## Camogie Update 30/08/21



#### Senior B's and C's get Camogie Championship under way

Championship got under way in mid-week for Senior B and Senior C Camogie teams. Senior B are competing in the 3rd tier of Dublin Senior Camogie, the Inter Division 1 after winning Inter 2 Championship in 2020. Senior C are competing in Junior Division 3A. Both teams had good Cup campaigns through the summer and went into their respective competitions with a good degree of confidence. Both teams had also recently beaten their opponents in the recent cup competitions although they knew that the teams they would face in Championship could differ greatly with players from all sides returning from holidays and county representation.

The Senior C team were in action first against Lucan on Tuesday in Cherryfield. With the grass a little long, the match was a bit scrappy at times without too much flow and with the ball being thrown in on numerous occasions after keenly contested rucks. Lucan edged ahead a few times with consistent free taking but the Boden girls battled hard to keep in touch with their own frees and then a few goals at opportune moments. As the match went into the last 5 minutes the scores were level. However it was the girls in green who converted the next score to edge ahead by a point and then despite valiant efforts from Boden, Lucan tagged on one more point to seal the victory. A disappointing start to the campaign but great efforts from all the squad and they will go again out at Oliver Plunkett's on Tuesday.

Senior B's also lined out in Cherryfield on Thursday evening against a Naomh Padraig team that they had defeated twice in the cup both in group and Semi-Final stages. The girls from Palmerstown were clearly out for revenge fighting hard for every ball. The Boden girls struggled to get into the same flowing rhythm as they had on Pairc Uí Mhurchú in the Semi Final match a couple of weeks before and Naomh Padraig held their own on the tighter pitch with the keepers long puck-outs landing in on the Boden full backs and putting pressure on the Boden goal. With the scoreboard never showing more than a couple of points between the sides, the tension and intensity rose through the match. The Boden girls upped their game after the break and took the lead when they scored a dramatic 2nd goal after a 3rd rebound after some great goalkeeping by Naomh Padraig. However Naomh Padraig were not giving up and after some good pressure they slotted the equaliser and had the last attack of the game but the Boden defence held firm. So a drawn game which was probably a fair result. Next up a trip to Russell Park on Thursday to face Naomh Brid Senior A team.





violent, sexually explicit, obscene, hateful, or defamatory.

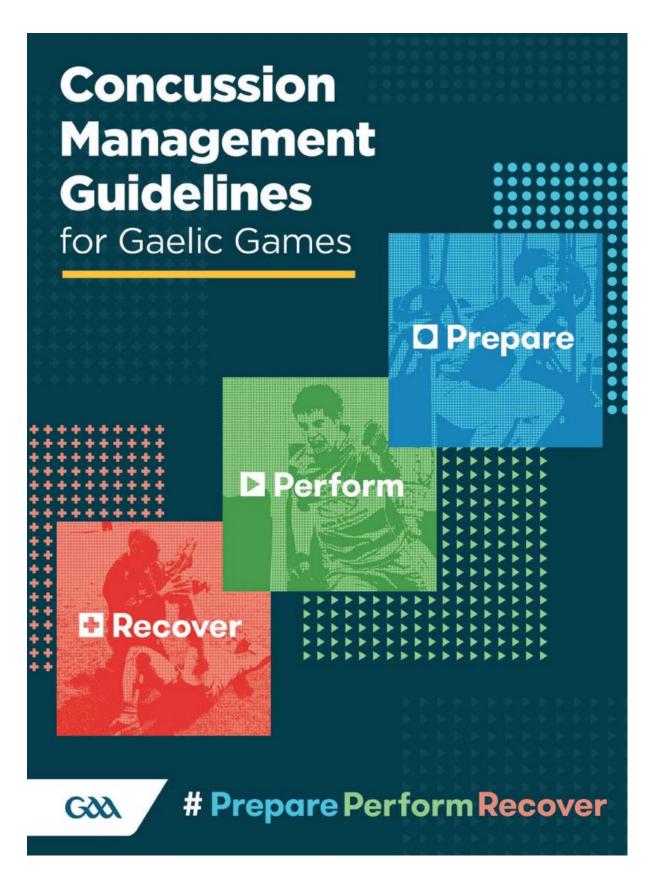
suggests or encourages illegal activity.

## **Concussion Management**



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

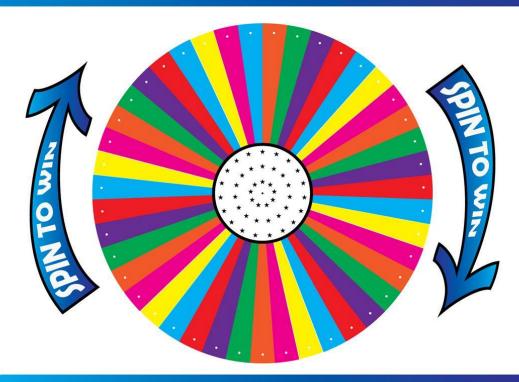
injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
