressing room end and unusually, against the wind, Boden would need a big half of football. Following a well worked move from the throw in, wing forward and hat model Sean O'Donnell split the posts. The crowd went wild. Could they dare to dream? Will this be the upset of upsets? Will Gerry O'Sullivan be forced to re-write the 50-year history and include a chapter just for this game......Well, let's put it like this, as the half wore on it reminded me of a poem by Billy Connelly;

"Life is a waste of time, time is a waste of life. So get wasted all the time, and you'll have the time of your life."

Irrelevant? Maybe. But does it help skip an awkward 27 minutes of football? Definitely. After the game we caught up with team hanger-on'er, Declan Maguire, who may not be the sharpest tool in the box, but in fairness, he's still a tool. He said, "This was always going to be a big ask. It's a mark of where we are and the road we need to travel in order to compete at this level."

So as a content, if not somewhat rattled, Clontarf made their way back to their enclave, while offsetting their carbon footprint by planting a forest of trees between themselves and Kilbarrack, it marks the beginning of a period of reflection. As mentor Tadhg Cashman put it after the match, "It hasn't been a bad year. They won the league, blooded new players, and gained invaluable experience against two division 4 sides.". Inspiring words from the Kerry native.

So as the curtain comes down on the season and the quill and parchment get put away for another year, it only remains for this hack to point out that this group of young lads are the team to watch in 2022.

Patrons parking vehicles are asked to park in manner that is respectful to the residents in the area and to those using the cycle lanes, bus lanes and footpaths.


- It is illegal to park on a grass verge, cycle lane, bus lane, double yellow lines, footpath.







violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
