

# **Heartbreak for Minor A's in Camogie Championship Final**



The Minor Camogie Championship reached its conclusion on Sunday morning as Ballyboden took on Castleknock in the Division 1 decider. These 2 had played each other previously in the group stage where the Boden girls had come out on top with a last-minute goal. The final

took place out in Trinity Sports ground in Santry and was a ticketed event hosted by the county board. Considering that it was the last weekend before Christmas and it was an early start, there was a large attendance with supporters from both sides coming out to support these 2 talented outfits.

The game started off at a fierce pace with both teams fighting for every possession. The heavy pitch was taking its toll on the play with scores hard to come by. The Boden girls made the first breakthrough with a point from Aine followed up by a goal from Aine too. They had the upper hand in the early exchanges, and it was the 8th minute before Castleknock pointed from a free.

Boden had chances to extend the lead and Castleknock had their keeper to thank as she made a super save from Clodagh's fierce drive. Castleknock were starting to get more of the play and their Dublin senior star Aisling converted 2 points before Shauna responded with another point to keep the Boden narrow lead. Castleknock then converted another couple of points to draw level before Aines 2nd goal put the Boden girls ahead going into the break.

Coming out in the 2nd half, the Boden girls were determined to build on their lead. They pinned Castleknock back for 10 minutes but couldn't convert the pressure into scores. It was Castleknock who got the next score with a point from a free before Leonie restored the 2-point lead with a point from play going into the water break.

The tension was palpable going into the final quarter and Castleknock were beginning to exert more pressure. They brought the gap back to 1 which was followed by a free from Leonie and then brought it back to 1 again as the match went into injury time. Castleknock got one more break up the pitch and the defence that had been so resolute was finally breached when a ricochet ended up at the feet of the Castleknock player who netted. There was still some injury time remaining and Ella took another point to close the gap to 1 but they couldn't find the equaliser. The final whistle went and there was joy for Castleknock and heartbreak for Ballyboden who had led all the way.

When they reflect on the championship the Boden girls can be very proud of their efforts. After winning a tight first game they got stronger in every match and fought all the way in the final. We began the year with uncertainty, and we finish the year with uncertainty but in between we had some great moments.

Junior A's winning the championship after a 21-year gap was certainly the highlight for me, and by hell did they enjoy themselves. Earlier in the year the Hurling Committee agreed, with everyone's support, that this team would be the reference point for all 2020 minors. A strong management team was assembled, and it was a resounding success. Most likely some of these young players will be promoted to teams further up the ranks and I strongly believe this is the way forward for future minor teams where excellence and commitment is rewarded in a very positive manner. Thanks to Tim, Johnny, Mick and all the backroom team for believing in the project. Special mention to Dan and Susan who have been with this team for an exceptionally long period and have played a huge part in this success story.

Hot on the heels of the A's, was the success of our Junior C's and E's. Not many will recall but over 3 years back we struggled to field a C team with only 6/7 players turning up to training. Trojan work done by Junior C management has resulted in a 5th Junior team registering in 2021. The feedback from 2020 was that too many players didn't get enough game time and we were in danger of losing them. Yes, we struggled to field on occasion but always fulfilled the fixture. Without the efforts of all concerned up to 15 players wouldn't have got any game time. And to cap it all the C's had a hugely successful year getting to a county final and now move up to Junior B rank next year. Huge credit due to John, Ger, Philly, Duffer and Mick for sticking with the plan. The club and players owe a huge gratitude to you all.

And we finished the year in style winning an U21 Championship v Vincent's in their home ground. An excellent performance by players and management and topped off a very satisfying year. Thanks to Johnny Kenny and all his support team for giving us a great lift on a very cold winter's morning.

#### **Challenges 2022**

U17/U19: In 2021 we fielded across all 6 adult teams 165 players in 51 adult games. That is an incredible stat and would be unheard of in so many country clubs. In coming year, we will have a further 40/50 players coming into adult section. Normally we would only have 1 year coming out but due to new structures we have U18 and U19 year olds now potentially playing adult hurling. The new minor age group will be U17 and this we see no different to the present U18 format. What we don't know, yet, how effective the new U19 league and championship will be. A subgroup has already been formed to address these issues and to minimize the loss of any players.

Running the section, as you can appreciate, needs a lot of resources and we again managed to breakeven this year. To run any section effectively you need a team of volunteers and as Chairman I'm extremely fortunate to be surrounded by some great people.

# Important Notice: Firhouse Road /Ballycullen Car Parking



Patrons parking vehicles are asked to park in manner that is respectful to the residents in the area and to those using the cycle lanes, bus lanes and footpaths.

- It is illegal to park on a grass verge, cycle lane, bus lane, double yellow lines, footpath.
- It is also illegal to park opposite a continuous white line or too close to a junction.

Gardaí have informed the Club they will be carrying out patrols and any person found in breach of the Road Traffic Act or found breaching the offences outlined above will be dealt with by way of a fixed charge notice (FCN) commonly referred to as a fine. In some cases, the offences carry penalty points.

Gardaí ask that any patrons using a vehicle, to park in a manner that does not breach the Road Traffic Act.

Patrons living locally, if possible, might consider cycling or walking to the main clubhouse in order to alleviate parking issues

The defibrillator is positioned at the door of the gym on the outside wall of the courtyard.

suggests or encourages illegal activity.


engages in trolling, bullying, or abusive activity.

# **Concussion Management**



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion


injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
