

Double Delight County Champions For U14 Hurlers





Saturday 30 th October 2021 was already a date noteworthy for the U14 Boy's hurling squads – Ballyboden was the only hurling club in Dublin to have two teams in two county finals from this age group. A fantastic achievement in itself! The boys reward was two away trips for the finals, but neither team would be daunted by the prospect.

First up was Team 2 as they travelled across to Balbriggan to play against O'Dwyers in an early afternoon throw-in for the Division 6 County Cup. The lads knew this was going to be a stern test as many of these boys had suffered a narrow loss to O'Dwyers in the football. The first half was a tense and tough battle – scores were in short supply. At the first water break both teams had only two scores each but crucially Boden had a goal and led by two points. Boden pushed on coming up to half-time, scoring a few vital goals to stretch their lead out to five. O'Dwyers came out in the third quarter and piled on the pressure as they sought to eat into the Boden lead. Boden boys dug deep to withstand the onslaught and again scored another crucial goal to keep O'Dwyers at bay. At the second water break Boden held onto their five point lead despite having six scores to O'Dwyer's seven. The final quarter saw Boden bang in another couple of goals to break O'Dwyers resolve and stretch out an unassailable lead of nine points at the final whistle. Cue scenes of great celebration and delight. The final score was Ballyboden St Endas 6-3, 2-6 O'Dwyers: nine scores to eight proving as always how vital goals are to winning matches.

Next up was Team 1 as they took on rivals Kilmacud Crokes in Silverpark for the **Division 1 County Cup.** Difficult conditions with a bright low wintery sun in the eyes and a swirling breeze at the throw-in. The opening quarter was very tight and scores were at a premium. Boden were unlucky not to score a goal as it cannoned off the crossbar but were very happy leading by four points to two at the water break. The second quarter was honours even with both teams going tit for tat exchanging points with Boden holding on to the two point lead going in at half time. Boden were very unlucky to have a goal disallowed for a debatable square ball just after half time. That seemed to galvanise Crokes into action as they responded by reeling off a few points that put them into a one point lead for the first time in the match. Boden in turn rose to the challenge scoring a wonderful team goal and managed to get to the final water break with the slenderest of one point leads. The final quarter was a helter-skelter of excitement. Boden thought they had sneaked it at the death as a massive 65 was pointed into a nasty wind only for Crokes to land their own big 65 to force the game into extra time. The scores stood at Ballyboden 1-10, 0-13 Kimacud Crokes at full time with two periods of 10 minutes of extra time to play. As the coaches took a moment to reflect, the boys gathered themselves into a huddle and encouraged each other to dig deep for one final big push, and one big push they delivered. The 20 minutes went by in the blink of an eye as the lads pushed themselves to the brink of exhaustion: a huge 20 minutes of hurling saw Boden rattle off 2-3 to only a 3 point reply from Crokes. The final score-line was Ballyboden St Endas 3-13, 0-16 Kilmacud Crokes. Level on scores but, once again, goals win games as Boden delivered a second county title in the space of two hours.

The boys from both teams gathered at 6 pm at the clubhouse to enjoy the occasion together with plenty of pizzas and soft drinks flowing. Many thanks to Mick and the staff for looking after the boys on this wonderful day. Very special thanks to all the parents, grand-parents, family members and club members who came out to support both teams on the finals day and indeed over the course of the season. We hope to see much more of you in the coming year as the boys hopefully get to enjoy their Feile year. We wish all the boys who are injured a very speedy recovery – they were fantastic supporters of their team-mates. Many thanks to all of the dedicated coaches who freely give of their time and energy to the boys. We wish

our Team 1 footballers the very best of luck in their Division 1 County Final this coming Saturday against Kilmacud Crokes – again away from home in Silverpark – throw in at 1.30 pm, your support will be very much appreciated.

U14A Battle To Overcome Spirited Naomh Barróg To Win Division 1 Camogie Shield Final



Our U14A Camogie girls travelled to Barrógs at Sunday lunchtime for the final competitive game of their season: a Shield Final against Naomh Barróg. The Barrógs Camogie team were an unknown quantity to our girls, not having come across them in competition before - the two clubs had recently faced off in a Division 1 Football Shield semifinal in Cherryfield though, and the competitive nature of that encounter meant the Boden girls should have been in no doubt about the dogged nature of the challenge they would face, especially with the Barrógs girls playing on their home pitch in front of their own crowd.

Unsurprisingly, this is exactly what transpired. From the off, the Barrógs girls pressed forward and scored a snap goal to race into an early lead. The Boden girls didn't panic though and steadied the ship to come to grips with the Barróg springboard in the middle of the park, and soon began to press forward to reel off scores of their own with a very strong second quarter, when a goal from Ellie Molloy and two further goals from Ella Hynes put Boden into a 3:01 to 1:03 lead at halftime.

Despite the 4-point lead, the Boden girls were in no doubt that the Barróg threat was very still much alive, and the third quarter proved it as Barrógs pushed forward to put three points on the board to Boden's one. This was 'all hands to the pumps' stuff now, and as the game went into the last waterbreak with a scoreline of 1:06 to 3:02 and a slender Boden lead of just 2 points, both teams knew that this game was very much in the balance.

Dogged defending was now very much the order of the day as the Boden halfback and fullback lines in front of keeper Sophie Dempsey were bolstered by the midfield and half forward lines and absorbed attack after attack from a dangerous and capable Barrógs team that could sense victory and dropped ball after ball into the Boden 13 metre line. In the end though, the only point of the last quarter was registered to Boden, and so it was Captain-forthe-Day Sarah Rusk who accepted the shield from referee Jason Buckley on behalf of Ballyboden St Endas with '3 Cheers' for a very gallant Naomh Barróg team. **Final Score:**Naomh Barróg 1:06 Ballyboden St Endas 3:03

Afterwards, team and supporters were invited into the Naomh Barróg club for tea, sandwiches, cakes, and crisps, a warm gesture of hospitality by the Naomh Barróg club that was very much appreciated by the Boden players and supporters who needed to decompress after such a close on-field battle.

Elusive Boyle the difference in Senior B Semi at Wintry O'Toole Park

Sunday afternoon drew a sizeable gathering of hardy skins for the semi-final of the Senior B Hurling Championship against the Emmett Carroll managed youthful Castleknock side. The raw facts of the game, Castleknock's early goals, the influence of Dublin football star Ciaran Kilkenny, or even the fact that Boden had to wait until the closing stages of the game for their only goal chance, clearly ignores the showing of influential Dublin under 20 forward Ian Boyle. As well as scoring more than a half a dozen points, he gave a near perfect performance over the four quarters in conditions that did little to enhance the reputation of the sport. A sticky sod barely dented the first touch and scoring eye of this rising star. Boden played second fiddle from the second minute after Boden led for the briefest of time following Jamie Desmond's first of five long-range points.

Boden were dependent on placed balls during the opening quarter with Desmond strikeperfect with three long-ragers. Mark Lambert was similarly accurate with his one opportunity, but it was Finnian McDonagh that got the Boden crowd in full voice with a sweet point. However, the good efforts were cancelled out by a sloppy goal conceded to Castleknock after a short back-pass, as well as the first of Boyle's quality points. Kilkenny chipped in with the first of his 1 02 over the hour.

Quarter two opened with a series of "scrums" into which Mattie Weldon dug deepest for the elusive sliotar. He got his reward with the opening point after bursting through a tight gathering in the middle of the field. Kilkenny followed up quickly with a flicked goal to open the lead to 2 04 to six points for Boden. Darragh Kenny reduced the lead with a pointed free and was quickly followed by a Weldon assisted smasher of a point from wing-man Conor Robinson. Desmond added from a free to bring the margin to the minimum, but Castleknock added three on the bounce with a brace from the increasingly influential Boyle. Kenny closed the half with a brace from frees to leave the score standing at 0 11 to 2 07.

Scoring slowed to a near standstill in the third quarter with Kenny contributing three and Boyle with a brace, but Castleknock increased their lead to three, 0 14 to 2 11. In the last fifteen Boden's Gavin Corrigan benefited from some hard work from Eoin Behan with a fine point, but Boyle replied quickly with yet another beauty. Kenny continued from the placed balls and kept Boden within reach, but Boyle replied immediately with another special to extend the lead to four. Corrigan chased into enemy territory only to be up-ended for Boden's only goal chance, a penalty. Kenny's shot was saved only for the referee immediately awarding Boden a second chance. This time Corrigan shot to the goalman's left only to see his shot batted away. Substitute Malachy Codd worked his way into the scoring area and used his footballing skills to hoof the ball over the line. Castleknock dug deep to finish the stronger with a closing brace to Boden's dropped in strike from Desmond that fell over for a point.

Patrons parking vehicles are asked to park in manner that is respectful to the residents in the area and to those using the cycle lanes, bus lanes and footpaths.


- It is illegal to park on a grass verge, cycle lane, bus lane, double yellow lines, footpath.





Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
