Senior footballers into county semi-final

Ballyboden St Enda's progressed to the last four of the Go Ahead Dublin SFC when comfortably overcoming Castleknock by 2-17 to 1-11 at Parnell Park on Sunday afternoon.

Last year's beaten finalists made a decisive move in the second quarter after a relatively even opening period in which Castleknock made their presence known thanks to points from play by Ben Galvin, Tom Shields, Conor Chawke and Rob Shaw.

However, their efforts flagged as the contest evolved, largely due to the effects of their playoff win over Ballinteer St John's on Wednesday night, and St Enda's too full advantage as they kicked six points on the bounce, with Warren Egan and Colm Basquel sharing four of those scores.

Darragh Warnock's smartly-taken goal in the 28th minute offered Castleknock some hope approaching the break but late points by dual stars Simon Lambert and Conal Keaney left Ballyboden in fine fettle at 0-12 to 1-5 by half-time.

Shields trimmed Castleknock's deficit within two minutes of the restart but they suffered a fatal blow soon after as the influential Aran Waters powered through to shoot low past the exposed Morven Connolly.

Any semblance of a contest was lost in that moment and with Ryan Basquel and Colm Basquel enhancing their personal tallies, St Enda's put further daylight between the teams with an excellent goal from substitute Ciaran O'Reilly in the 54th minute.

Boden will take on Kilmacud Crokes in the Dublin SFC semi-final in just under two weeks.

A very disappointing end to a promising season. An extremely dubious penalty decision converted by the visitors deep into injury time put paid to the hopes of the intermediate football team for another year.

This panel of players has developed and progressed over the course of the contracted season that it was hard not to believe that they were real contenders for a championship title. Starting with our three goalkeepers it was Mark McNamee who held the fort for the championship. Steady and reliable are adjectives that describe him. He was ably assisted by the dependable and ever-improving Stephen McGrath. Josh Kane completes the goal-keeping trinity; another man with an abundance of talent.

The fullback line was anchored by Jack L of the renowned Lambert clan. This guy is a serious operator irrespective of the code he's playing. Again commitment and resoluteness are apt descriptions. He was flanked by Fionn Maguire and Conor Hanrahan. Both of these lads are superb athletes and dedicated clubmen. Fionn is in his prime and Conor is not far off despite his youthful boyish looks. The fullback line has been supported by Scott Cullen who was unfortunate to suffer a couple of knocks during the season, by Karl Reddy who suffered a nasty facial injury in a league game that required surgery, by Keith Sweeney who appears to researching a travel blog, by Sam Lally (an indentured servant at Ryanair), by the promising Eoghan Gannon who suffered an ankle injury in the league campaign and by Dr. Josh Hayes who sometimes has more serious matters to attend to. All played their part.

The halfback line of Oisin Carolan, John Murphy and Eoin Behan was our version of the Maginot Line (look it up). This was a defensive and offensive powerhouse. Despite their youth they delivered experience, wisdom and real sense of commitment to the squad. They were assisted by Mr. Firefit, David Leach whose commitment was savage and by Tommy Burke who had a motoring accident after organising a carting day out for the lads. Tommy is now held together by used coat-hangers, some piano wire and a couple of nuts and bolts. He's our bionic man.

In the middle Neil Hester and Rob Cullen took the reins. Neil's commitment and game management has been a joy this season. Rob has brought his passionate raw talent from the Junior A's. During the season the midfield contained Conor Lowe, who departed on a free transfer to Madrid (to further his education allegedly); our ultra marathon runner Daragh Kilduff who suffered a few niggles along the way; and Mark Walsh who popped the shoulder early on and worked hard to get back playing.

The half forward line was fluid in terms of its composition. The central role was generally occupied by the daddy of the team Colly Dunne. He was flanked by any of the following: Enda Cashman, the left footed wizard; the impressive Dillon Ward, another who experienced niggling injuries; the tanned and ever-present Ruairi Kirwan; Mr. Intermediate Team Evan Flanagan; the mercurial and gazelle like Mal Codd; Harry Colclough from the senior panel; and Ciaran Archbold who is not gazelle-like but a real Boden warrior.

The full forward line contained some really lively individuals; the newcomer and rising star Luke Byrne, the rising star Mikey Dunne, and the star Barra McGarry. Hot on their heels is "dangerous" Emmet Doogan complete with two championship goals as substitute and an assist after being taken down for a penalty. Another in the forward line was big Eoghan Monahan who was coming into a bit of form only to see his season finish early after an ankle injury. The unfortunate John McGinn made it to the opening day of the season only to suffer the dreaded cruciate curse. He's on his way back!

In addition to the efforts of the players the management team of Donal Monahan, Walter Durkan, Daire Walsh, Mick Maher and Martin Murphy invested a lot of time to get this group playing an attractive brand of football and establishing a squad ready for the next level.

The group would like to thank Jack Nolan and Ciaran Maguire for their support, Anthony Rainbow and the senior management team for their assistance throughout the season, and the Junior A management team led by Tony Duffy with whom we enjoyed a lot of cooperation.

Within 10 minutes there were mutterings of "this the toughest training ever" "will it soon be over?" and "I won't survive an hour of this". It was actually something of a minor achievement that the boys could actually speak as Michael kept them going at 100% intensity for a full hour with a seemingly endless series of drills including heavy bag punching, sparring, skipping, conditioning exercises etc. In between, the only breaks (other than 30 sec water breaks) were taken up with non-stop sit ups and press ups. Michael had total control over the group where no boy dared to show any signs of weakness. The football coaches could only look on helplessly (ha!) as the boys were pushed to their limits and then well beyond. When it all seemed over they were put through a further gruelling set of core-crunching abdominal exercises. By the end the humidity levels in the gym reached saturation as the sweat drenched boys struggled to recover. No problem sleeping on Saturday night for any of these lads!

It is not expected that the boys will need to use their new-found boxing skills in the football final, but as a team bonding session this was second to none. Michael remarked that they were a great bunch of lads to work with and expressed surprise that they had all managed to complete the session without anyone collapsing from exhaustion. The smiles returned to all the young faces as they lined up for the obligatory group photo at the ringside, no doubt dreaming of...well, to be honest, who knows what they were dreaming? One thing is for certain though, they will never again complain of a tough training session from their coaches at Ballyboden. Well done boys and good luck in the final.

Patrons parking vehicles are asked to park in manner that is respectful to the residents in the area and to those using the cycle lanes, bus lanes and footpaths.


- It is illegal to park on a grass verge, cycle lane, bus lane, double yellow lines, footpath.





violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.


suggests or encourages illegal activity.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
