Long Fella reports from a Chilly PUM

"A must win game", "A sunny day", "A quality surface", "A January Hurling play-off"," Good quality hurling", Does this lot fit credibly into an opening paragraph? Probably not, but that is what Sunday morning brought to HQ for game 2 of a round robin series for Boden's Senior B hurlers to decide their status in the 2022 championship. Their opening game of the series had ended in a draw with Cuala, thereby leaving them with a total of three points and the same in positive score difference.

Without a doubt Boden benefited from their opening game Cuala experience in that they almost totally dominated the first thirty, leaving Clontarf with some serious analysis at the break. With Boden only registering four second half points, Clontarf showed some of their best play and will now feel that they have a real chance of toppling Cuala in next Sunday's tie. They even had the chance of a draw with the penultimate ball strike of the game. A free from about 25 metres was viciously struck by Mikey Devine only to see Boden's Jack Lambert deflect the ball for a relieving 65. The follow up ball ended in Boden possession and the final whistle.

Two of Boden's first fifteen stood out in effectiveness and no shortage of class. Finnian McDonagh finished on five points, some of which were arrowed over from wide angles and under some pressure. In defence centre-back Fergal Ryan used his athleticism and vision to open up space for team-mates as well as pointing from play and placed balls. Some excellent support play from Boden's Killian Kirwan released McDonagh for his opener, cancelling out a smasher from Devine. Point number three came from the speedy Davey Keogh. McDonagh again added to the tally, and was quickly followed by scores from Rhys, Conor Kennedy (a superb team effort), and the first from Darragh Kennedy. Score 7 to 2 and Water-break.

Panic may have seemed an easy option for Clontarf, especially when Kenny and McDonagh pointed early in the quarter, but Jack Higgins settled them down with a fine out-field strike. Boden's Mark Lambert added to his tally with a well-taken free for Boden, before Kenny was clean through, but with only his Brogue as a striking weapon. Not so fast called the man in the middle and the panic in the Battlers defence was reduced to relief. McDonagh provided some compensation and inspired Ryan (F) and Kenny (Kennedy assist) into action with points. Score 13 to 4 (game as good as over????). Not so according to Clontarf as they finished the half with a brace, the second from Brian Ford after some stern Clontarf defending as Boden went after a goal. Half-time 13 to 06.

The second half opened as Clontarf survived some good quality play from Boden's middle third and especially from workman Fionn Maguire, but the scores failed to register. After seven minutes the much needed score came from Clontarf's Jack Higgins and they quickly followed up with a second. Boden's only response came from Lambert, a free from about fifty. Score 14 to 0.9.

With the last of the water taken on board, Finnian opened the 4th Quarter scoring with yet another beauty. Clontarf's reply was swift, with firstly a pointed free and followed by a goal after some indecision in the Boden rear-guard. With time running out, it took some steady defending as well as leadership in the attacking area to get Boden over the finishing line. In defence Naoise Maguire and corner man Luke Mulligan-Lynch provided some steady play to keep the goal-count to one. Down the middle it took Ryan's steady hand to bag a late brace, both of them quality points.

Boden can move forward into the season in the knowledge that the team management of Ritchie Sweetnam, Brian Kelleher and Simon Daly have found some new talent coming through from the under-age squads. From what was seen this sunny morning, the future is bright for the squad.

Improving your Irish in the next 6 weeks

Many of you may have thought about improving your Irish but are not sure how to make a start. The first thing you need to do is schedule some time, ideally three to four 40-minute periods per week. For those with Leaving Cert Irish, even if that was many years ago, a great free learning resource is Vifax. With about 6 weeks to go to Lá le Pádraig, and still in lockdown, now might be a good time to give it a go. If you schedule three to four periods per week, after 6 weeks, a lot of the Irish that you thought you had lost will come back to you.

How does it work?

Vifax don Ghaeilge is a FREE resource for Irish language learners which is run by Maynooth University and it is available seven days a week. It consists of videos and

snippets as well as lessons based on Nuacht TG4 which are put up on Maynooth University's website every week.

It is available online both nationally and internationally and according to statistics gathered by Lárionad na Gaeilge there are a great number of people from the United States of America and the United Kingdom using the system. For the last six months an increase of 64% has occurred in the number of users due to the emphasis on learning online.

How to get started:

Ideally study with one other person.

Open the Website https://vifax.maynoothuniversity.ie/

Click on the link An Chartlann (The Archive)

Choose a topic.

Decide on a level Ard (Higher) Meán (Middle) or Bun (Lower)

Once you press on the level, you are brought to a PDF document that you can download. At the bottom of the document is the script from the accompanying video. You can listen to the video and read the script at the same time. The document has a series of questions based on the script that you can attempt. When you are finished the questions, you can check your answers in the document.

Keep a notebook and jot down any new phrases.

If you are lacking a bit of confidence, start at the Bunleibhéal

If you have a 'Good' or 'Very Good' standard of Irish, the Ardleibhéal or Meán leibheál will provide a challenge for you.

Tip of the week: Read the instructions and the script out loud. When you have listened to the video a few times and followed the script, try reading the script out loud a couple of times yourself.

No access is authorized to pitches/Sport Facilities during the closed season, or outside of the letting season.

Important Notice: Firhouse Road /Ballycullen Car Parking



Patrons parking vehicles are asked to park in manner that is respectful to the residents in the area and to those using the cycle lanes, bus lanes and footpaths.

- It is illegal to park on a grass verge, cycle lane, bus lane, double yellow lines, footpath.
- It is also illegal to park opposite a continuous white line or too close to a junction.

Gardaí have informed the Club they will be carrying out patrols and any person found in breach of the Road Traffic Act or found breaching the offences outlined above will be dealt

with by way of a fixed charge notice (FCN) commonly referred to as a fine. In some cases, the offences carry penalty points.

The defibrillator is located on the external wall of the Clubhouse, between the Tribe coffee station and the bar emergency exit double doors.

Sancta Maria

The defibrillator is positioned at the door of the gym on the outside wall of the courtyard.

Concussion Management



If in Doubt, Sit Them Out

Gaelic games can be physical sports, and, while collisions are not a primary element of our games, they can occasionally happen. There has been an increasing number of concussion

injuries over the past year, and it is important that team managers, mentors and first aid people can recognise the symptoms and know the correct actions to take in order to ensure the safety of the player. Player safety is the most important consideration in a concussion, or any injury situation. It is widely reported that an inter-county player collapsed in a dressing room a week after an initial concussion diagnosis.

SPARC lead physiotherapist, Eamon O'Reilly has kindly created the below protocol for dealing with concussion and shared the GAA Medical Scientific Welfare committee guidelines, and we ask all those involved with teams to familiarise themselves with the guidelines and with the 'If in Doubt, Site Them Out' tag line. In order to ensure player welfare and to collate club data on the occurrence of concussion injuries, SPARC will see any club member with a concussion or suspected concussion free of charge, and we strongly encourage club players to avail of this generous and important offer.
